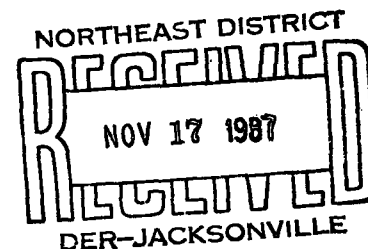

Dear Mr. Menendez:

We have completed our review of the Response to the First Notice of Deficiency (NOD) concerning the application for a temporary operating permit (TOP) from Quadrex HPS, Inc., located in Gainesville.

My only comment is on phase II of the compliance schedule. Quadrex will also be required to submit to our office for review any changes in their procedures or systems for handling, processing or disposal of waste containing radioisotopes. These changes must be submitted and approved before the changes are implemented.

Quadrex is aware of this and we do not foresee any problems.

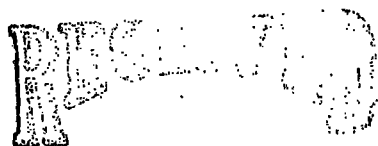
I am pleased to see that within a year Quadrex will have adequate berming and complete coverage of the drums stored outside, as described in Phases I and III.
