INTENT TO ISSUE

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection ("the Department") gives notice of its intent to issue a permit modification (copy enclosed) for the proposed project as detailed in the application specified above, for the reasons stated below.

On December 01, 2012 and revised or supplemented by submissions dated January 16, 2013, February 1, 2013, and February 7, 2013 the facility submitted an application to the Department for a permit modification (284932-HO-003, and 284932-SO-002) to the used oil and material processing facility located at 4103 Northwest 132nd Street, Opa Locka, Florida 33054. The Department has permitting jurisdiction under Section 403.704(16) and 403.769, Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Chapters 62-4, 62-160, 62-701, 62-710, 62-730, 62-740 and 62-762, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). The project is not exempt from permitting procedures. The Department has determined that an operating permit is required for the proposed work. The Department intends to issue this permit modification with the conditions included in the enclosed draft permit.

Where there is more than one daily newspaper of general circulation in the county, the newspaper used must be one with significant circulation in the area that may be affected by the permit. If you are uncertain that a newspaper meets these requirements, please contact the Office of General Counsel of the Department at (850) 245-2242. The applicant shall provide proof of publication to the Department of Environmental Protection at 2600 Blair Stone Road, Mail Station #4560, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400; Attention: Administrator, Hazardous Waste

Regulation Section, within seven (7) days of publication. Failure to publish the notice and provide proof of publication within the allotted time may result in the denial of the permit.

The Department will issue the permit with the attached conditions unless a timely petition for an administrative hearing is filed under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., before the deadline for filing a petition. The procedures for petitioning for a hearing are set forth below.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station #35 Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000.

Petitions by the permit applicant or any of the parties listed below must be filed within fourteen (14) days of receipt of this Intent. Petitions filed by other persons must be filed within fourteen (14) days of publication of the public notice or within fourteen (14) days of their receipt of this notice of intent, whichever occurs first. Under Section 120.60(3), F.S., however, any person who asked the Department for notice of agency action may file a petition within fourteen (14) days of receipt of such notice, regardless of the date of publication. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing. The failure of any person to file a petition within the appropriate time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it. Any subsequent intervention (in a proceeding initiated by another party) will be only at the discretion of the presiding officer upon the filing of a motion in compliance with Rule 28-106.205, F.A.C.

To operate a Used Oil and Material Processing Facility hereinafter referred to as the "Facility". The Used Oil and Material Processing Facility is located on an approximately 1.55-acre parcel of land owned by Raider Environmental Services, Inc. in Miami-Dade County at 4103 NW 132nd Street, FL, 33054. Diagrams of the site layout and tank storage area are included as Attachment A of this permit. Tank capacity and contents are shown in Attachment – B (Tank Table) of this permit.

The facility is authorized to process used oil, oily wastewater, petroleum contact water, oily solid waste, and used oil filters, Non-Hazardous Wastewater and used absorbents under this permit. The facility is also permitted to market Used Oil.

In accordance with Solid Waste permit No. 284932-SO-002, the Permittee is authorized to process solid waste including non-hazardous sludge in the tanks and equipment listed in Appendix B of the permit application.

The Facility consists of a total of eleven (11) tanks with a total capacity of 257,000 gallons. Five (5) 35,000 gallon tanks are dedicated to used oil (UO), one (1) 25,000 gallon tank is dedicated to Petroleum Contact Water (PCW) and five (5) tanks are dedicated to used oil processing with capacity varying from 3,000- to 27,000-gallons. These tanks are constructed with carbon steel and placed in a concrete secondary containment structure that is sealed and impervious to petroleum products. All tanks are shown on the drawing in Attachment A of this permit.

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
