

Re: Safety-Kleen Family of Companies

We are presently in the process of considering Safety-Kleen's compliance history as part of our review of permit and other approval actions now pending before us. In order to be sure that we have a complete picture, we are seeking information about the company and others related to it from all State-level jurisdictional agencies.

Enclosed please find a copy of a document, submitted to us by Safety-Kleen in 1992, that purports to show all relevant findings made against the company and its family in recent years, supplemented by EPA's non-compliant facilities list. We would greatly appreciate your reviewing these documents to determine whether there are any adverse-to-Safety-Kleen, et al. rulings in Florida by any Florida, local or Federal civil, criminal or (enforcement) administrative tribunal since January 1, 1989. If there are any, please send a copy of the entirety of each such ruling. We would also appreciate your providing the name and telephone number of a person who has been involved in such cases whom we may contact for further information.

Thus far, we are aware of only the company names and principals who might be named in such actions that appear on the attached list; if there are others of whom you are aware please let us know. [We are authorized to consider the compliance history of individuals and other companies with which they have been associated in evaluating applicants.]
