As we discussed recently, Port Tampa Bay is planning on moving forward with the adoption of the water goat Keep Tampa Bay Beautiful installed at McKay Bay Nature Park/Trail. This is a highly effective trash and debris removal device invented by a local man. Regular maintenance of the device will result in the removal of literally thousands of pounds of trash and debris that would otherwise be floating into McKay Bay, Tampa Bay, and the Gulf of Mexico.

We welcome your partnership in this adoption and your commitment to maintain the water goat for at least a three year period. As described below, the water goat will need regular maintenance, especially during the rainy season. I will follow up with you on a formal agreement/work order and more specific requirements as we move forward with the adoption.

Hi Chris,

It was nice speaking with you today about the Watergoat that KTBB installed at McKay Bay Nature Park. As I mentioned, we wanted to give Port first dibs at “adopting” the device. I have attached a picture for your reference as well as their website <https://www.tampabayrescue.org/watergoat-1.html> that has more information about the technology.

During the first trash collection – June 15th, the Watergoat collected 315 lbs of litter and debris! I should have the total weight for last week’s collection sometime today.

As an Adoptee, during the rainy season, collection is needed bi-weekly however during the dry season only once a month is necessary. We will include a sign with an educational component next to the device for the public to see how trash travels and how our behavior impacts the environment. We will also include the Port’s partnership (logo) on the signage to highlight its commitment to the community.
