- 2. Training documentation Enclosed you will find a worksheet with dates of examination/training of the used oil collectors exams. (This will be our new format for documentation of training).
- 3. Batteries Batteries go for recycling to AARC Plant.

We have been using the halogen leak detectors for many years. Mostly when our drivers suspect of hazardous waste commingling or oil commingling with other liquids.

Please be advised documentation of halogens screening has been addressed since last year and our manifests have been changed accordingly. (see enclosed meetings of 2005 & 2006). We have been addressing the drivers to check-mark the box accordingly. In addition, we have created an incentive program for our drivers so that they follow this procedure.



- A one time testing fee, if applies \$20.00 needs to be charged to customers.
- Drivers need to make sure they carry various Dex Test Kits in their trucks at all times.
- Properly document each test.
- Train new drivers about Dex Testing Kits.

C. <u>DRUM LABELLING</u>

- Labelling drums is of great importance.
- Before the drums are unloaded at EMC, they need to be properly labeled with their contents.
- Violations are outrageous for failure to do so.

D. HAZARDOUS WASTE TRANSPORTATION AND STORAGE

- We do not <u>store</u> hazardous waste for more than 24 hours
- Drivers before they pick up hazardous waste needs to communicate with George that that waste will be immediately taken (within 24 hours) to the haz waste disposal facility.
- If you know that it will not be taken within 24 hours, haz waste needs to be rescheduled
- Violations are outrageous for failure to do so.

TOPICS TO DISCUSS AT MEETING

- Snifers: Snifers must be used on all pick ups. You need to make sure that you mark the manifests before you sign them and give a copy to our customers.
- Dexsil Testing: Dexsil testing must be done when there is suspicion of bad waste. If there is a suspicion of bad waste. Drivers need to know about the "comments" box regarding halogen testing.

One of the examples of visual suspicion of "bad waste" is when you arrive at the customer and you see containers labeled "haz waste" or your knowledge tells you that those said containers contained paint, mineral spirits, gasoline, etc.

3. <u>Manifests</u>: It is required that you mark your manifests "below 1000 ppm or above 1000 ppm" before you load the waste into the truck and give a copy to the customer.

If it is above 1000 ppm remember you do not pick it up as it indicates a hazardous waste.

- Residue Papers: Drivers need to have residue papers on the trucks at all times on the last pick up. This is very important.
- 5. **Responsibility**: You as the driver are responsible for what materials you pick up. Therefore, it is very important to assure yourselves of what it is you are transporting.

Dear Ms. Perez-Leon:

On August 16, 2006, the Department conducted a hazardous waste and used oil compliance evaluation inspection at your facility. The facility appears to be a Transporter of hazardous waste and used oil and a Transfer Facility for used oil. The inspection also found possible violations of Chapter 403, Florida Statues (F.S.) and Chapter 62-730 and 62-710 Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) regarding management of hazardous waste and used oil. Enclosed, please find the Transporter checklist used to determine compliance at your facility. Florida Statutes provide that facilities must comply with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 263 and 279 as adopted in Chapter 62-730 and 62-710, F.A.C.

The Department has reviewed the documents received on September 1, 2006, in response to our exit interview. It appears that your facility has returned to compliance. Please note that next time there are any violations pertaining to halogen screening there will be penalties associated.

This will conclude the Department's investigation into this matter, however, please be advised that the State will continue to conduct random and unannounced compliance evaluation inspections in the future.



The Department has received your letter dated August 29, 2005 in response to the July 19, 2005 Enforcement Meeting. The letter is not sufficient to document corrective actions. Please provide the following documentation within 7 days of receipt of this letter:

- 1. An example, such as a copy, of the new manifest to be used to document the halogen screening. If you do not have an example of the new manifest yet, please demonstrate how E.M.C. Oil Corp. is currently meeting the requirement to document the screening.
- 2. Tracking hazardous waste containers transported on your tracking board in red is acceptable to the Department provided E.M.C.Oil Corp. is confident this procedure will prevent hazardous waste from being stored for longer than allowed. However, please provide documentation, such as a photograph, of the board to document compliance.
- 3. The contingency plan you have provided appears to meet the requirements for your facility.

Additionally, the Department agrees to allow for a monthly payment plan for up to six months for the amount of \$10,000.00 plus \$500.00 for costs and expenses. If E.MC. In accordance with our meeting on Tuesday, July 19, the following is a list of the items we will be implementing within the next couple of months:

- 1. Used Oil Screening We will immediately begin stating in our current manifest that the generator's used oil was either less than 1000 PPM or above 1000 PPM. Our printing company has already been notified as to what to add to our new manifests as soon as we run out of our recently ordered manifests.
- 2. As stated in our Contingency Plan, before a hazardous waste pick up takes place, the generator must fill out a Hazardous Waste Profile detailing what type of hazardous waste is contained in the drum. Once approved by the disposal facility and given an approval number for that particular waste, it is then scheduled for E.M.C. to transport the drum from the generator to the disposal facility. Hazardous Waste pick ups are always accompanied by a Hazardous Waste Manifest signed by the generator and our driver specifying the approval number for that waste. E.M.C.'s hazardous waste pick ups are arranged Monday through Thursday. Effective immediately we will closely track our hazardous waste pick ups by putting them on our board (in red) and our Environmental Department has been trained to follow closely on these pick ups to assure proper transportation and disposal within 24 hour period.
- 3. Our Contingency Plan is being reviewed by your department and changes to the plan will be implemented within a 60 day period. As soon as the Plan is completed, we will mail you a copy for your review and/or suggestions.

In addition, after careful consideration of the violations imposed regarding the inspection on May 10, 2005 and review of our finances, \$3,000.00 is a fair offer and will not be a burden on our company's financial status and therefore should suffice the fines imposed.

I am requesting that this \$8,000.00 fine be acceptable in two monthly installments. On August 20, 2005 you will receive the first payment of \$4,000.00 and on September 20, 2005 final payment of \$4,000.00.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of possible violations of law for which you may be responsible, and to seek your cooperation in resolving the matter. A hazardous waste inspection was conducted at your facility on May 10, 2005. During the inspection, possible violations of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.), Chapter 62-730, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) regarding hazardous waste management were noted. The observations of the Department are in the attached inspection report. Florida Statutes provide that facilities must comply with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 260 through 268, and Part 279, as adopted in Chapter 62-730, F.A.C., and Chapter 62-710, F.A.C.

You are advised that any activity at your facility that may be contributing to violations of the above described statutes and rules should be ceased immediately. Operation of a facility in violation of State statutes or rules may result in liability for damages and restoration, and the judicial imposition of civil penalties up to \$50,000 per violation per day pursuant to Section 403.727, F.S.

You are requested to contact Mr. Jeff Curtis of this office at 561/681-6756 within 15 days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss the issues. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyone with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter.

If after further investigation, the Department determines that the violations occurred, this matter may be resolved through entry of a Consent Order which will include a compliance schedule and an appropriate penalty. In accordance with the Department's January 24, 2002 "Settlement Guidelines for Civil and Administrative Penalties" and the RCRA Civil Penalty Policy of June

2003, the penalty which would be proposed in this case is \$42,475.00 plus \$500.00 for administrative costs and expenses.

Please be advised that this Warning Letter is part of an agency investigation preliminary to agency action in accordance with Section 120.57(5), F.S. The attached civil penalty worksheets are formulated and tendered only in the context of settlement negotiations in order to attempt to reach cooperative settlement. We look forward to your cooperation in completing the investigation and resolution of this matter.

BACKGROUND

On May 10, 2005, a compliance evaluation inspection was conducted at E.M.C. Oil Corporation, (EMC), 8470 NW 68th St., Miami, Florida. Mr. George Vicente, Manager, hosted the site inspection. Mr. George Vicente and Ms. Maria Leon, President; hosted the record review. Department personnel participating in the inspection were Mr. Jeff Curtis, and Mr. Stephen Brown of the Hazardous Waste Compliance/Enforcement Section.

EMC is a registered transporter of used oil, used oil filters, oily wastewater, absorbent material and hazardous waste. EMC has been operating at this location for approximately ten years, and has approximately 12 employees. The facility, where EMC is located, is owned by MEL Property Inc., 8470 NW 68 St., Miami, Florida, and appears to be connected to the city sewer system.

SITE INSPECTION

The property on which EMC is located has one building. The building is divided into offices with an attached garage, which is used for maintenance and small repairs. Located behind the main building is a work yard where the used oil, used oil filters, soiled rags are stored. The used oil is stored in a 8000 gallon storage tank; used oil filters, and soiled rags are stored in 55 gallon drums. Mr. George Vicente greeted the inspectors and escorted them through the facility. Upon entering the work yard, inspectors noted that there were 7 drums sitting next to an EMC truck that appeared to have recently been unloaded. One of these drums had a used oil filter label on it while the other 6 were unlabeled. Mr. Vicente stated that the labels had come off and that personnel were in the process of putting new labels on the drums. Inspectors inquired about EMC's procedure related to screening pick ups for halogens. Mr. Vicente stated that all trucks carry a sniffer, and a dexsil testing kit in them. He then proceeded to a truck and produced a sniffer along with a dexsil kit from the inside of this truck. All other drums in the yard were correctly labeled and covered. The 8000 gallon used oil tank was correctly labeled as "used oil", and there were a 3 more large storage tanks that were labeled "empty". The storage tank area is completely surrounded with secondary containment. Mr. Vicente told inspectors that used oil is taken to Rinker and various other asphalt plants. Used oil filters are completely drained and taken to U.S. Foundry.

RECORD REVIEW

The following records were requested for review: hazardous waste transport manifests, used oil transport manifests, and used oil filter transport manifests. Although primarily a used oil transporter, Mr. Vicente informed inspectors that EMC transports hazardous waste for some of their customers, and that the hazardous waste shipments are taken directly to Perma-Fix. While reviewing used oil manifests inspectors noted the lack of an area on the manifest for drivers to indicate that a halogen screening had taken place for that load, otherwise all used oil and used oil filter manifests reviewed-were in order. While reviewing hazardous-waste transport-manifests inspectors noted that on 3 manifests there was a significant lapse in time between the pick up from the generator and the delivery to Perma-Fix. These were: manifest #05-010-pick up 2/17/05, deliver to Perma-Fix 3/4/05, manifest #04-075-pick up 10/14/04, deliver to Perma-Fix 11/3/04, manifest #04-043-pick up 10/1/04, deliver to Perma-Fix 10/11/04. Mr. Vicente stated that it was

possible that the driver was late and was not able to make the delivery to Perma-Fix. Inspectors asked where the hazardous waste was stored in these instances and Mr. Vicente stated that it was probably stored on the truck.

DEPARTMENT FINDINGS

EMC notified as a registered used oil transporter, and a hazardous waste transporter. However, during the normal course of business EMC held hazardous waste at its' facility beyond the allowable 24 hour period on three separate occasions. On two of these occasions hazardous waste was held in excess of the 10 day period allowable by a transfer facility. Therefore, EMC is subject to full regulation as a hazardous waste storage facility set forth under 40 CFR 264.

An exit interview was conducted during the inspection and the following areas of concern and potential violations were discussed:

- 1) Containers of used oil filters should be labeled with the words "used oil filters" at all times.
- 2) Used oil screening should be documented on acceptance records.
- 3) Hazardous waste should not be stored in trucks, or on-site for more than 24 hours according to the regulations pertaining to a hazardous waste transporter.

EMC responded to the exit interview on May 16, 2005 with a letter from Maria E. Perez Leon. It stated that containers of used oil filters are labeled with "Used Oil Filters" label as they are picked up, or are labeled by EMC personnel as soon as they arrive at the facility. Also, that their drivers carry halogen detectors, and a Dexsil testing kit in their trucks at all times. Regarding hazardous waste, the letter states that EMC will schedule hazardous waste shipments to be taken to the disposal facility within 24 hours after it is picked up.

Used oil and hazardous waste management rules may have been violated, as noted below ("Summary of Potential Violations"). The Department expects the potential violations to be corrected in an expeditious and safe manner. The Department's Enforcement Section is willing to provide assistance within the Department's' capabilities, limitations, time constraints, and workload. In addition, if not already done, the Department suggests that a copy of the hazardous waste regulations (40 CFR 260-268 and 279) be obtained from local public, college, or law libraries or EPA Region IV or US Government Printing Office. Please be advised that the Department does not have copies of 40 CFR 260-268 and 279 to hand out.



She confirmed that EMC would have Precision Laboratory perform the determination of any potential hazardous material (including metals) before disposing of it in any manner. She also stated that EMC does not clean out their tank bottom sludge on their trucks, therefore the only sludge/grit media that would need to be analyzed is that of the used oil filter process.





During our 3/23/00 inspection it was noted that EMC Oil, Inc. (Environmental Management Company) currently utilizes a 8,000 gallon AGT for bulking of used oil in operation of their used oil transfer facility (as referenced in 40 CFR 279, Subpart E). It appears that the only form of secondary containment for this tank is a simple speed bump. In discussing this situation with Steve Brown, this tank may be subject to Rule 62-761.500(3)(c)(3)(d), F.A.C., for secondary containment standards. Under the current used oil rules (40 CFR 279 and Ch. 62-710, F.A.C.) the secondary containment standards for this tank are not as stringent. Would it be possible for the Tanks Program or Miami-Dade County DERM evaluate the applicability of secondary containment standards for this tank?



Persons who are not parties to this Consent Order but whose substantial interests are affected by this Consent Order have a right, pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes, to petition for an administrative hearing on it. The Petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) at the Department's Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS-35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, within 21 days of receipt of this notice. A copy of the Petition must also be mailed at the time of filing to the District Office named above at the address indicated. Failure to file a petition within the 21 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information:

(a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner; the Department's Consent Order identification number and the county in which the subject matter or activity is located; (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Consent Order; (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Consent Order; (d) A statement of the material facts disputed by petitioner, if any; (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Consent Order; (f) A statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Consent Order; (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Consent Order.

SITE INSPECTION

On April 16, 1997, a hazardous waste/used oil compliance inspection was conducted at E.M.C. Oil Corporation (EMC), 8470 NW 68th Street, Miami, Florida. The inspection was part of the Department's 1997 inspection schedule. EMC has been in business at this location since 1994 and has 11 employees. EMC is a transporter and transfer facility for used oil, used oil filters, and waste oily water. EMC is connected to a publicly owned treatment works (POTW). The inspection and records review were hosted by Ms. Maria E. Perez-Leon (Owner). Department personnel participating in the inspection included Mr. James Bussey and Ms. Tiffany Holmes.

EMC has a fleet of five tanker trucks, a vacuum truck, and two box truck which are used to pick up drummed waste. Two of the six tanker trucks are single compartment tankers used to haul used oil. One of the tanker trucks uses is a 8,000 gallon compartment heil-trailer. One truck uses is a vacuum for pumping out sumps and soakage pits. The other three tankers are compartmentalized in the following manner: one double compartment 3,300 gallon capacity tanker, one double compartment 2,500 gallon capacity tanker, and a double compartment 2,600 gallon capacity tanker. The trucks leave the facility early in the morning on their "milk runs" to pick up vehicular waste. The trucks return in the late afternoon to unload. Used oil is sometimes mixed with transmission fluid inside the tankers. Inspectors observed a 5000-gallon storage tank that is used for the storage of waste water and possibly used oil, per Ms. Perez-Leon.

Used oil is taken to several location in Southern Florida. The main facilities utilized by EMC are Cliff Berry, Inc., Perma-Fix Environmental (formerly Integrated Resource Recovery), H.R. Paving, International Petroleum, Inc., U.S. Foundry, Chemical Conservation, Laidlaw Environmental, and Rinker Materials for recycling. Before a load is dropped at a facility the tank is tested for water and halogen levels.

When trucks return at the end of the day with "waste water", it is stored in a 5000 gallon tractor trailer tanks. When all of the "water waste" has been consolidated into one tanker compartment, it is transported to a selected facility for recycling.

EMC provides its customers with DOT approved 55-gallon drums for accumulation and storage of used oil filters. Drummed used oil filters are returned to EMC for crushing and draining. At the end of the crushing and draining process is a 55-gallon drum collecting excess debris and gas filters. The used oil is drained from the 55-gallon drum and is sent for recycling with the rest of the used oil. Sludge and debris is removed from the 55-gallon drum and placed into the dumpster as trash. Inspectors requested a hazardous waste determination before further discharge to the dumpster.

Inspectors observed 35 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters with no labels. Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed 32 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters not being protected from the weather and being stored on a pallet over non-impermeable surface. Inspectors advised EMC to place these crushed used oil filters over a impervious surface.

Inspectors observed stained soils next to a 250-gallon tank and requested a preliminary contamination assessment plan be completed and sent to the Department for review. Drained, crushed oil filters are sent to U.S. Foundry and Smelting (USFS) in Medley, Florida.

EMC brokers the disposal of petroleum contaminated soil. Pre-burn analyses are run on the individual drums before they leave the petroleum contaminated site. The pre-burn analyses are performed by Envirodyne. The contaminated soils that fail the pre-burn analyses, that test as hazardous waste, are transported for disposal by an approved hazardous waste transporter. The drummed contaminated soils that pass the pre-burn analyses are transported to EMC or transported to an approved burn facility.

EMC excepts only non-hazardous waste at their facility.

Inspectors observed a 250-gallon drum of used oil and 15 55-gallon drums of used oil not labeled with the words "Used Oil." Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed a 55-gallon drum labeled with the words "Absorbent Material." Inspectors requested EMC to open the drums, rags were observed. EMC was requested to produce a analytical for the material and insure the drum is properly labeled.

Inspectors observed an open 250-gallon tank (about 1/3 full) being utilized to clean vehicle parts. Per Ms. Perez-Leon, the contents are mainly used gasoline, jet fuel, and diesel to clean parts, once the fuel is no longer good its added to the used oil tank for disposal. Inspectors requested a determination of the tank contents and the results be sent to the Department for review.

Inspectors observed a 5000-gallon unlabeled tank. Ms. Perez-Leon was not sure of the content of the tank. Mr. Perez-Leon said Mr. George L. Vincent will contact the Department and explain what the contents of the tank.

RECORD REVIEW

EMC provided copies of used oil manifests, training records, EMC safety meetings, and non-hazardous waste manifest for the 55-gallon drum of rags being stored at EMC. Enclosed is a change of status form for EMC's

facility at 6201 S.W. 35th Street, Miami, Florida. This form should be filed out and submitted to the Department to close out the EPA identification number.

DEPARTMENT FINDINGS

EMC notified as a non-handler of hazardous waste and was assigned the EPA ID #FLR000000166 for their used oil operation. EMC appears to generate less than 100 kilograms per month of hazardous waste and would be classified as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste. In order for EMC to be excluded from full regulation under 40 CFR 262, EMC must comply with the provisions in 40 CFR 261.5. EMC must ensure proper disposal of all hazardous wastes that are generated to be in compliance with 40 CFR 261.5.

An exit interview was conducted with Ms. Perez-Leon. The following potential violation was noted and the following items under "comments" were requested to be sent to the Department.

1. Provide to the Department a hazardous waste determination on the 55-gallon drum of non-hazardous contaminated rags generated by Keys Fishering, Marathon, Florida, also provide a hazardous waste determination from the collection can at the end of the oil filter crushing process system.

Additional requests were made under comments:

- 1) Label all 55-gallon crushed used oil filter drums with the words "Used Oil Filter."
- 2) Store used oil/filters on a impervious surface.
- 3) Label a 250-gallon tank and all 55-gallon drums of used oil with the words "Used Oil."
- 4) Beside the 500-gallon tank inspectors observed stained soils. Inspectors requested a PCAP to be completed of the soil and send the results to the Department within 30 days of this inspection.
- 5) Make determination of parts washer and send the results to the Department within 10 days of completion of the analytical.
- 6) Relabel non-hazardous waste drum of used rags (Labeled Absorbent Material) and send the picture to the Department within 15 days of this inspection report.
- 7) As noted above, the 55-gallon drum of waste material from the oil filtering crushing system needs determination to identify if it is hazardous waste (next to filter crushing system).

Ms. Perez-Leon made a copy of the Exit Interview Summary for her records.

On June 9, 1997, EMC provided a list of vehicles utilized at EMC. On June 16, 1997, EMC provided soil analysis of the stained soils next to

the 500-gallon tank. The analysis requested by the Department was for Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedures (TCLP) RCRA metals. EMC provided results indicating Arsenic 1.0 mg/Kg, Cadmium 8.0 mg/Kg, Copper 10.4 mg/Kg, Lead 8.9 mg/Kg, Nickel 2.24 mg/Kg, and Zinc 38.5 mg/Kg.

Hazardous waste management rules may have been violated, as noted below ("Summary of Potential Violations"). The Department expects the violations to be corrected in an expeditious and safe manner. The Department's Enforcement Section (phone 561/681-6600) is willing to provide assistance, within the Department's capabilities, limitations, time constraints and workload. Please be advised that the Department does not have copies of 40 CFR 260-268 to hand out.





The purpose of this letter is to complete the resolution of the matter previously identified by the Department in the Warning Letter dated July 23, 1997, a copy of which is attached. The corrective actions required to bring your facility into compliance have been performed. In order to resolve the matters identified in the attached Warning Letter, you are assessed civil penalties in the amount of \$4,000.00, along with \$500.00 to reimburse the Department costs, for a total of \$4,500.00. Both payments must be payable to the Department of Environmental Protection by cashier's check or money order and shall include the OGC File Number. The civil penalty payment should include the notation "Ecosystem Management and Restoration Trust Fund", and the payment reimbursing DEP for costs should include the notation "Water Quality Assurance Trust Fund." Both payments shall be sent to the Department of Environmental Protection, Southeast District Office, P.O. Box 15425, West Palm Beach, Florida 33416. The payment shall be sent within 20 days of your signing this letter.

Your signing this letter constitutes your acceptance of the Department's offer to resolve this matter on these terms. The Petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) at the Department's Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS-35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, within 21 days of receipt of this notice. A copy of the Petition must also be mailed at the time of filing to the District Office named above at the address indicated. Failure to file a petition within the 21 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information:

(a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner; the Department's Consent Order identification number and the county in which the subject matter or activity is located; (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Consent Order; (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Consent Order; (d) A statement of the material facts disputed by petitioner, if any; (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Consent Order; (f) A statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Consent Order; (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Consent Order.

During this inspection, possible violations of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Chapter 62-730, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) regarding hazardous waste management were noted. The observations of the Department are in the attached inspection report. Florida Statutes provide that facilities must comply with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 260 through 268, as adopted in Chapter 62-730, F.A.C.

You are advised that any activity at your facility that may be contributing to violations of the above described statutes and rules should be ceased immediately. Operation of a facility in violation of State statutes or rules may result in liability for damages and restoration, and the judicial imposition of civil penalties up to \$50,000 per violation per day pursuant to Section 403.727, F.S.

You are requested to contact Mr. James H. Bussey of this office at 561/681-6718 within 15 days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss the issues. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyone with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter.

Inspectors observed 35 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters with no labels. Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed 32 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters not being protected from the weather and being stored on a pallet over non-impermeable surface. Inspectors advised EMC to place these crushed used oil filters over a impervious surface.

Inspectors observed stained soils next to a 250-gallon tank and requested a preliminary contamination assessment plan be completed and sent to the Department for review. Drained, crushed oil filters are sent to U.S. Foundry and Smelting (USFS) in Medley, Florida.

EMC brokers the disposal of petroleum contaminated soil. Pre-burn analyses are run on the individual drums before they leave the petroleum contaminated site. The pre-burn analyses are performed by Envirodyne. The contaminated soils that fail the pre-burn analyses, that test as hazardous waste, are transported for disposal by an approved hazardous waste transporter. The drummed contaminated soils that pass the pre-burn analyses are transported to EMC or transported to an approved burn facility.

EMC excepts only non-hazardous waste at their facility.

Inspectors observed a 250-gallon drum of used oil and 15 55-gallon drums of used oil not labeled with the words "Used Oil." Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed a 55-gallon drum labeled with the words "Absorbent Material." Inspectors requested EMC to open the drums, rags were observed. EMC was requested to produce a analytical for the material and insure the drum is properly labeled.

Inspectors observed an open 250-gallon tank (about 1/3 full) being utilized to clean vehicle parts. Per Ms. Perez-Leon, the contents are mainly used gasoline, jet fuel, and diesel to clean parts, once the fuel is no longer good its added to the used oil tank for disposal. Inspectors requested a determination of the tank contents and the results be sent to the Department for review.

Inspectors observed a 5000-gallon unlabeled tank. Ms. Perez-Leon was not sure of the content of the tank. Mr. Perez-Leon said Mr. George L. Vincent will contact the Department and explain what the contents of the tank.

RECORD REVIEW

EMC provided copies of used oil manifests, training records, EMC safety meetings, and non-hazardous waste manifest for the 55-gallon drum of rags being stored at EMC. Enclosed is a change of status form for EMC's

facility at 6201 S.W. 35th Street, Miami, Florida. This form should be filed out and submitted to the Department to close out the EPA identification number.

DEPARTMENT FINDINGS

EMC notified as a non-handler of hazardous waste and was assigned the EPA ID #FLR000000166 for their used oil operation. EMC appears to generate less than 100 kilograms per month of hazardous waste and would be classified as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste. In order for EMC to be excluded from full regulation under 40 CFR 262, EMC must comply with the provisions in 40 CFR 261.5. EMC must ensure proper disposal of all hazardous wastes that are generated to be in compliance with 40 CFR 261.5.

An exit interview was conducted with Ms. Perez-Leon. The following potential violation was noted and the following items under "comments" were requested to be sent to the Department.

1. Provide to the Department a hazardous waste determination on the 55-gallon drum of non-hazardous contaminated rags generated by Keys Fishering, Marathon, Florida, also provide a hazardous waste determination from the collection can at the end of the oil filter crushing process system.

Additional requests were made under comments:

- 1) Label all 55-gallon crushed used oil filter drums with the words "Used Oil Filter."
- 2) Store used oil/filters on a impervious surface.
- 3) Label a 250-gallon tank and all 55-gallon drums of used oil with the words "Used Oil."
- 4) Beside the 500-gallon tank inspectors observed stained soils. Inspectors requested a PCAP to be completed of the soil and send the results to the Department within 30 days of this inspection.

5) Make determination of parts washer and send the results to the Department within 10 days of completion of the analytical.

- 6) Relabel non-hazardous waste drum of used rags (Labeled Absorbent Material) and send the picture to the Department within 15 days of this inspection report.
- 7) As noted above, the 55-gallon drum of waste material from the oil filtering crushing system needs determination to identify if it is hazardous waste (next to filter crushing system).

Ms. Perez-Leon made a copy of the Exit Interview Summary for her records.

On June 9, 1997, EMC provided a list of vehicles utilized at EMC. On June 16, 1997, EMC provided soil analysis of the stained soils next to

the 500-gallon tank. The analysis requested by the Department was for Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedures (TCLP) RCRA metals. EMC provided results indicating Arsenic 1.0 mg/Kg, Cadmium 8.0 mg/Kg, Copper 10.4 mg/Kg, Lead 8.9 mg/Kg, Nickel 2.24 mg/Kg, and Zinc 38.5 mg/Kg.

This correspondence has been prepared in response to the April 16, 1997, hazardous waste compliance inspection conducted by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) at the above referenced facility. A FDEP correspondence, dated July 23, 1997, was issued to E.M.C. Oil Corporation, which summarized the results of the inspection, identified potential compliance violations, and itemized required corrective actions to be taken.

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

Item 1 - Hazardous Waste Determination

Evans Environmental & Geosciences (EE&G) will collect a liquid sample from the 250 gallon "solvent" tank, and a sludge sample from the 55-gallon drum utilized to collect excess debris from the oil filter crushing/draining process. These samples will be transported to Precision Environmental Laboratory and analyzed for Volatiles (total - liquid sample; TCLP - sludge sample), Semi-Volatiles (total - liquid sample; TCLP - sludge sample), and RCRA Metals (total - liquid sample: TCLP - sludge sample).

Item 2 - Used Oil Labeling

It is the contention of E.M.C. Oil Corporation that FDEP representatives James Bussey and Tiffany Holmes were present when Maria Perez (E.M.C. Oil Corporation) labeled the 55-gallon drums as either "Waste/Used Oil" or "Used Oil Filters". However, E.M.C. Oil Corporation will provide copies of several picture documenting the continued practice of proper drum labeling. E.M.C. Oil Corporation also properly labeled the 250 gallon used oil tank.

Item 3 - Secondary Containment

EE&G will be retained to inspect the facility and prepare engineering design plans for the secondary containment of the used oil tank and 55-gallon drum storage area (if warranted). E.M.C. Oil Corporation will install the proposed secondary containment system in accordance with environmental regulations, upon approval by the Dade County Department of Building and Zoning. Please note that a concrete berm has been installed within the opening of the building.

Item 4 - Storage of Used Oil Filters

The FDEP alleged that E.M.C. Oil Corporation failed to protect 55-gallon drums containing crushed used oil filters from weather, and failed to store the drums on an oil-impermeable surface. E.M.C. Oil Corporation is in the process of re-evaluating the drum storage procedures, and, during the design of the secondary containment, will be establishing impermeable surfaced, weather-protected areas on which to store these drums.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

- During the initial inspection, and on the FDEP's Hazardous Waste Inspection Exit
 Interview, no mention was made concerning the "Keys Fishering" drums.. However,
 the FDEP correspondence alleged that E.M.C. Oil Corporation stored drums of
 contaminated rags generated by Keys Fishering of Marathon, Florida. The drums
 actually contained asphalt material and were disposed of properly.
- E.M.C. Oil Corporation did collect one 55-gallon drum of oily rags from Mestre Equipment. In accordance with the FDEP directive, E.M.C. Oil Corporation labeled the drum as "non-regulated oily rags" (documented with pictures). The contents were determined by analysis to be non-hazardous, and properly disposed of at Rinker Materials facility. All information is in the E.M.C. Oil Corporation files.
- E.M.C. Oil Corporation labeled 5,000 gallon tank as "Empty", and documented with photograph.
- E.M.C. Oil Corporation previously addressed the issue of stained soils observed
 near a 500 gallon tank. Soils were excavated, and the laboratory analyses of soil
 samples were submitted to the FDEP. At this time, E.M.C. Oil Corporation is
 awaiting the FDEP closure letter regarding the PCAP requirement.

TIME FRAME FOR ADDRESSING COMPLIANCE ISSUES

Pursuant to your conversation with E.M.C. Oil Corporation, a telephone conference will be held between representatives of E.M.C. Oil Corporation, EE&G, and the FDEP, at 9:30 a.m., Thursday, August 14, 1997. It is the desire of E.M.C. Oil Corporation to reasonably comply with all State and County regulations, and the objective of this teleconference will be to discuss the items summarized in this correspondence.

Following the teleconference, EE&G will schedule the sampling activities and conduct a site inspection. It is estimated that analytical results will be available within 10 working days following the sampling event. A final report containing the secondary containment engineering design plans will be ready within 15 to 20 working days following authorization to proceed.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of possible violations of live for which you may be responsible, and to seek your doop ration in resolving the matter. A hazardous waste compliance inspection was conducted at your facility on April 16, 1997. During this inspection, possible violations of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Chapter 62-730, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) regarding hazardous waste management were noted. The observations of the Department are in the attached inspection report. Florida Statutes provide that facilities must comply with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 260 through 268, as adopted in Chapter 62-730, F.A.C.

You are advised that any activity at your facility that may be contributing to violations of the above described statutes and rules should be ceased immediately. Operation of a facility in violation of State statutes or rules may result in liability for damages and restoration, and the judicial imposition of civil penalties up to \$50,000 per violation per day pursuant to Section 403.727, F.S.

You are requested to contact Mr. James H. Bussey of this office at 561/681-6718 within 15 days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss the issues. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyons with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter.

If after further investigation, the Department determines that the violations occurred, this matter may be resolved through entry of a Consett Order which will include a compliance schedule and an

appropriate penalty. In accordance with the RCRA Civil Penalty Policy of 1990, the penalty which would be proposed in this case is \$20,650.00 plus \$250.00 for the Department's cost and expenses.

Please be advised that this Warning Letter is part of an agency investigation preliminary to agency action in accordance with Section 120.57(4), F.S. The enclosed civil penalty worksheets are formulated and tendered in the context of settlement negotiation in order to attempt to reach an amicable settlement and shall not be admissible as evidence in any proceeding. We look forward to your cooperation in completing the investigation and resolution of this matter.

Inspectors observed 35 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters with no labels. Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed 32 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters not being protected from the weather and being stored on a pallet over non-impermeable surface. Inspectors advised EMC to place these crushed used oil filters over a impervious surface.

Inspectors observed stained soils next to a 250-gallon tank and requested a preliminary contamination assessment plan be completed and sent to the Department for review. Drained, crushed oil filters are sent to U.S. Foundry and Smelting (USFS) in Medley, Florida.

EMC brokers the disposal of petroleum contaminated soil. Pre-burn analyses are run on the individual drums before they leave the petroleum contaminated site. The pre-burn analyses are performed by Envirodyne. The contaminated soils that fail the pre-burn analyses, that test as hazardous waste, are transported for disposal by an approved hazardous waste transporter. The drummed contaminated soils that pass the pre-burn analyses are transported to EMC or transported to an approved burn facility.

EMC excepts only non-hazardous waste at their facility.

Inspectors observed a 250-gallon drum of used oil and 15 55-gallon drums of used oil not labeled with the words "Used Oil." Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed a 55-gallon drum labeled with the words "Absorbent Material." Inspectors requested EMC to open the drums, rags were observed. EMC was requested to produce a analytical for the material and insure the drum is properly labeled.

Inspectors observed an open 250-gallon tank (about 1/3 full) being utilized to clean vehicle parts. Per Ms. Perez-Leon, the contents are mainly used gasoline, jet fuel, and diesel to clean parts, once the fuel is no longer good its added to the used oil tank for disposal. Inspectors requested a determination of the tank contents and the results be sent to the Department for review.

Inspectors observed a 5000-gallon unlabeled tank. Ms. Perez-Leon was not sure of the content of the tank. Mr. Perez-Leon said Mr. George L. Vincent will contact the Department and explain what the contents of the tank.

RECORD REVIEW

EMC provided copies of used oil manifests, training records, EMC safety meetings, and non-hazardous waste manifest for the 55-gallon drum of rags being stored at EMC. Enclosed is a change of status form for EMC's

facility at 6201 S.W. 35th Street, Miami, Florida. This form should be filed out and submitted to the Department to close out the EPA identification number.

DEPARTMENT FINDINGS

EMC notified as a non-handler of hazardous waste and was assigned the EPA ID #FLR000000166 for their used oil operation. EMC appears to generate less than 100 kilograms per month of hazardous waste and would be classified as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste. In order for EMC to be excluded from full regulation under 40 CFR 262, EMC must comply with the provisions in 40 CFR 261.5. EMC must ensure proper disposal of all hazardous wastes that are generated to be in compliance with 40 CFR 261.5.

An exit interview was conducted with Ms. Perez-Leon. The following potential violation was noted and the following items under "comments" were requested to be sent to the Department.

Provide to the Department a hazardous waste determination on the 55-gallon drum of non-hazardous contaminated rags generated by Keys Fishering, Marathon, Florida, also provide a hazardous waste determination from the collection can at the end of the oil filter crushing process system.

Additional requests were made under comments:

1) Label all 55-gallon crushed used oil filter drums with the words "Used Oil Filter."

2) Store used oil/filters on a impervious surface.

- 3) Label a 250-gallon tank and all 55-gallon drums of used oil with the words "Used Oil."
- 4) Beside the 500-gallon tank inspectors observed stained soils. Inspectors requested a PCAP to be completed of the soil and send the results to the Department within 30 days of this inspection.

5) Make determination of parts washer and send the results to the

Department within 10 days of completion of the analytical. 6) Relabel non-hazardous waste drum of used rags (Labeled Absorbent Material) and send the picture to the Department within 15 days of this inspection report.

7) As noted above, the 55-gallon drum of waste material from the oil filtering crushing system needs determination to identify if it is hazardous waste (next to filter crushing system).

Ms. Perez-Leon made a copy of the Exit Interview Summary for her records.

On June 9, 1997, EMC provided a list of vehicles utilized at EMC. June 16, 1997, EMC provided soil analysis of the stained soils next to E.M.C. Oil Corporation INSPECTION REPORT Page 4 of 7

the 500-gallon tank. The analysis requested by the Department was for Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedures (TCLP) RCRA metals. EMC provided results indicating Arsenic 1.0 mg/Kg, Cadmium 8.0 mg/Kg, Copper 10.4 mg/Kg, Lead 8.9 mg/Kg, Nickel 2.24 mg/Kg, and Zinc 38.5 mg/Kg.

Hazardous waste management rules may have been violated, as noted below ("Summary of Potential Violations"). The Department expects the violations to be corrected in an expeditious and safe manner. The Department's Enforcement Section (phone 561/681-6600) is willing to provide assistance, within the Department's capabilities, limitations, time constraints and workload. SITE INSPECTION

On April 16, 1997, a hazardous waste/used oil compliance inspection was conducted at E.M.C. Oil Corporation (EMC), 8470 NW 68th Street, Miami, Florida. The inspection was part of the Department's 1997 inspection schedule. EMC has been in business at this location since 1994 and has 11 employees. EMC is a transporter and transfer facility for used oil, used oil filters, and waste oily water. EMC is connected to a publicly owned treatment works (POTW). The inspection and records review were hosted by Ms. Maria E. Perez-Leon (Owner). Department personnel participating in the inspection included Mr. James Bussey and Ms. Tiffany Holmes.

EMC has a fleet of five tanker trucks, a vacuum truck, and two box truck which are used to pick up drummed waste. Two of the six tanker trucks are single compartment tankers used to haul used oil. One of the tanker trucks uses is a 8,000 gallon compartment heil-trailer. One truck uses is a vacuum for pumping out sumps and soakage pits. The other three tankers are compartmentalized in the following manner: one double compartment 3,300 gallon capacity tanker, one double compartment 2,500 gallon capacity tanker, and a double compartment 2,600 gallon capacity tanker. The trucks leave the facility early in the morning on their "milk runs" to pick up vehicular waste. The trucks return in the late afternoon to unload. Used oil is sometimes mixed with transmission fluid inside the tankers. Inspectors observed a 5000-gallon storage tank that is used for the storage of waste water and possibly used oil, per Ms. Perez-Leon.

Used oil is taken to several location in Southern Florida. The main facilities utilized by EMC are Cliff Berry, Inc., Perma-Fix Environmental (formerly Integrated Resource Recovery), H.R. Paving, International Petroleum, Inc., U.S. Foundry, Chemical Conservation, Laidlaw Environmental, and Rinker Materials for recycling. Before a load is dropped at a facility the tank is tested for water and halogen levels.

When trucks return at the end of the day with "waste water", it is stored in a 5000 gallon tractor trailer tanks. When all of the "water waste" has been consolidated into one tanker compartment, it is transported to a selected facility for recycling.

EMC provides its customers with DOT approved 55-gallon drums for accumulation and storage of used oil filters. Drummed used oil filters are returned to EMC for crushing and draining. At the end of the crushing and draining process is a 55-gallon drum collecting excess debris and gas filters. The used oil is drained from the 55-gallon drum and is sent for recycling with the rest of the used oil. Sludge and debris is removed from the 55-gallon drum and placed into the dumpster as trash. Inspectors requested a hazardous waste determination before further discharge to the dumpster.

Inspectors observed 35 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters with no labels. Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed 32 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters not being protected from the weather and being stored on a pallet over non-impermeable surface. Inspectors advised EMC to place these crushed used oil filters over a impervious surface.

Inspectors observed stained soils next to a 250-gallon tank and requested a preliminary contamination assessment plan be completed and sent to the Department for review. Drained, crushed oil filters are sent to U.S. Foundry and Smelting (USFS) in Medley, Florida.

EMC brokers the disposal of petroleum contaminated soil. Pre-burn analyses are run on the individual drums before they leave the petroleum contaminated site. The pre-burn analyses are performed by Envirodyne. The contaminated soils that fail the pre-burn analyses, that test as hazardous waste, are transported for disposal by an approved hazardous waste transporter. The drummed contaminated soils that pass the pre-burn analyses are transported to EMC or transported to an approved burn facility.

EMC excepts only non-hazardous waste at their facility.

Inspectors observed a 250-gallon drum of used oil and 15 55-gallon drums of used oil not labeled with the words "Used Oil." Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed a 55-gallon drum labeled with the words "Absorbent Material." Inspectors requested EMC to open the drums, rags were observed. EMC was requested to produce a analytical for the material and insure the drum is properly labeled.

Inspectors observed an open 250-gallon tank (about 1/3 full) being utilized to clean vehicle parts. Per Ms. Perez-Leon, the contents are mainly used gasoline, jet fuel, and diesel to clean parts, once the fuel is no longer good its added to the used oil tank for disposal. Inspectors requested a determination of the tank contents and the results be sent to the Department for review.

Inspectors observed a 5000-gallon unlabeled tank. Ms. Perez-Leon was not sure of the content of the tank. Mr. Perez-Leon said Mr. George L. Vincent will contact the Department and explain what the contents of the tank.

RECORD REVIEW

EMC provided copies of used oil manifests, training records, EMC safety meetings, and non-hazardous waste manifest for the 55-gallon drum of rags being stored at EMC. Enclosed is a change of status form for EMC's

facility at 6201 S.W. 35th Street, Miami, Florida. This form should be filed out and submitted to the Department to close out the EPA identification number.

DEPARTMENT FINDINGS

EMC notified as a non-handler of hazardous waste and was assigned the EPA ID #FLR000000166 for their used oil operation. EMC appears to generate less than 100 kilograms per month of hazardous waste and would be classified as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste. In order for EMC to be excluded from full regulation under 40 CFR 262, EMC must comply with the provisions in 40 CFR 261.5. EMC must ensure proper disposal of all hazardous wastes that are generated to be in compliance with 40 CFR 261.5.

An exit interview was conducted with Ms. Perez-Leon. The following potential violation was noted and the following items under "comments" were requested to be sent to the Department.

 Provide to the Department a hazardous waste determination on the 55-gallon drum of non-hazardous contaminated rags generated by Keys Fishering, Marathon, Florida, also provide a hazardous waste determination from the collection can at the end of the oil filter crushing process system.

Additional requests were made under comments:

- 1) Label all 55-gallon crushed used oil filter drums with the words "Used Oil Filter."
- 2) Store used oil/filters on a impervious surface.
- 3) Label a 250-gallon tank and all 55-gallon drums of used oil with the words "Used Oil."
- 4) Beside the 500-gallon tank inspectors observed stained soils. Inspectors requested a PCAP to be completed of the soil and send the results to the Department within 30 days of this inspection.
- 5) Make determination of parts washer and send the results to the Department within 10 days of completion of the analytical.
- 6) Relabel non-hazardous waste drum of used rags (Labeled Absorbent Material) and send the picture to the Department within 15 days of this inspection report.
- 7) As noted above, the 55-gallon drum of waste material from the oil filtering crushing system needs determination to identify if it is hazardous waste (next to filter crushing system).

Ms. Perez-Leon made a copy of the Exit Interview Summary for her records.

On June 9, 1997, EMC provided a list of vehicles utilized at EMC. On June 16, 1997, EMC provided soil analysis of the stained soils next to

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the 500-gallon tank. The analysis requested by the Department was for Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedures (TCLP) RCRA metals. EMC provided results indicating Arsenic 1.0 mg/Kg, Cadmium 8.0 mg/Kg, Copper 10.4 mg/Kg, Lead 8.9 mg/Kg, Nickel 2.24 mg/Kg, and Zinc 38.5 mg/Kg.

Hazardous waste management rules may have been violated, as noted below ("Summary of Potential Violations"). The Department expects the violations to be corrected in an expeditious and safe manner. Evans Environmental & Geological Science and Management, Inc. (EE&G) was retained by EMC Oil Corporation (EMC) to review preliminary soil analytical data collected in response to a Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) notice dated April 30, 1997. According to EMC Oil Corporation representatives, the area of stained soil has been excavated and containerized into one 55-gallon open top, steel drum. A composite soil sample was sent to Precision Environmental Laboratory, Inc. a Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services (DHRS)-certified and FDEPapproved laboratory for analysis of CFR 122, Appendix D Priority Pollutants by EPA Methods 7000 series, 9010, 9065, 8260, 8270, 8080.

Arsenic, cadmium, copper, lead, nickel, and zinc were detected in the composite soil sample at concentrations of 1.0 milligrams per kilogram (mg/kg), 8.0 mg/kg, 10.4 mg/kg, 8.9 mg/kg, 2.24 mg/kg, and 38.5 kg/mg. The arsenic, cadmium, lead, nickel, and zinc concentrations do not exceed the FDEP Soil Cleanup Goals for industrial sites (updated January 19, 1996) of 3.1 mg/kg, 600 mg/kg, 1000 mg/kg, 26,000 mg/kg, and 56,000 mg/kg, respectively. Copper is not included in the FDEP Soil Cleanup Goals as a regulated substance. All other parameters tested were below detectable limits (BDL). Laboratory analytical results are included as Attachment A.

Based upon phone conversations with FDEP representatives and a review of the laboratory analytical data supplied by EMC Oil Corporation, it appears that the environmental concerns and recommendations outlined in the FDEP notice dated April 30, 1997 have been adequately addressed by EMC Oil Corporation. EE&G found no evidence that EMC Oil Corporation was in

violation of FDEP Soil Cleanup Goals. Based on the analytical results, EE&G recommends that no further action status be granted for the site.

Please conduct a thorough record review and provide the Department with the information requested in the enclosed DDC pursuant to Rule 62-730.150(7), F.A.C., Documentation supporting your response must be included where indicated.

Please submit the PCAP and the completed DDC and supporting documentation to the letterhead address within 30 days of receipt of this letter.

DEFINITION OF A SOLID WASTE



DEFINITION OF A HAZARDOUS WASTE



PRELIMINARY CONTAMINATION ASSESSMENT ACTIONS

- 1. Within 20 days of entry to this Order, Respondent shall submit to the Department documents certifying that the organization(s) and laboratory(s) performing the sampling and analysis have a DEPARTMENT APPROVED Comprehensive Quality Assurance Plan (Comp QAP) in which they are approved for the sampling and analysis intended to be used for the assessment of the site. The documentation shall, at a minimum, contain the TITLE PAGE and TABLE OF CONTENTS of the approved Comp QAP meeting the requirements of Rule 17-160, F.A.C. If the organization(s) or laboratory(s) performing the sampling and analysis change at any time during the assessment, documentation of their DEPARTMENT APPROVED Comp QAP will be required. If at any time sampling and analysis are to be conducted which are not in the Approved Comp QAP, documentation of amendments and approvals pursuant to Rule 17-160.210, F.A.C., shall be required.
- 2. Within 30 days of the effective date of the Order incorporating these Preliminary Contamination Assessment Actions, Respondent shall submit a Preliminary Contamination Assessment Plan ("PCAP") to the Department. Applicable portions of the PCAP shall be signed and sealed pursuant to Rule 17-103.110(4), F.A.C. The PCAP shall describe the tasks that Respondent proposes to perform in order to determine whether the soil, sediment, surface water or ground water are contaminated at Respondent's facility; and, if so, whether such contamination has resulted in a violation of the water quality standards and minimum criteria established in Florida Administrative Code Chapter 17-3 or constitutes a risk to the public health, the environment or the public welfare. The PCAP shall include a time schedule for each task so that all tasks can be completed and a Preliminary Contamination Assessment Report ("PCAR") can be submitted to the Department within 90 days of approval of the PCAP by the Department.
- 3. The PCAP shall include provisions for the installation and sampling of, in most cases, a minimum of four monitor wells to determine the groundwater quality and flow direction at the site. Proposal of fewer wells or an alternate well configuration is subject to Department approval. Provision to sample surface waters, sediments and soils shall be included as necessary.
- A. One of the wells shall be located in the area suspected of greatest contamination and two wells shall be located downgradient of the area suspected of highest contamination.
 - B. One of the wells shall be an unaffected background well.
- C. The wells, surface waters, sediments and soils, as applicable, shall be sampled and analyzed for the following parameters with the listed method;
 - (1) priority pollutant metals using DER approved Methods;
- (2) priority pollutant organic chemicals using EPA methods 624/8240 and 625/8250 or 8270;
- (3) all non-priority pollutant organic chemicals with peaks greater than 10 micrograms per liter (ug/l) using EPA methods 624/8240 and 625/8250 or 8270;
- (4) pesticides and herbicides using EPA methods 8080, 8140, 8150 or 625/8250 or 8270, if applicable, or other Department approved methods for pesticides and herbicides for which the listed methods are not applicable; and

(5) others, as applicable.

Proposal of alternate analytical methods is subject to Department approval. The number of contaminants to be analyzed may be reduced if Respondent can demonstrate to the Department's satisfaction that the contaminants proposed to be deleted from the list cannot be attributed to any activities that have taken place at Respondent's facility. The Department shall submit written notification to the Respondent if the number can be reduced.

- 4. The PCAP shall include provisions for investigation of the following conditions, as applicable, at the contamination site and the area surrounding the contamination site:
 - A. The presence and thickness of any free product at the site;
 - B. The presence of soil contamination at the site;
- C. The aquifers present beneath the site and their Chapter 17-3, FAC, groundwater classification;
- D. The number and locations of all public and private potable supply wells within a 1/2 mile radius of the site;
- E. The presence of surface waters of the State within a 1/2 mile radius of the site and, if applicable, their Rule 17-3, F.A.C., classification; and
- F. The geology and hydrogeology of the site focusing on aquifers and confining units which are present, the potential for movement of contaminants both horizontally and vertically, zones that are likely to be affected, and actual and potential uses of the groundwater as a resource.
 - The PCAP shall contain the following site specific information;
- A. Proposed well construction details including methods and materials, well installation depths and screened intervals and well development procedures;
- B. A description of methods and equipment to be used to quantify soil and sediment contamination;
- C. A description of water sampling methods, including names of sampling personnel, procedures and equipment;
 - D. Name of laboratory to be used for analytical work;
- E. The parameters to be analyzed for, the analytical methods to be used and the detection limits of these analytical methods;
- F. Site map depicting monitoring well locations and other proposed sampling sites and justification for their selection; and
- G. A detailed site history including: a description of past and present property and/or facility owners; a description of past and present operations including those which involve the storage, use, processing or manufacture of materials which may be potential pollution sources; a description of all products used or manufactured and of all by-products and wastes (including waste constituents) generated during the life of the facility; a summary of current and past environmental permits and enforcement actions; a summary of known spills or releases of materials which may be potential pollution sources; and an inventory of potential pollution sources within 0.25 (one quarter) mile.
- 6. The Department shall review the PCAP and provide Respondent with a written response to the proposal. In the event that additional information is necessary for the Department to evaluate the PCAP, the Department shall make a written request to Respondent for the information and Respondent shall provide the requested information within 20 days from receipt of said request. The PCAP shall incorporate all required modifications to the PCAP identified by the Department. Any action taken by Respondent with regard to the implementation of the PCAP prior to the Respondent receiving written notification from the Department that the PCAP has been approved shall be at Respondent's risk.

- 7. Within (60) days of the Department's approval of the PCAP (unless a written time extension is granted by the Department), Respondent shall submit a written Preliminary Contamination Assessment Report ("PCAR") to the Department. Applicable portions of the PCAR shall be signed and sealed pursuant to Rule 17-103.110(4), F.A.C. The PCAR shall:
 - A. Summarize and analyze all "PCAP" tasks;
 - B. Include, but not be limited to, the following tables and figures:
- (1) A table with well construction details, top of casing elevation, depth to water measurements, and water elevations;
- (2) A site map showing water elevations, water table contours and the groundwater flow direction for each aquifer monitored for each sampling period;
 - (3) A table with water quality information for all monitor wells;
- (4) Site maps showing contaminant concentrations and contours of the contaminants; and
- (5) Cross sections depicting the geology of the site at least to the top of the confining unit. In general there should be at least one north to south cross section and one east to west cross section.
- C. Include copies of field notes pertaining to field procedures, particularly of data collection procedures; and
- D. Specify results and conclusions regarding the objectives of the Preliminary Contamination Assessment;
- E. Provide the following quality assurance data along with the analytical data from all media:
- (1) dates of sample collection, sample preparation including extraction and sample analysis;
 - (2) the detection limits for these analyses;
- (3) the results from the analyses of field quality control samples; including field equipments, trip blanks and duplicates;
- (4) the results from reagent water blanks run on that day (5% of samples run, minimum);
 - (5) the spike and surrogate percent recoveries for the data set;
 - (6) the actual chromatograms, if requested by the Department.
- (7) any other QA/QC information Department deems necessary to evaluate validity of the submitted data.
- F. Identify, to the extent possible, the source(s), extent, and concentrations of contaminants, and the existence of any imminent hazards.
- 8. The Department shall review the PCAR and determine whether it is adequate to meet the objectives of the PCAP. In the event that additional information is necessary to evaluate the PCAR, the Department shall make a written request and Respondent shall provide all requested information within 20 days of receipt of said request.
- 9. Respondent shall provide notification to the Department at least twenty (20) days prior to the installation or sampling of any monitoring wells, and shall allow Department personnel the opportunity to observe installation and sampling and to take split samples. All necessary approvals must be obtained from the appropriate water management district before any wells are installed. Raw data shall be exchanged between Respondent and the Department as soon as the data is available.

- 10. The Respondent is required to comply with all local, state and federal regulations and to obtain any necessary approvals from local, state and federal authorities in carrying out these assessment actions.
- 11. If the Department's review of the PCAR indicates that the soil, sediments, surface water or ground water is contaminated, or constitutes a risk to the public health, the environment or the public welfare, or if the Department rejects the PCAP or PCAR for not meeting the objectives of analyzing or reporting on the analysis of the contaminants that are the subject of the assessment, the Department reserves the right to do any or all of the following:
- A. Seek further administrative relief through the filing of a Notice of Violation or entry of a Consent Order which requires Respondent to conduct further assessment and clean-up at its facility;
 - B. File suit for injunctive relief, civil penalties, damages and expenses; or
- C. Perform the necessary corrective actions at Respondent's facility and recover the costs of such actions from Respondent.
- 12. If the Department's review of the PCAR indicates that the site is not contaminated and does not constitute a risk to the public health, the environment or the public welfare, the Department will so notify the Respondent in writing.

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

The corrective actions required to bring your facility into compliance have been performed. The Department finds that you are in violation of the rules and statutes cited in the attached Warning Letter. In order to resolve the matters identified in the attached Warning Letter, your company is assessed civil penalties. As agreed to between the Department and E.M.C. Oil Corp during the July 19, 2005 meeting, your company is assessed civil penalties in the amount of \$10,000.00 along with \$500.00 to reimburse the Department's costs for a total of \$10,500.00. The civil penalty in this case includes at least one violation of \$2,000.00 or more.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of possible violations of law for which you may be responsible, and to seek your cooperation in resolving the matter. A hazardous waste inspection was conducted at your facility on May 10, 2005. During the inspection, possible violations of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.), Chapter 62-730, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) regarding hazardous waste management were noted. The observations of the Department are in the attached inspection report. Florida Statutes provide that facilities must comply with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 260 through 268, and Part 279, as adopted in Chapter 62-730, F.A.C., and Chapter 62-710, F.A.C.

You are requested to contact Mr. Jeff Curtis of this office at 561/681-6756 within 15 days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss the issues. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyone with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter.

If after further investigation, the Department determines that the violations occurred, this matter may be resolved through entry of a Consent Order which will include a compliance schedule and an appropriate penalty. In accordance with the Department's January 24, 2002 "Settlement Guidelines for Civil and Administrative Penalties" and the RCRA Civil Penalty Policy of June

2003, the penalty which would be proposed in this case is \$42,475.00 plus \$500.00 for administrative costs and expenses.

Please be advised that this Warning Letter is part of an agency investigation preliminary to agency action in accordance with Section 120.57(5), F.S. The attached civil penalty worksheets are formulated and tendered only in the context of settlement negotiations in order to attempt to reach cooperative settlement. We look forward to your cooperation in completing the investigation and resolution of this matter.

BACKGROUND

On May 10, 2005, a compliance evaluation inspection was conducted at E.M.C. Oil Corporation, (EMC), 8470 NW 68th St., Miami, Florida. Mr. George Vicente, Manager, hosted the site inspection. Mr. George Vicente and Ms. Maria Leon, President; hosted the record review. Department personnel participating in the inspection were Mr. Jeff Curtis, and Mr. Stephen Brown of the Hazardous Waste Compliance/Enforcement Section.

EMC is a registered transporter of used oil, used oil filters, oily wastewater, absorbent material and hazardous waste. EMC has been operating at this location for approximately ten years, and has approximately 12 employees. The facility, where EMC is located, is owned by MEL Property Inc., 8470 NW 68 St., Miami, Florida, and appears to be connected to the city sewer system.


SITE INSPECTION

The property on which EMC is located has one building. The building is divided into offices with an attached garage, which is used for maintenance and small repairs. Located behind the main building is a work yard where the used oil, used oil filters, soiled rags are stored. The used oil is stored in a 8000 gallon storage tank; used oil filters, and soiled rags are stored in 55 gallon drums. Mr. George Vicente greeted the inspectors and escorted them through the facility. Upon entering the work yard, inspectors noted that there were 7 drums sitting next to an EMC truck that appeared to have recently been unloaded. One of these drums had a used oil filter label on it while the other 6 were unlabeled. Mr. Vicente stated that the labels had come off and that personnel were in the process of putting new labels on the drums. Inspectors inquired about EMC's procedure related to screening pick ups for halogens. Mr. Vicente stated that all trucks carry a sniffer, and a dexsil testing kit in them. He then proceeded to a truck and produced a sniffer along with a dexsil kit from the inside of this truck. All other drums in the yard were correctly labeled and covered. The 8000 gallon used oil tank was correctly labeled as "used oil", and there were a 3 more large storage tanks that were labeled "empty". The storage tank area is completely surrounded with secondary containment. Mr. Vicente told inspectors that used oil is taken to Rinker and various other asphalt plants. Used oil filters are completely drained and taken to U.S. Foundry.

RECORD REVIEW

The following records were requested for review: hazardous waste transport manifests, used oil transport manifests, and used oil filter transport manifests. Although primarily a used oil transporter, Mr. Vicente informed inspectors that EMC transports hazardous waste for some of their customers, and that the hazardous waste shipments are taken directly to Perma-Fix. While reviewing used oil manifests inspectors noted the lack of an area on the manifest for drivers to indicate that a halogen screening had taken place for that load, otherwise all used oil and used oil filter manifests reviewed-were in order. While reviewing hazardous-waste transport manifests inspectors noted that on 3 manifests there was a significant lapse in time between the pick up from the generator and the delivery to Perma-Fix. These were: manifest #05-010-pick up 2/17/05, deliver to Perma-Fix 3/4/05, manifest #04-075-pick up 10/14/04, deliver to Perma-Fix 11/3/04, manifest #04-043-pick up 10/1/04, deliver to Perma-Fix 10/11/04. Mr. Vicente stated that it was

possible that the driver was late and was not able to make the delivery to Perma-Fix. Inspectors asked where the hazardous waste was stored in these instances and Mr. Vicente stated that it was probably stored on the truck.

DEPARTMENT FINDINGS


EMC notified as a registered used oil transporter, and a hazardous waste transporter. However, during the normal course of business EMC held hazardous waste at its' facility beyond the allowable 24 hour period on three separate occasions. On two of these occasions hazardous waste was held in excess of the 10 day period allowable by a transfer facility. Therefore, EMC is subject to full regulation as a hazardous waste storage facility set forth under 40 CFR 264.

An exit interview was conducted during the inspection and the following areas of concern and potential violations were discussed:

- 1) Containers of used oil filters should be labeled with the words "used oil filters" at all times.
- 2) Used oil screening should be documented on acceptance records.
- 3) Hazardous waste should not be stored in trucks, or on-site for more than 24 hours according to the regulations pertaining to a hazardous waste transporter.

EMC responded to the exit interview on May 16, 2005 with a letter from Maria E. Perez Leon. It stated that containers of used oil filters are labeled with "Used Oil Filters" label as they are picked up, or are labeled by EMC personnel as soon as they arrive at the facility. Also, that their drivers carry halogen detectors, and a Dexsil testing kit in their trucks at all times. Regarding hazardous waste, the letter states that EMC will schedule hazardous waste shipments to be taken to the disposal facility within 24 hours after it is picked up.

Used oil and hazardous waste management rules may have been violated, as noted below ("Summary of Potential Violations"). The Department expects the potential violations to be corrected in an expeditious and safe manner. The Department's Enforcement Section is willing to provide assistance within the Department's' capabilities, limitations, time constraints, and workload. In addition, if not already done, the Department suggests that a copy of the hazardous waste regulations (40 CFR 260-268 and 279) be obtained from local public, college, or law libraries or EPA Region IV or US Government Printing Office. Please be advised that the Department does not have copies of 40 CFR 260-268 and 279 to hand out.

NOTICE OF RIGHTS

Persons who are not parties to this Consent Order but whose substantial interests are affected by this Consent Order have a right, pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes, to petition for an administrative hearing on it. The Petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) at the Department's Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS-35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, within 21 days of receipt of this notice. A copy of the Petition must also be mailed at the time of filing to the District Office named above at the address indicated. Failure to file a petition within the 21 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information:

BACKGROUND



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SITE INSPECTION

The property on which EMC is located has one building. The building is divided into offices with an attached garage, which is used for maintenance and small repairs. Located behind the main building is a work yard where the used oil, used oil filters, soiled rags are stored. The used oil is stored in a 8000 gallon storage tank; used oil filters, and soiled rags are stored in 55 gallon drums. Mr. George Vicente greeted the inspectors and escorted them through the facility. Upon entering the work yard, inspectors noted that there were 7 drums sitting next to an EMC truck that appeared to have recently been unloaded. One of these drums had a used oil filter label on it while the other 6 were unlabeled. Mr. Vicente stated that the labels had come off and that personnel were in the process of putting new labels on the drums. Inspectors inquired about EMC's procedure related to screening pick ups for halogens. Mr. Vicente stated that all trucks carry a sniffer, and a dexsil testing kit in them. He then proceeded to a truck and produced a sniffer along with a dexsil kit from the inside of this truck. All other drums in the yard were correctly labeled and covered. The 8000 gallon used oil tank was correctly labeled as "used oil", and there were a 3 more large storage tanks that were labeled "empty". The storage tank area is completely surrounded with secondary containment. Mr. Vicente told inspectors that used oil is taken to Rinker and various other asphalt plants. Used oil filters are completely drained and taken to U.S. Foundry.

SITE INSPECTION

On April 16, 1997, a hazardous waste/used oil compliance inspection was conducted at E.M.C. Oil Corporation (EMC), 8470 NW 68th Street, Miami, Florida. The inspection was part of the Department's 1997 inspection schedule. EMC has been in business at this location since 1994 and has 11 employees. EMC is a transporter and transfer facility for used oil, used oil filters, and waste oily water. EMC is connected to a publicly owned treatment works (POTW). The inspection and records review were hosted by Ms. Maria E. Perez-Leon (Owner). Department personnel participating in the inspection included Mr. James Bussey and Ms. Tiffany Holmes.

EMC has a fleet of five tanker trucks, a vacuum truck, and two box truck which are used to pick up drummed waste. Two of the six tanker trucks are single compartment tankers used to haul used oil. One of the tanker trucks uses is a 8,000 gallon compartment heil-trailer. One truck uses is a vacuum for pumping out sumps and soakage pits. The other three tankers are compartmentalized in the following manner: one double compartment 3,300 gallon capacity tanker, one double compartment 2,500 gallon capacity tanker, and a double compartment 2,600 gallon capacity tanker. The trucks leave the facility early in the morning on their "milk runs" to pick up vehicular waste. The trucks return in the late afternoon to unload. Used oil is sometimes mixed with transmission fluid inside the tankers. Inspectors observed a 5000-gallon storage tank that is used for the storage of waste water and possibly used oil, per Ms. Perez-Leon.

Used oil is taken to several location in Southern Florida. The main facilities utilized by EMC are Cliff Berry, Inc., Perma-Fix Environmental (formerly Integrated Resource Recovery), H.R. Paving, International Petroleum, Inc., U.S. Foundry, Chemical Conservation, Laidlaw Environmental, and Rinker Materials for recycling. Before a load is dropped at a facility the tank is tested for water and halogen levels.

When trucks return at the end of the day with "waste water", it is stored in a 5000 gallon tractor trailer tanks. When all of the "water waste" has been consolidated into one tanker compartment, it is transported to a selected facility for recycling.

EMC provides its customers with DOT approved 55-gallon drums for accumulation and storage of used oil filters. Drummed used oil filters are returned to EMC for crushing and draining. At the end of the crushing and draining process is a 55-gallon drum collecting excess debris and gas filters. The used oil is drained from the 55-gallon drum and is sent for recycling with the rest of the used oil. Sludge and debris is removed from the 55-gallon drum and placed into the dumpster as trash. Inspectors requested a hazardous waste determination before further discharge to the dumpster.

Inspectors observed 35 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters with no labels. Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed 32 55-gallon drums of crushed used oil filters not being protected from the weather and being stored on a pallet over non-impermeable surface. Inspectors advised EMC to place these crushed used oil filters over a impervious surface.

Inspectors observed stained soils next to a 250-gallon tank and requested a preliminary contamination assessment plan be completed and sent to the Department for review. Drained, crushed oil filters are sent to U.S. Foundry and Smelting (USFS) in Medley, Florida.

EMC brokers the disposal of petroleum contaminated soil. Pre-burn analyses are run on the individual drums before they leave the petroleum contaminated site. The pre-burn analyses are performed by Envirodyne. The contaminated soils that fail the pre-burn analyses, that test as hazardous waste, are transported for disposal by an approved hazardous waste transporter. The drummed contaminated soils that pass the pre-burn analyses are transported to EMC or transported to an approved burn facility.

EMC excepts only non-hazardous waste at their facility.

Inspectors observed a 250-gallon drum of used oil and 15 55-gallon drums of used oil not labeled with the words "Used Oil." Inspectors advised EMC to label the drums and send pictures to the Department for review. Inspectors observed a 55-gallon drum labeled with the words "Absorbent Material." Inspectors requested EMC to open the drums, rags were observed. EMC was requested to produce a analytical for the material and insure the drum is properly labeled.

Inspectors observed an open 250-gallon tank (about 1/3 full) being utilized to clean vehicle parts. Per Ms. Perez-Leon, the contents are mainly used gasoline, jet fuel, and diesel to clean parts, once the fuel is no longer good its added to the used oil tank for disposal. Inspectors requested a determination of the tank contents and the results be sent to the Department for review.

Inspectors observed a 5000-gallon unlabeled tank. Ms. Perez-Leon was not sure of the content of the tank. Mr. Perez-Leon said Mr. George L. Vincent will contact the Department and explain what the contents of the tank.

RECORD REVIEW

EMC provided copies of used oil manifests, training records, EMC safety meetings, and non-hazardous waste manifest for the 55-gallon drum of rags being stored at EMC. Enclosed is a change of status form for EMC's

facility at 6201 S.W. 35th Street, Miami, Florida. This form should be filed out and submitted to the Department to close out the EPA identification number.

DEPARTMENT FINDINGS

EMC notified as a non-handler of hazardous waste and was assigned the EPA ID #FLR000000166 for their used oil operation. EMC appears to generate less than 100 kilograms per month of hazardous waste and would be classified as a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste. In order for EMC to be excluded from full regulation under 40 CFR 262, EMC must comply with the provisions in 40 CFR 261.5. EMC must ensure proper disposal of all hazardous wastes that are generated to be in compliance with 40 CFR 261.5.

An exit interview was conducted with Ms. Perez-Leon. The following potential violation was noted and the following items under "comments" were requested to be sent to the Department.

 Provide to the Department a hazardous waste determination on the 55-gallon drum of non-hazardous contaminated rags generated by Keys Fishering, Marathon, Florida, also provide a hazardous waste determination from the collection can at the end of the oil filter crushing process system.

Additional requests were made under comments:

- 1) Label all 55-gallon crushed used oil filter drums with the words "Used Oil Filter."
- 2) Store used oil/filters on a impervious surface.
- 3) Label a 250-gallon tank and all 55-gallon drums of used oil with the words "Used Oil."
- 4) Beside the 500-gallon tank inspectors observed stained soils. Inspectors requested a PCAP to be completed of the soil and send the results to the Department within 30 days of this inspection.
- 5) Make determination of parts washer and send the results to the Department within 10 days of completion of the analytical.
- 6) Relabel non-hazardous waste drum of used rags (Labeled Absorbent Material) and send the picture to the Department within 15 days of this inspection report.
- 7) As noted above, the 55-gallon drum of waste material from the oil filtering crushing system needs determination to identify if it is hazardous waste (next to filter crushing system).

Ms. Perez-Leon made a copy of the Exit Interview Summary for her records.

On June 9, 1997, EMC provided a list of vehicles utilized at EMC. On June 16, 1997, EMC provided soil analysis of the stained soils next to

the 500-gallon tank. The analysis requested by the Department was for Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedures (TCLP) RCRA metals. EMC provided results indicating Arsenic 1.0 mg/Kg, Cadmium 8.0 mg/Kg, Copper 10.4 mg/Kg, Lead 8.9 mg/Kg, Nickel 2.24 mg/Kg, and Zinc 38.5 mg/Kg.
