Re: Sampling, TCLP Analyses, and Disposal of Drums 5-H and 5-K and the Aboveground Storage Tank Located at Mobro Marine, Inc., Green Cove Springs, Florida M&A Project No. JE1-470, Control No. 1598

Dear Ms. Mears:

On June 12, 1992 samples were collected from drums 5-H and 5-K and the aboveground storage tank (AST) as required by OGC Consent Order No. 90-1662. Water samples collected from drums 5-H and 5-K were composited. There was no indication of sludge present in the drums. Water and sludge samples were collected from the AST.

Results of the analyses indicated that the water sample from drums 5-H and 5-K contained 0.021 parts per million (ppm) of methyl ethyl ketone (MEK). The water sample from the AST contained 0.01 ppm benzene and 0.55 ppm MEK. Sludge from the AST contained 0.01 ppm benzene and 0.46 ppm MEK. Based on the TCLP regulatory level of 0.5 mg/L for benzene and 200 mg/L for MEK, the liquids and sludge are not hazardous by characteristic. requirements.

On June 29, 1992 I informed Mr. Harry Baxley of Mobro Marine, Inc. that the samples passed the TCLP requirements. I also mailed him a copy of the laboratory results on this date.

On August 11, 1992 the contents of drums 5-H and 5-K and the water from the AST were pumped into a disposal truck by Envirotech Southeast of Jacksonville, Florida and was disposed of in accordance with all State and local regulations. The total volume of liquid disposed was approximately 5,500 gallons.
