RE: TIRE SHREDS AT SOUTHERN BOUNDARY OF PROPERTY

Dear Ms. Hedgepeth,

I am writing to confirm our conversation of Friday, April 1, 1994 with regard to clearing the shredded and/or whole tire material from an area located within 50' of the southern boundary of FLORIDA TIRE RECYCLING, INC's property. It is my understanding that FTR will without further enforcement action being taken by the FDEP perform the following in this area:

1. Within 30 days FTR shall remove all shredded and/or whole tire material from: (a) the swale currently filled with water and lying adjacent to the partially completed road at the southern border of the property; (b) the partially completed road located at the southern perimeter of the property; (c) an area contiguous to the northern lip of the swale described in section 1 (a) and measuring 50' commencing at the property line boundary and running north from this point such that a 50' clear area will exist along the entire southern property line.

2. Use appropriate turbidity screening during the period in which work in the area occurs.

3. At all times maintain the integrity of the "earthen plug" which remains between FTR's property and the Range Line Road swale.

Providing An Environmental Solution

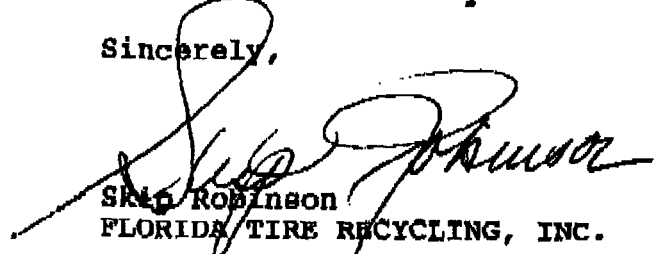
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Further, it is my understanding that if this clearing of shredded and/or whole tire material as described above is completed on or before April 30, 1994, the Department will waive its request for water quality samples pursuant to FTR's application for a WETLAND RESOURCE PERMIT (file #562453458).

If my understanding of our agreement is incorrect, please notify me in writing at once. As I explained on Friday, we will commence this work immediately.
