I hope all is well.

I am sure you are aware of Hurricane Harvey that reached CAT 3 yesterday.

The hurricane is going to make landfall on the gulf coast of Texas.

FCI has van loads manifested to Veolia Port Arthur TX currently on the 10 day.

The loads are dated 8/17/17, 8/23/17,8/24/17 and 8/25/17.

All four loads were scheduled to leave bartow 10-day with in the 10 day limit.

FCI had delivery appointments for Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday of next week.

However, Hurricane Harvey is forecasted to be a major rain event for the Port Arthur TX Area. Port Arthur could see 20-30 inches of rain this weekend and have major flooding preventing Veolia from operating next week. FCI has already learned that Veolia has diverted their phone system from port arthur tx to college park ga for Monday, so I am assuming they will be closed Monday.

FCI is asking for relief of the 10 day storage requirement so that we can have the loads stored in our 10 day containment pad and not in route to Port Arthur tx in the event Port Arthur is closed due to flooding.

FCI will learn the extent of the damage Monday for the Port Arthur tx area, and will work on a new schedule for these loads. Currently only 1 will be out of compliance as of Monday 8/28/17.

PROCLAMATION

BY THE

Governor of the State of Texas

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, GREG ABBOTT, Governor of the State of Texas, do hereby certify that Tropical Depression Harvey poses a threat of imminent disaster, including severe flooding, storm surge and damaging winds, in the counties of Aransas, Austin, Bee, Calhoun, Chambers, Colorado, Brazoria, DeWitt, Fayette, Fort Bend, Galveston, Goliad, Gonzales, Harris, Jackson, Jefferson, Jim Wells, Karnes, Kleberg, Lavaca, Liberty, Live Oak, Matagorda, Nueces, Refugio, San Patricio, Victoria, Waller, Wharton, and Wilson, beginning August 23, 2017.

THEREFORE, in accordance with the authority vested in me by Section 418.014 of the Texas Government Code, I do hereby declare a state of disaster in the previously listed counties based on the existence of such threat.

Pursuant to Section 418.017 of the code, I authorize the use of all available resources of state government and of political subdivisions that are reasonably necessary to cope with this disaster.

Pursuant to Section 418.016 of the code, any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state business or any order or rule of a state agency that would in any way prevent, hinder or delay necessary action in coping with this disaster shall be suspended upon written approval of the Office of the Governor. However, to the extent that the enforcement of any state statute or administrative rule regarding contracting or procurement would impede any state agency's emergency response that is necessary to protect life or property threatened by this declared disaster, I hereby authorize the suspension of such statutes and rules for the duration of this declared disaster.

In accordance with the statutory requirements, copies of this proclamation shall be filed with the applicable authorities.
