Dear Mr. Mulholland:

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) has reviewed your request for a regulatory determination regarding the use of Mobile Solvent Recovery Units.

The Department would like to prevent any misunderstanding regarding the difference between the exemption in 40 CFR 261.6 for recyclable material and the exemption in 40 CFR 264.1(g)(2) for the owner or operator of a facility managing recyclable material. At this time a recycling unit is exempt from permitting regulations under 40 CFR 264.1(g)(2). However, the generator of the recyclable material, and a transporter of the material before recycling, are both subject to the applicable requirement of RCRA section 3010. See 40 CFR 261.6(b).

Assuming that US Liquids plans to recycle without storing the recyclable material, 40 CFR 261.6(c)(2) would apply. This section requires notification; use of the manifest and manifest discrepancy reports; and compliance with 40 CFR Part 264 (or 265) Subparts AA and BB regarding air emission standards for process vents and equipment leaks respectively. The Department would express to see a Subpart AA/BB compliance plan.

More information about your service, equipment, and procedures would greatly assist us determining how, or if, RCRA regulations apply to your recycling proposal. Specifically, we would like to know more about the sites you service, the amount of solvents intended for recycling, the frequency of still bottoms generation, and how still bottoms are handled. We would also like information regarding secondary containment and other spill control procedures and your methods of documentation.
