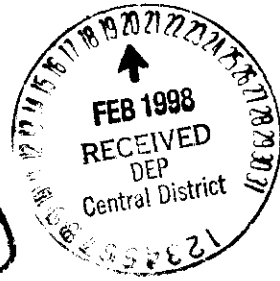

V. LIST OF EMERGENCY COORDINATORS

The following is the list of emergency coordinators who have been given the responsibility for coordinating all emergency response measures and will have the authority to commit the resources to carry out the Contingency Plan. Each coordinator will be thoroughly familiar with all aspects of the Contingency Plan, all operations and activities at the site, the location and characteristics of waste handled, the location of all records within the site, and the site layout.

At all times there will be at least one EC either on the facility's premises or on call with the responsibility for coordinating all emergency response measures.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF EMERGENCY COORDINATOR

When there is an imminent or actual emergency situation, the emergency coordinator must immediately:

1. Activate communication systems where applicable to notify site personnel;
2. Notify local emergency response agencies.

Whenever there is an emission, discharge, fire, or explosion, the emergency coordinator must immediately identify the character, exact source, amount and extent of emitted or discharged materials. He may do this observation or review of records and, if necessary, by chemical analysis.
