Re: Request for Modification of Hazardous Waste Operating Permit Safety-Kleen/Boynton Beach, HO 50-195905 (Submitted on June 11, 1993)

Dear Mr. San Agustin:

The Department has reviewed your request for modification, as referenced. The additional information you provided in your August 2, 1993 correspondence has also been considered. Based upon the information provided the Department is approving the following Class I, minor modifications:

- * Safety-Kleen may store both virgin and spent Actrel parts cleaning solvent at the Boynton Beach service center. Actrel is similar to parts cleaning solvents currently marketed by the facility. Virgin Actrel has a flashpoint of 212°F and consists primarily of paraffin compounds with C12-C14 chains. The spent Actrel solvent will be managed as a hazardous waste until determined non-hazardous (40 CFR 262.11).
- * Safety-Kleen may store spent Actrel filters. The filters will be transported from the generators' facilities to the Boynton Beach service center in accordance with the applicable Department of Transportation regulations on hazardous materials under 49 CFR parts 173, 178, and 179. Upon arriving at the service center the spent Actrel filters will be placed in the dumpster sediment, satellite accumulation container(s). The containers must subsequently be handled as hazardous wastes and stored in the Container Storage Area in accordance with the plan approved in Part IIB, Attachment II.B.1 of the application (Date of Issue: August 26, 1991).
- * Safety-Kleen may re-designate the use of the virgin perchloroethylene tank (5,000 gallon capacity). The virgin product storage tank is located within the Resource, Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) regulated secondary containment area. The facility is permitted to store the following compatible, virgin products in the storage tank:
 - 1. Actrel parts cleaning solvent;
 - 2. Premium Solvent parts cleaning solvent;
 - Parts Cleaner 105 parts cleaning solvent;
 - 4. Perchloroethylene as previously permitted.

The Department has been furnished with information on the four virgin products demonstrating their similar characteristics and compatiblity with the secondary containment area's floor and wall sealant. They are also compatible with the other materials stored within the RCRA regulated secondary containment area.

Page 2 of 3 * The Safety-Kleen Corporation, International Headquarters, address has changed to the following: 1000 North Randall Road Eglin, Illinois 60123-7857 This letter must be attached to the original permit and become part of the permit. A person whose substantial interests are affected by this modification may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) in accordance with Section 120.57, Florida Statutes. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400, within 14 days of receipt of this Modification. Petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing. Failure to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any right such person may have to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Section 120.57, Florida Statutes. The Petition shall contain the following information:
 (a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner, the applicant's name and address, the Department Permit File Number and the county in which the project is proposed;
 (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Department's action or proposed action;
 (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Department's action or proposed action;
 (d) A statement of the material facts disputed by Petitioner, if any;
 (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action;
 (f) A statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; and
 (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Department's action or proposed action.

If a petition is filed, the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate agency action. Accordingly, the Department's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this modification. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any decision of the Department with regard to the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding. The petition must conform to the requirements specified above and be filed (received) within 14 days of receipt of this notice in the Office of General Counsel at the above address of the Department. Failure to petition within the allowed time frame constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to request a hearing under Section 120.57, F.S., and to participate as a party to this proceeding. Any subsequent intervention will only be at the approval of the presiding officer upon motion filed pursuant to Rule 28-5.207, F.A.C.

This modification is final and effective on the date filed with the Clerk of the Department unless a petition is filed in accordance with the above paragraphs or unless a request for extension of time in which to file a petition is filed within the time specified for filing a petition and conforms to Rule 17-103.070, F.A.C. Upon timely filing of a petition or a request for an extension of time this modification will not be effective until further Order of the Department.

When the Order (Modification) is final, any party to the Order has the right to seek judicial review of the Order pursuant to Section 120.68, Florida Statutes, by the filing of a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate procedure, with the Clerk of the Department in the Office of General Counsel, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400; and by filing a copy of the Notice of Appeal accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date the Final Order is filed with the Clerk of the Department.
