

Dear Mr. Gartland:

The Department has reviewed the subject document and your report is acceptable. We will continue to watch an increasing trend in arsenic in well MW-780-2:



Your interim groundwater monitoring plan must continue until such time that it is changed by the Department. It is expected that these interim groundwater monitoring requirements will be incorporated into the Record of Decision (ROD) as part of the

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selected remedy for Operable Unit 3 (OU-3). Once the ROD is approved and the selected remedy implemented, this interim plan will no longer be in effect. Currently, the next groundwater monitoring must occur in December 2014 and the report must be submitted to the Department no later than the last day of February 2015 unless your permit is renewed before that time, and incorporates a different schedule.
