Dear Mr. Kincart:

Your letter to Mike Redig, dated May 27, 2008 (received June 16), has been referred to me for response. The letter included the following attachments: a topographic map showing the location of the ACT facility in relation to certain residences and schools; a signed form 8700-12FL, Notification of Regulated Waste Activity; a signed Hazardous Waste Transporter Status Form; a signed Transfer Facility Notification Form; a State of Florida Hazardous Waste Transporter Liability Endorsement; a Certificate of Liability Insurance; a Contingency Plan; and a Closure Plan.

The topographic map indicates that several residences are located within 1000 yards of the proposed transfer facility, and two schools are located within 1500 yards. Your letter requested a variance from the siting criteria set forth in section 403.7211, Florida Statutes (F.S.), which prohibits the construction or operation of a transfer facility within 1000 yards of a residence or 1500 yards of any school or other site where individuals are routinely confined or assembled.

As a preliminary matter, the Department cannot begin evaluation of the variance request until we receive the \$5000 processing fee required by rule 62-730.293(1)(o), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) This fee is non-refundable, and payment does not guarantee that the variance will be issued.

Furthermore, we have reviewed section 403.201, F.S., the statute that authorizes the Department to issue variances from other statutes in Chapter 403, F.S., and have concluded that the only variance available to ACT in the circumstances would be under section 403.201(1)(c), F.S., which allows a variance "to relieve or prevent hardship of a kind other than those provided for in paragraphs (a) and (b)." Such a variance and renewals thereof are limited to 24 months. Renewals of a two-year variance require a \$1000 processing fee. See rule 62-730.293(1)(t), F.A.C.

If ACT decides to continue its efforts to construct and operate a 10-day transfer facility at the proposed location, I suggest you directly address the hardship that needs to be relieved or prevented, and the existence (or non-existence) of other treatment, storage or disposal facilities and transfer facilities in the area that could be used in lieu of one that would not meet the siting criteria.
