A hazardous waste and used oil compliance inspection was conducted at your facility on June 28, 2011. The inspection was conducted under the authority of Section 403.091, Florida Statutes (Fla. Stat.) and Chapter 403, Part IV, Fla. Stat. and is designed to determine the compliance status of your facility with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 260 – 268 and 279. **Introduction:**

On June 28, 2011, Danielle Bentzen and John White, Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), inspected Sanford Transflo Terminal (Transflo) for compliance with state and federal used oil and hazardous waste regulations. Sidney Smith accompanied inspectors through the facility.

Transflo registers as a Used Oil Transfer facility annually for emergency purposes only. According to Mr. Smith, Transflo has not transferred Used Oil for approximately three years. The facility is managed by Kinder Morgan Material Services, LLC and the property is owned by CSX. The facility has been at this location since 1991 and has two tracks. There are two employees plus contractors working on site.

**Process Description:**

Transflo receives commodities to be transported to other facilities. There are two tracks on site; one track is for dry commodities and the second is for hazardous materials. The yard can hold up to 33 cars at a time.

**Parts Shed**

Waste containers are stored in the shed. At the time of the inspection, there was one 15-gallon container of used oil, one 5-gallon bucket of waste antifreeze, and one 30-gallon container of used oil filters. All containers were properly labeled and stored.

**Records Review**

Records reviewed included manifests, contingency plan, land disposal restriction notifications, weekly inspection logs, and training. Safety Kleen is used as the hazardous waste transporter and final destination facility. All records appeared to be in compliance.
