Hello, it's me Miles Keller. I spoke with you earlier when I reported Perma-Fix of Orlando inc., for leaking F006 into the pond next door then trying to cover it up saying it was dye. Everyone that works downstairs knows its F006 and not dye. I have other friends that work there that can corroborate the story. I worked at Perma Fix for 2 and a half years. In this time I've seen many, many violations more or so with Safety violations but I know this is not what you handle. Attached are two photos, I had more photos but lost many in my move. I took these secretly about a year ago. The Second photo entitled rusted out roll off (which they have many of) was kept to the left of the changing trailer on the dirt ground. This Roll off is destined for Chambers facility for disposal and was used for our trash and debris. Since it was for our trash and debris I can't tell you what exactly leaked out of this box into the ground but in the photo you can see how the ground is freshly stained and wet and the surrounding area is dry. The first photo is of one of the eye wash stations that's never maintained or checked just to give you an idea how perma fix treats they're employees.

All this took place at the HAZ YARD on the corner of rocket blvd is they're Non Haz. Yard where at the beginning of the year they spilled a half a tanker of oil in the parking lot. Along time ago they used to clean off the Back Hoe scoop in the dirt. The area behind the lab pack area and bulking area where the dirt meets the concrete IS heavenly contaminated from when they stack drums if there's any material left in the drum they just dump it on the ground. To be more exact mostly Pesticides, flammable liquids, bases and acids. Many times drums have been punctured on the dock area and would spill 55 gallons of different liquids on the pavement. In the lab pack area they still have on the desk radioactive material they "accidentally received", they are not permitted for any radioactive waste yet it's been there for about 5 or 6 months.

When they are informed of DEP coming we clean everything up I guarantee

a surprise inspection would prove me to be right. They leave drums out over night outside and sometimes try to hide them under trailers. I know for a fact that's not a permitted storage area.
