Introduction:

Tropical shipping is an ocean cargo shipping company that services the United States, and Caribbean islands. This facility is located at the Port of Palm Beach, consists of five acres, employs 500 people, utilizes city water and sewer, and has been in operation at this location for more than 40 years. The facility originally notified the Department of its status as a Small Quantity Generator (SQG) of hazardous waste on January 17, 2003. The facility then notified as a non handler and used oil transporter on November 06, 2009. This facility is also a hazardous waste transporter, and a universal waste transporter. This facility has not been previously inspected by the Department, and therefore the inspection will be conducted as a compliance assistance site visit.

Process Description:

This facility has not generated or transported any wastes to date. Mr. Lux stated that the facility has registered as a transporter because an oil refinery in the Virgin Islands needed to ship its wastes. Mr. Lux stated that wastes were to be shipped to Puerto Rico, and/or Florida with an end disposal destination of Texas. To date, Puerto Rico is the only facility that has transported hazardous wastes. If wastes were to be received in Palm Beach, the wastes would only be on the loading docks for a short period of time, and would then be loaded onto another boat that was destined to Texas.

Record Review

The facility had a used oil transporter approval certificate issued by the Department available at the time of the request. Tropical Shipping has retained British Marine for their insurance provider for the vessels, and TT Club Mutual provides insurance for shore operations. A contingency plan was

on site at the time of inspection; however, the plan needed to include home addresses of emergency coordinators, and lacked an itemized list of emergency equipment detailing their capabilities. It is considered a best management practice and requirement for the U.S. Coast Guard to include these items on the contingency plan.
