Dear Ms. Milanian:

This letter is in response to the above mentioned letter. A copy is enclosed.

As we discussed yesterday, we have a concern with Issue b.. The specific condition as proposed appears to require a pre-acceptance approval form be completed for each hazardous waste received at the facility. The waste analysis plan section in our permit application does not specify that we have to complete a pre-acceptance approval form prior to picking up the waste. This appears to be a new requirement.

Safety-Kleen does have spent solvent pre-acceptance approval procedures that our service representatives follow when picking up waste from a customer. Our service representative specifies on our transportation document (also known as preprint) whether or not the waste meets Safety-Kleen's acceptance criteria. These preprints are kept at the facility as part of the operating record. A copy of these pre-acceptance criteria is enclosed with this letter.

We would not have any objections with the Department keeping the condition as written in the draft permit provided that we share a mutual understanding that the information on our preprint also serves as our pre-acceptance approval form.

If we do not receive a written response from you within 15 days from the date of this letter regarding this matter, we will assume that the Department is in agreement. Please do not hesitate to call me at (813)682-8094 if you have any questions or other concerns.

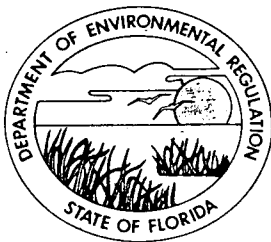

Dear Mr. San Agustin:

The Florida Department of Environmental Regulation (FDER) has carefully examined your requested modifications to the above referenced draft permit. The following comments have been prepared which reflect the changes the FDER can accept to address your concerns. Each item is in the order noted on your letter of October 15, 1992.

Issue a. Expiration date of December 31, 1993 will be incorporated into the final permit.

Issue b. Specific Condition Part I. 5. will remain as proposed by FDER but will have the additional sentence, "The permittee shall ensure that hazardous wastes identified in the Waste Analysis Plan of Part II A - Attachment II.A.6 of the application categorized as "closed loop recycling wastes" (specifically referring to mineral spirits and immersion cleaner supplied to clients), meet the waste acceptance criteria as detailed in the waste analysis plan referenced above."


Issue c. Testing of tank integrity based on a hydrostatic test or a pneumatic test is acceptable to FDER.

Issue d. Minimum wall thicknesses specified will be utilized in the final permit.

Issue e. Actual working volume of 14,250 gallons will be identified on page 1 of the permit.

Please provide any comments you may have within ten days of your receipt of this notice, as the FDER plans to take final agency action in a timely matter. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact me at (813) 744-6100 extension 372.

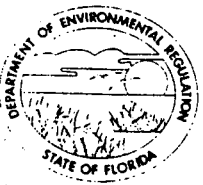

Dear Ms. Milanian:

The purpose of this letter is to provide comments on the proposed draft construction permit for your consideration. We acknowledge receipt of the draft permit on September 3, 1992. Our comments are listed as follows:

- a. The draft permit does not specify an expiration date. We request a December 31, 1993 expiration date. This will provide us enough time to have the tank installed, tested, and to submit all information necessary to obtain approval from SW-FDER to store waste in the tank. This will also allow us to submit a major permit modification request at least 135 days prior to the expiration date of this permit.

Both do you have any concerns about this? Lynne.

- b. Specific Condition I.5. requires that each hazardous waste received at the facility be analyzed to determine whether it matches the identity of the waste specified on the accompanying manifest and pre-acceptance approval form.

We request that the condition be reworded to read, "The permittee shall receive only those wastes that meet the waste acceptance criteria in the Waste Analysis Plan section of the permit application."

Some of the wastes received by Safety-Kleen are "closed loop recycling wastes". This means that Safety-Kleen only picks up only those solvents which were originally provided in its clean state by Safety-Kleen. These wastes do not have to be analyzed each pick up because our data shows the waste characteristics of closed loop recycling wastes are consistent from one service to another. Completing a preacceptance approval form is not part of

our waste analysis plan for these types of wastes. We would prefer not to perform any pre-acceptance procedures which are not called for in our waste analysis plan.

- c. Specific Condition II.3.f. requires that the new tank be tested for tightness using a liquid with a specific gravity comparable to the liquid to be stored in the tank.

The material that will be stored is antifreeze which has a specific gravity comparably similar to water. We request that the Department allow us to use either water for the tightness test or use a pneumatic test. The latter two tests have been performed in other Florida facilities and have been approved by the Department. Using some other liquid to test for tightness may result in a disposal problem on the liquid used after testing. Arrangements will have to be made to transport the liquid to and from the site if some other liquid is recommended. We suggest the following wording change:

"f. Testing of the new hazardous waste tank using a hydrostatic test, or a pneumatic test, or some other Department approved test procedure to determine the integrity of the tank and submission of the results with the tank certification."

- d. Page 1 of the draft permit and Specific Condition III.13. specifies some tank thickness values which we would like to clarify. The original nominal tank thicknesses that the tank will have when it is delivered to the site are as follows:

The tank's maximum wall thinning is expected to be 25% of the original nominal tank thicknesses. To determine minimum wall thickness, this latter value is subtracted from the above thickness values. The minimum tank thicknesses should therefore be the values listed below. Please use these values if the department wishes to specify wall thinning limits and minimum wall thicknesses in the permit.

- e. Page 1 of the permit states that the tank will have a

capacity of 15,000 gallons. Please note in the final permit that the tank will have a nominal capacity of 15,000 gal. Although we plan to construct a 15,000 gallon tank, the maximum volume of the tank may not be exactly 15,000 gallons to the nearest gallon. The actual capacity will be determined after construction of the tank and this information will be provided to you. Regardless of the actual maximum capacity, we agree to a maximum working volume limit of 14,250 gallons.

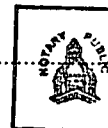

THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATION (FDER) GIVES NOTICE OF ITS INTENT TO ISSUE A PERMIT UNDER THE RESOURCE CONSERVATION AND RECOVERY ACT (RCRA), AS AMENDED BY THE HAZARDOUS AND SOLID WASTE AMENDMENTS OF 1984 (HSWA), SECTION 403.722, FLORIDA STATUTES (FS), AND CHAPTERS 17-4 AND 17-730 OF THE FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE (FAC) TO Safety Klean Corporation for the construction of a hazardous waste storage tank at the existing hazardous waste tank and container storage facility located at 5309 24th Avenue and 54th Street, Tampa, Hillsborough County, Florida, having assigned facility I.D. number FLD 980 847 271. The permit, if issued, will be the State permit which covers the RCRA program that was in effect prior to the passage of the HSWA. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Florida Department of Environmental Regulation (FDER) have determined that there are no additional evidences of releases of hazardous waste or constituents from solid waste management units (SWMUs) at this facility that have not already been identified. Therefore, at this time, Section 3004(u) of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984 does not apply. The only provisions of HSWA which apply to the facility are the Section 3005(h) waste minimization certification and Section 3004(d) Land Disposal Restriction requirements, which have been incorporated into the existing State operating permit. If new information becomes available indicating that Section 3004(u) of HSWA applies, the HSWA permit may be re-primed.

The State of Florida has been granted authorization for those portions of the RCRA Hazardous Waste Program that were in effect prior to the passage of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984. The Federal Environmental Protection Agency will administer the applicable portions of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984 until the State receives authorization for these provisions.

A draft permit, prepared in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 17-730 FAC, contains the conditions for the construction of a hazardous waste storage tank. The proposed storage tank will have a 15,000 gallon capacity. Adequate secondary containment will be provided to satisfy RCRA requirements.

The hazardous waste to be stored in the new tank is spent ethylene glycol and is designated by the following EPA Waste Code Numbers: D004 thru D011, D018, D019, D021 thru D030 and D032 thru D043.

The application and a copy of the proposed permit are available for public inspection during normal business hours, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except legal holidays, at either:

Any interested person may submit written comments on this proposed State agency action to the address shown above, within forty-five (45) days of publication of this notice. All comments on the facility will be considered by the Department in formulating a decision on issuing this permit.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) in accordance with Section 120.57, FS, and Chapters 17-103, and 28-5, FAC. Petitions must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400, within forty-five (45) days of publication of this notice. Petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the time of filing. Failure to file a request for hearing within this time frame shall constitute a waiver or any right such person may have to request a hearing under Section 120.57, FS, or a meeting under Section 403.722(10), FS.

A petition for formal or informal administrative hearing pursuant to Section 120.57, FS, shall contain the following information: (a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner. If the petitioner challenges a Department action or proposed action on a permit application, the application's name and address, the Department Permit File Number and the county in which the project is proposed, shall also be included; (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Department's action or proposed action; (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Department's action or proposed action; (d) A statement of those material facts (i.e., those facts upon which the Department's action or proposal is based) disputed by petitioner. If no facts are disputed, petitioner shall so state; (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (f) A statement of which

rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Department's action or proposed action.

If a petition on the Department's permit is filed, the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate agency action. Accordingly, the Department's final action may be different from the proposed agency action. Persons whose substantial interests have been affected by any decision of the Department have the right to intervene in the proceeding. A petition for intervention must be filed pursuant to Section 28-5.207, FAC, at least five (5) days before the final hearing. Failure to petition to intervene

within the allowed time frame constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to request a hearing under Section 120.57, FS.

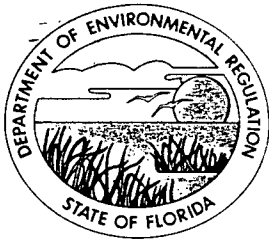

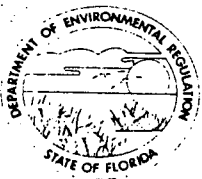

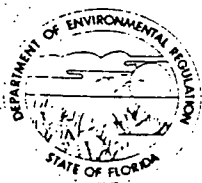

Please note that the inspection schedule referred to on page II.C-3 applies to the used ethylene glycol tank only. For tanks containing mineral spirits, the corresponding systems are checked every day.

The inspection forms (Figure II.C.11-3) are used as follows:

During tank inspection, if problems are not encountered, then the "A" (acceptable) is circled and only the date of the inspection is noted in the "observations" section at the bottom of the form. If an "N" (not acceptable) is circled, then the "observations" section includes the date, the nature of the deficiency, and the name of the tank involved. It is intended to use this same form for the monthly used ethylene glycol tank inspection, noting under "observations" that the monthly inspection was conducted (along with the daily inspection), the date, and appropriate comments concerning deficiencies noted.

Information is not transferred from these forms to the daily operating logs. Instead, facility personnel file the forms along with the daily operating log and, the forms become part of the operating record.

Figure II. C. 11-3 details "inspection of the storage tank system". The first four items on the check list separate product tanks from waste tanks and the only distinction between the waste tanks is waste tank verses second waste tank. Describe the manner in which tank deficiencies will be reported on this log and how, for the remaining items on the log, distinctions will be made to accurately note each item per each tank. In order to clarify each item per each tank either separate check lists must be made to represent each waste tank or provisions made with the existing check sheet to demonstrate that the particular item was noted for each waste tank.

Additionally, monthly inspections are mentioned for each waste tank to ensure operation of the high level alarm, verification of level gauges and check valve operation. Will these monthly inspection results be recorded on an inspection log and then transferred to the operating log? The FDER requests a copy of the monthly inspection form and a photo copy of the most current operating log verifying these activities for the waste mineral spirit tank.

The FDER does anticipate preparing the forthcoming construction permit to include provisions authorizing Safety Kleen to operate the ethylene glycol tank upon certification of completion of construction during the interim stages of processing either a major operating permit modification or a new operating permit application.
