CORRECTIVE ACTION REQUIREMENTS.

Pursuant to authorization obtained by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) under the Resource Recovery and Conservation Act [42 United States Code (U.S.C.) 6901, *et seq.*, commonly known as RCRA] and the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984 (HSWA), this permit is issued under the provisions of Section 403.722, Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Chapters 62-4, 62-160, 62-730, 62-737, 62-777 and 62-780, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). The above-named Permittee is hereby authorized to perform the work or operate the facility shown on the application dated June 28, 2006 and revised September 19, 2006 (hereafter referred to as "the Permit Application), and approved drawing(s), plans, and other documents attached hereto or on file with the Department and made a part hereof and specifically described as follows:

To operate a mercury containing lamp and device storage and recovery facility. The storage of mercury containing lamp and devices is limited to 244,800 lamps or 1,088 drums. Total storage of non-hazardous material located in outside in covered containers should be maximum volume of 22 tons of clean glass.

The Recovery Process involves operations or processes and equipment used to receive spent mercury containing lamps and devices for the purpose of crushing or dismantling and separating the lamps of devices in a manner as to produce separated individual recyclable components such as glass, scrap metal and mercury containing powder.

Operation of the facility will be in accordance with the permit renewal application dated June 29, 2001 and additional information dated July 31, 2001, permit renewal Application June 28, 2006 and revised application dated September 19, 2006.
