Introduction:

On May 14, 2020, John White, Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP, Department), inspected FECC, Inc. for compliance with state and federal hazardous waste regulations. FECC, Inc., located at 3652 Old Winter Garden Road, Orlando, Florida, is a registered hazardous waste and used oil transporter and a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste. FECC began operations at this location in July 2008.

The facility last registered with the Department as a transporter of hazardous waste and used oil on February 20, 2019. The notification included the company's activity as a very small quantity generator of hazardous waste and a small quantity handler of mercury containing lamps and devices.

FECC, Inc. was last inspected on July 6, 2017 and no violations were cited at that time.

Process Description:

Services offered by FECC include, but are not limited to, soil and groundwater remediation, hazardous and non-hazardous waste disposal, storage tank installation and removal and oil water separator cleaning. Wastes generated by some of these operations require the facility to be registered in Florida as a hazardous waste transporter. During the normal course of operations, hazardous waste is transported directly from the job site to either a permitted treatment, storage, or disposal facility or to a 10-day hazardous waste transfer facility. Hazardous waste generated off-site is not typically stored at this location. Non-hazardous solid waste may be temporarily stored at the facility. The facility is comprised of an office area, a maintenance garage, and a warehouse. The facility also has parking areas for equipment and vehicles.

Upon arriving at the facility it was noted the signage had been removed and the building was being painted.

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Personnel on the property indicated they were painting the buildings for the property owner and that the property was vacant. The buildings were not inspected because no representative of the property owner was on site. However, open maintenance bays visible from the parking area appeared to be empty.

Upon returning to the office, telephone calls were made to two separate telephone numbers provided for the facility. Both numbers were out of service.

Conclusion:

FECC, Inc. appears to be closed at this location. No violations were cited as a result of this inspection.
