The following site was disc	overed through historical records searches				

The site is located at 2700 Buckman Street in Duval County, Jacksonville, Florida. It is located at a latitude of N 30° 21' 19" and longitude of W 81° 37' 60". The site is the former location of Virginia-Carolina Chemical Company. City directories first reveal the presence of Virginia-Carolina Chemical Company in 1928. However, it appears there was a filing with the Division of Corporations in 1925. According to City directories the facility was in operation until 1965, appearing with the name Chemical Company Fertilizers. No records of operation were found after that time. Records of specific operations performed by Virginia-Carolina Chemical Company are unavailable. However, typical operational procedures followed by chemical fertilizer manufacturers during the early part of the twentieth century are well known. In general, superphosphate (CaH<sub>4</sub>(PO<sub>4</sub>)<sub>2</sub>), a principal ingredient of chemical fertilizer, was extracted from phosphate ore by treatment with sulfuric acid. The sulfuric acid was commonly produced via the lead chamber method, which involved roasting elemental sulfur or pyrite to yield sulfur dioxide. The sulfur dioxide was then mixed with air, steam and nitric oxide catalysts, producing sulfuric acid. Transport of bulk material (e.g., fuel, phosphate ore, elemental sulfur or pyrite) was most likely facilitated by railroad spurs, which ran on the southern portion of the property. The proximity of the facility to the St. Johns River, suggests that bulk shipments may have been transported by barge. The wastestream developed by the production of superphosphate comprised a slurry of gypsum in sulfuric/phosphoric acid. Other contaminants associated with this waste included: orthophosphate, fluoride, ammonium, lead, arsenic, copper, nickel, iron, cadmium, chromium, cobalt, antimony, vanadium, platinum, selenium, gold, polonium-210, radon-226 and gross

According to FDEP's population TIGER Database approximately 50,928 people live with four miles of the site. FDEP's Potable Well System Database, reports that there are a relatively large number of community wells, and one private well within four miles of the site. Florida Natural Areas Inventory reveals several manatee aggregation sites nearby. Several rare species including the Least Tern, Southern Weasel, Gopher Frog and Spotted Turtle are also located within four miles of the site.

Several persistent and toxic contaminants have been associated with the chemical fertilizer industry. No samples of on-site material are known to have been collected. Wells located within four miles of the site provide potable water to a large population. Considering that potential deposits of process-related contaminants could persist in subsurface soils and be released to shallow groundwater, this site is recommended for inclusion into CERCLIS, and for completion of a Preliminary Assessment.
