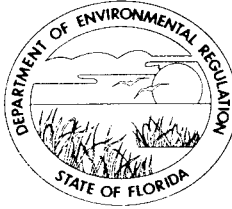

We acknowledge receipt of your response to our first notice of deficiencies as submitted on August 4, 1986, and additional information received on August 12, 1986. However, we have reviewed your application and found it incomplete due to the lack of some information, and because amendments are required in some parts of the application. The required information and amendments necessary to complete your application are itemized in attached sheets.

When a permit application is incomplete, all processing of the application is suspended. Pursuant to Section 120.60, Florida Statutes, the Department may deny a permit application if the applicant, after receiving timely notice, fails to correct errors, omissions, or supply additional information within a reasonable period of time.

We expect to receive your submittal addressing the information requested in this notice within fifteen days from this date.

Part I - General

A. General Information

1. Items 5 and 20 of application form show incorrect EPA I.D. numbers. Also, boxes in item #2 were not filled out. Resubmit both pages.

B. Site Information

1. Submit a 1":2000' scale map containing map scale, orientation, date and drinking water wells within 1/4 mile.

D. Operation Information

1. Submit a drawing locating the wet dumpsters.
2. To comply with 40 CFR 270.14(a), drawings shall be certified by a registered engineer.

Part III - Tanks

1. In view of the attached Conversation Record sheet, submit a testing procedure for tanks. Inspection logs to record results should also be provided.
