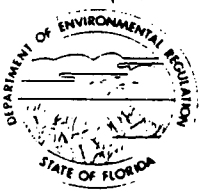

 BY THE HAZARDOUS AND SOLID WASTE AMENDMENTS OF 1984
 (HSWA), SECTION 403.722, FLORIDA STATUTES (FS), AND CHAPTERS
 17-4 AND 17-730 OF THE FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE (FAC) TO
 Universal Waste & Translt, Inc., 2002 N. Orient Road, Tampa, Hillsborough
 County, Florida 33619, having assigned facility I.D. Number FLD 981 932
 494. The permit, if issued, will be the State permit which covers the RCRA
 program that was in effect prior to the passage of the HSWA. The Environ-
 mental Protection Agency (EPA) and Florida Department of Environmental
 Regulation (FDER) have determined that there is no evidence of releases of
 hazardous wastes or constituents from solid waste management units
 (SWMUs) at this facility. Therefore, at this time, Section 3004(u) of the Haz-

A draft permit, prepared in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 17-730 FAC,

 proposed facility will manage hazardous waste storage units and physical treatment

The combined quantity of all these wastes will not exceed 33,600 gallons at any time in the storage facility.

Any interested person may submit written comments on this proposed State agency action to the address shown above, within forty-five (45) days of publication of this notice. All comments on the facility will be considered by the Department in formulating a decision on issuing this permit.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) in accordance with Section 120.57, FS, and Chapters 17-103, and 28-5, FAC. Petitions must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400, within forty-five (45) days of publication of this notice. Petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the time of filing. Failure to file a request for hearing within this time frame shall constitute a waiver or any right such person may have to request a hearing under Section 120.57, FS, or a meeting under Section 403.722(10), FS.

A petition for formal or informal administrative hearing pursuant to Section 120.57, FS, shall contain the following information: (a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner. If the petitioner challenges a Department action or proposed action on a permit application, the application's name and address, the Department Permit File Number and the county in which the project is proposed, shall also be included; (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Department's action or proposed action; (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Department's action or proposed action; (d) A statement of those material facts (i.e., those facts upon which the Department's action or proposal is based) disputed by petitioner. If no facts are disputed, petitioner shall so state; (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (f) A statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Department's action or proposed action.

If a petition on the Department's permit is filed, the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate agency action. Accordingly, the Department's final action may be different from the proposed agency action. Persons whose substantial interests have been affected by any decision of the Department have the right to intervene in the proceeding. A petition for intervention must be filed pursuant to Section 28-5.207, FAC, at least five (5) days before the final hearing. Failure to petition to intervene within the allowed time frame constitutes a waiver or any right such person has to request a hearing under Section 120.57, FS.

If new information becomes available indicating that Section 3004(u) of HSWA applies, the permit may be reopened.

The State of Florida has been granted authorization for those portions of the RCRA Hazardous Waste Program that were in effect prior to the passage of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984. The Federal Environmental Protection Agency will administer the applicable portions of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984, (specifically the waste minimization and prior release sections) until the State receives authorization for these provisions.

A draft permit, prepared in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 17-730 FAC, contains the conditions for the operation of the hazardous waste container storage and treatment facility at 2002 N. A person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) in accordance with Section 120.57, FS, and Chapters 17-103, and 28-5, FAC. Petitions must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400, within forty-five (45) days of publication of this notice. Petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the time of filing. Failure to file a request for hearing within this time frame shall constitute a waiver or any right such person may have to request a hearing under Section 120.57, FS, or a meeting under Section 403.722(10), FS.

A petition for formal or informal administrative hearing pursuant to Section 120.57, FS, shall contain the following information: (a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner. If the petitioner challenges a Department action or proposed action on a permit application, the application's name and address, the Department Permit File Number and the county in which the project is proposed, shall also be included; (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Department's action or proposed action; (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Department's action or proposed action; (d) A statement of those material facts (i.e., those facts upon which the Department's action or proposal is based) disputed by petitioner. If no facts are disputed, petitioner shall so state; (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (f) A statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Department's action or proposed action.

If a petition on the Department's permit is filed, the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate agency action. Accordingly, the Department's final action may be different from the proposed agency action. Persons whose substantial interests have been affected by any decision of the Department have the right to intervene in the proceeding. A petition for intervention must be filed pursuant to Section 28-5.207, FAC, at least five (5) days before the final hearing. Failure to petition to intervene within the allowed time frame constitutes a waiver or any right such person has to request a hearing under Section 120.57, FS.

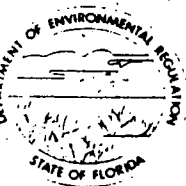

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) conducted a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Facility Assessment (RFA) at the referenced facility on August 18, 1988. This is a new facility and it was determined that there has been no evidence of a prior or continuing release of hazardous wastes or hazardous constituents at this site. Therefore, at this time, Section 3004(u) of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984 does not apply.

Since, apparently, only the Section 3005(h) waste minimization and Section 3004(d) prohibitions on land disposal of specified wastes requirements of HSWA apply to this facility, a separate permit would not be required, provided the State permit incorporates these requirements. In this case, the State permit would constitute the full RCRA permit.

For facilities where only the above mentioned sections apply, the public notice, the notice of intent to issue, and cover page of the permit should contain the following information:


1. EPA has determined that the provisions of 3004(u) of HSWA do not apply; but if new information to the contrary becomes available, the permit may be reopened.
 2. The permit incorporates both the Section 3005(h) HSWA Waste minimization certification requirements and Section 3004(d) Land Disposal prohibitions.
 3. The State permit constitutes the full RCRA permit, and a federal permit is not required to address the provisions of HSWA.

Additionally, the permit should incorporate the waste minimization requirements, land disposal restrictions and condition for reopening the permit if it is later determined that 3004(u) applies.

We have enclosed recommended wording for inclusion in the public notice, notice of intent to issue, permit cover page and permit conditions.

RECOMMENDED WORDING FOR PERMIT CONDITIONS

1. Public Notice and Notice of Intent to Issue

The standard FDER public notice should be used. This would not be a joint public notice since a federal permit will not be issued. The following paragraphs should be included in these two (2) documents:

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Florida Department of Environmental Regulation (FDER) have determined that there is no evidence of releases of hazardous wastes or constituents from solid waste management units (SWMUs) at this facility. Therefore, at this time, Section 3004(u) of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984 does not apply. The only provisions of HSWA which apply to the facility are the Section 3005(h) waste minimization certification and Section 3004(d) Land Disposal Restriction requirements, which have been incorporated into the proposed State permit. Since there are no other provisions of HSWA which affect this facility, the final State permit, if issued, will constitute the full RCRA permit required by FDER and EPA.

If new information becomes available indicating that Section 3004(u) of HSWA applies, the permit may be reopened.

2. The following paragraphs should be included on the permit cover page(s):

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Florida Department of Environmental Regulation (FDER) have determined that no additional solid waste management units exist at the facility and that no release of hazardous waste or constituents has occurred as described in Section 3004(u) of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984 (HSWA). The only provisions of HSWA which apply to the facility are the Section 3005(h) waste minimization certification and Section 3004(d) Land Disposal Restriction requirements, which have been incorporated into the State permit. Since there are no other provisions of HSWA which affect this facility, the final State permit constitutes the full RCRA permit required by FDER and EPA.

If new information becomes available indicating that Section 3004(u) of HSWA applies the permit may be reopened.

3. Permit Conditions

The report should included the following specific conditions:

- a. Waste Minimization - See Attachment.
- b. This permit may be reopened if additional information becomes available indicating that the provisions of Section 3004(u) of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984 apply to this facility. At that time, this permit may be modified to address the requirements of Section 3004(u) of HSWA if the State has been authorized for the provisions, or alternately, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) would issued a separate federal permit addressing Section 3004(u) requirements.
- c. Land Disposal Restrictions-See Attachment.

WASTE MINIMIZATION

A. Pursuant to 40 CFR §264.73(b)(9), and Section 3005(h) of RCRA, 42 U.S.C. 6925(h), the permittee must certify, no less often than annually, that :

1. The permittee has a program in place to reduce the volume and toxicity of hazardous waste to the degree determined by the permittee to be economically practicable; and
2. The proposed method of treatment, storage or disposal is the most practicable method available to the permittee which minimizes the present and future threat to human health and the environment.
3. The permittee shall also maintain copies of certification in the facility operating record as required by 40 CFR §264.73(b)(9).

B. The Waste Minimization program required under A.1 and A.2 above should as a minimum address the following topics:

1. Identify each hazardous waste stream with the source of generation.
2. Types and amounts of hazardous waste that are generated at the facility.
3. Present and proposed method of treatment, storage or disposal that is available to the permittee.
4. Description of techniques implemented in the past for hazardous waste reduction and their effectiveness.
5. An evaluation of technically and economically feasible hazardous waste reduction techniques.
6. A program and schedule for implementing the selected hazardous waste reduction technique.

LAND DISPOSAL RESTRICTIONS

A. General Restrictions

1. 40 CFR Part 268 identifies hazardous wastes that are restricted from land disposal and defines those limited circumstances under which an otherwise prohibited waste may continue to be placed on or in a land treatment, storage or disposal unit. The Prohibitions on storage of certain hazardous waste in tanks or containers is also addressed. The Permittee shall maintain compliance with the requirements of this Part. Where the Permittee has applied for an extension, waiver or variance under this Part the Permittee shall comply with all restrictions on land disposal under this Part once the effective date for the waste has been reached pending final approval of such application.
2. For the purposes of 40 CFR Part 268 "Land Disposal" means placement in or on the land and includes, but is not limited to, placement in a landfill, surface impoundment, waste pile, injection well, land treatment facility, salt dome formation, underground mine or cave, or concrete vault or bunker intended for disposal purposes.

B. Land Disposal Prohibitions and Treatment Standards

1. Prior to May 8, 1990, wastes which are otherwise prohibited from land disposal under 40 CFR Part \$268.33(f) may be disposed of in a landfill or surface impoundment which is in compliance with the requirements of 40 CFR \$268.5(h)(2) provided the requirements of 40 CFR Part \$268.8(a) are met.
2. A restricted waste identified in 40 CFR Part 268 Subpart C may not be placed in a land disposal unit without further treatment unless the requirements of 40 CFR Part 268 Subparts C and/or D are met.
3. The storage of hazardous wastes restricted from land disposal under 40 CFR Part 268 in tanks, containers or land units is prohibited unless the requirements of 40 CFR Part 268 Subpart E are met.

5. On page 25 of tab C in Volume 2, a statement ensuring that all emergency equipment has been tested to determine its effectiveness prior to resuming operations after an emergency incident is necessary.

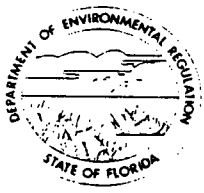

UNIVERSAL WASTE AND TRANSIT
PROCEDURE FOR HANDLING UNKNOWN WASTE

In the event that the constituents of a waste material have not or cannot be determined prior to being transported to the UW&T facility, the waste will temporarily be classified as an "unknown waste".

Every attempt will be made to gather information about the unknown waste. If the generator of the waste is known he/she will be questioned as to the contents and any relevant information which may help in identifying the waste. This information together with on site analytical parameters may be sufficient to identify the material. If identification is determined by UW&T the waste will then be handled in accordance with UW&T established procedures for known waste. If identification is not possible at the site and transportation of the waste to UW&T is necessary, the following procedure will be implemented.

Step 1

Where applicable, prior to the unknown waste being loaded onto an EPA licensed truck for transportation to Universal Waste & Transit certain on site parameters will be run. Universal Waste and Transit personnel will analyze the waste for color, density, physical state, pH, and any noticeable odor will be documented at this time. See attached Unknown Waste Characterization Form.

The data obtained from these physical parameters will determine whether the waste will be transported as a Hazardous Waste Liquid, or as a Hazardous Waste Solid. Once this determination is made the waste will be labeled as an unknown hazardous waste and transported to Universal Waste and Transit.

Step 2

Upon arrival at the facility the unknown waste will be segregated from the known waste by placing it in the North Bay, lab packing area. Ignitability, corrosivity and reactivity will be run as part of the UW&T in house quality control. One hundred percent (100%) of all unknowns entering UW&T will have these QC analyses performed within an appropriate time frame.. A less than 24 hour time frame is perceived for completion of the QC analyses.

Step 3

Upon completion of the QC analyses the waste will be classified as Flammable, Reactive, Acidic or Alkaline and moved to the corresponding bay within the facility. If the waste does not fall into any of the above mentioned of the above mentioned categories, further analytical parameters for identification will be determined on a case by case basis. Samples of the unknown waste along with the required chain of custody form (see attached) will be sent to a certified laboratory for analysis. All analytical information will be kept on a UW&T Unknown Waste Characterization Form, a copy which is attached.

Upon receipt of the outside analytical the waste will be classified and shipped off site for final disposal at a Universal Waste & Transit approved waste disposal site.



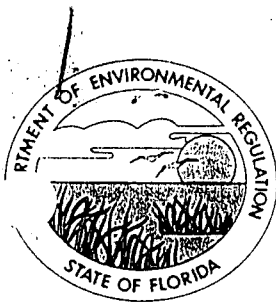

17-730.171 Transfer Facilities

(1) 40 CFR 263.12 as adopted by reference in rule 17-730.170, provides that transporters who store manifested hazardous waste in proper containers at a transfer facility for ten (10) days or less are exempt from regulation as a hazardous waste facility. If the waste is stored for more than ten (10) days, the facility is subject to the permitting requirements for a hazardous waste storage facility.

(2) A transfer facility used for storage of hazardous waste for more than 24 hours but ten (10) days or less shall comply with the following requirements as adopted by reference in Section 17-730.180:

(a) The transfer facility shall comply with the requirements of 40 CFR 265 Subparts B (general facility standards), C (preparedness and prevention), D (contingency and emergency plan), and I (management of containers), with the exception of 265.13. The 40 CFR 265 requirements referenced above shall apply to transfer facilities notwithstanding 40 CFR Part 265.1(c)(12).

(b) The transfer facility shall have a written closure plan to show that the facility will be closed in a manner which satisfies the requirements of the closure performance, notification, and decontamination standards of 40 CFR 265.111, 265.112(c), 265.114 and 265.115.

(c) Records required in this section shall be maintained in permanent form and shall be available for inspection by the department. If records are not kept at the transfer facility, they shall be made available at the transfer facility or other location approved by the department within five (5) working days of notice of an inspection.

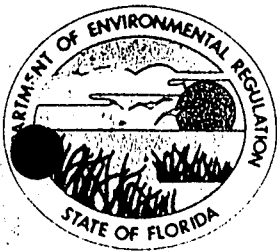
(d) Hazardous waste stored in containers or vehicles at transfer facilities shall be stored on a manmade surface which is capable of preventing spills or releases to the ground.

(3) The owner or operator of a transfer facility which stores manifested shipments of hazardous waste for more than 24 hours but ten (10) days or less shall notify the Department on Form 17-30.900(6). The owner or operator of a transfer facility that is in operation on the effective date of this rule, shall submit a notification form by July 1, 1986. The owner or operator of a new facility shall submit a notification form at least 30 days before the storage of hazardous waste is to begin.

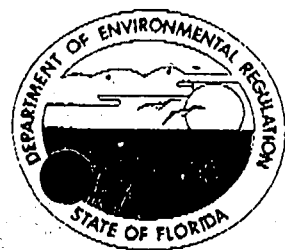

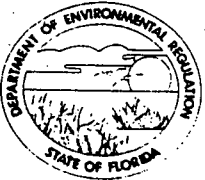

Cancellation of the insurance, whether by the Insurer or the Insured, and any other termination of the insurance (e.g., expiration, non-renewal), will be effective only upon written notice and only after the expiration of thirty-five (35) days after a copy of such written notice is received by the Secretary of the FDER as evidenced by certified mail return receipt. In addition, if your insurance agent should change, new forms must be completed and submitted to the department.


Dear Mrs. Milanian,

We are requesting that the above Hazardous Waste permit application be modified to include the acceptance of unknown wastes.

1. To receive and store said unknown waste, but not limited to emergency response situations.
2. Said waste may be generated or managed by various governmental agencies such as fire departments, US-EPA, Florida DER, etc.
3. A manifest will be filled out for each stream after field testing (finger printing).
4. Unknowns will be manifested then stored according to the findings in the finger print analysis, ie, waste corrosive liquids, etc.
5. Universal will not take title to any unknown waste until testing is complete.
6. Each material/waste will be finger printed prior to acceptance for corrosives, reactives, flammability, oxidizer, etc. At this point, proper labing will be completed.

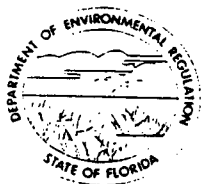

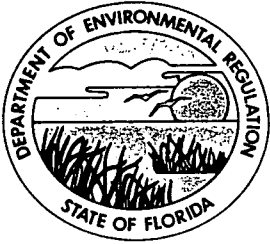
