

The purpose of this letter is to complete the resolution of the matter previously identified by the Department in the Warning Letter dated August 15, 2008, a copy of which is attached. The corrective actions required to bring Sumter County's (the County's) Materials Recovery Facility (facility) into compliance have been performed. In order to resolve the matter identified in the attached Warning Letter, the Department has calculated civil penalties in the amount of \$3,000.00, along with \$500.00 to reimburse the Department costs, for a total of \$3,500.00.

The Department has determined that the entire civil penalty of \$3,000.00 may be offset through the implementation of the In-Kind Project that is described in the County's submittals dated February 17, 2009 (received February 19, 2009) and April 22, 2009 (received April 24, 2009), together attached as Exhibit I. The County shall pay the Department's costs of \$500.00 within 30 days of signing this letter. The payment must be made payable to the Department of Environmental Protection by cashier's check or money order and shall include the OGC File Number assigned above and the notation "Ecosystems Management and Restoration Trust Fund." Payment shall be sent to the Department of Environmental Protection, Attention: Sandra Wilson, 13051 N. Telecom Parkway, Temple Terrace, FL 33637.

As provided in the previous paragraph, the Department is giving the County the option to offset the civil penalty with an In-kind Project. This option requires that the County strictly comply with the requirements and deadlines for implementing, completing, and submitting a notification of In-kind Project completion to the Department. Upon signing this letter, the County shall implement the approved In-kind Project in accordance with the requirements of Exhibit I hereto. The In-kind Project must be completed no later than September 30, 2009. The County shall notify the Department by telephone or in writing when the in-kind projects starts. The County's failure to timely complete the approved In-kind Project or timely provide the Department with the notification of In-kind Project completion will cause the In-kind Project option to be forfeited and the balance of the civil penalty, \$3,000.00, shall be due within 10 days of notice from the Department.

The County's signing this letter constitutes its acceptance of the Department's offer to resolve this matter on these terms. If the County elects to sign this letter, please return it to the Department at the address indicated above. The Department will then countersign the letter and file it with the Clerk of the

Persons who are not parties to this Consent Order but whose substantial interests are affected by this Consent Order have a right, pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes, to petition for an administrative hearing on it. The Petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) at the Department's Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS-35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, within 21 days of receipt of this notice. A copy of the Petition must also be mailed at the time of filing to the District Office named above at the address indicated. Failure to file a petition within the 21 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information:

(a) The Department's Consent Order identification number and the county in which the subject matter or activity is located; (b) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner; the name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; (c) An explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the Consent Order; (d) A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the Consent Order; (e) A statement of all material facts disputed by petitioner, if any; (f) A statement of the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Consent Order; (g) A statement of which rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Consent Order; and (h) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wishes the Department to take with respect to the Consent Order.

Dear Mr. Arnold:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of possible violations of law for which you may be responsible and to seek your cooperation in resolving the matter. A Department inspection conducted at the Sumter County Materials Recovery Facility on June 26, 2008 indicates that violations of Florida Statutes and Rules may exist:

i) Department staff observed a significant quantity of leachate pended on the floor of the MRF building. This leachate appeared to have overflowed from the two floor drains in the building. Facility staff indicated that they allow leachate to fill the collection tank in order to accommodate the volume of the vacuum truck employed to haul this leachate off-site. Once the tank was full to capacity, the automatic float system for the leachate sump pump had been disabled, by county staff, to avoid overfilling the tank. This resulted in leachate accumulating in the collection piping and ultimately overflowing the floor drains. Facility staff indicated that a rainfall event had also contributed to the leachate overflow on the MRF building floor. These conditions indicate a fallure to operate the leachate collection system as it was designed and permitted to function. These conditions are contrary to Rule 62-701.710(3)(b) and (4)(b), Florida Administrative Code, and Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO.

Rule 62-4.160(1). Florida Administrative Code ("F.A.C.") states: "The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations, and restrictions set forth in this permit, are 'permit conditions' and are bluding and enforceable pursuant to Section 403.141, 403.727, or 403.859, F.S." Rule 62-4.160(2). F.A.C. states, "This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from

the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department."

Rule 62-701,710(3)(b). F.A.C. states, "the facility shall be designed with a leachate control system to...minimize the presence of standing water." Rule 62-701,719(4)(b). F.A.C. states, "Areas where waste is stored or processed shall be cleaned at least weekly to prevent odor or vector problems..." and "...all drains and leachate conveyances shall be kept clean so that leachate flow is not impeded." Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO states, "Floors shall be free of standing liquids."

The deficiencies noted above and any other activities at your facility that may be contributing to violations of the above rules should be ceased. The operation of a facility in violation of state statutes or rules may result in liability for damages and restoration, and the judicial imposition of civil penalties up to \$10,000 per violation per day pursuant to Sections 403.141 and 403.161, Florida Statutes. It is typically Department policy to initiate enforcement action and seek civil penalties of \$3,000 for conditions such as those described above.

PLEASE BH ADVISED that this Warning Letter is part of an agency investigation, preliminary to agency action in accordance with Section 120.57(4), Florida Statutes. You are requested to contact Ms. Nancy Gaskin of this office at telephone number (813) 632-7600, extension 375, within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss this matter. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyone with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter. We look forward to your cooperation in completing the investigation and resolution of this matter.

After the project is completed, no signs will be erected by the County indicating the reason for the project was anything other than a FDEP enforcement action.
- 4) Within 15 days of completing the in-kind project, the County will notify FDEP, by certified mail, of the project completion and request a verification letter from FDEP. The County will submit supporting information verifying that the project was completed in accordance with the approved proposal and documentation showing the actual cost incurred to complete the project. These costs will not include those incurred in developing the proposal or obtaining approval from FDEP for the project.



Persons who are not parties to this Consent Order but whose substantial interests are affected by this Consent Order have a right, pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes, to petition for an administrative hearing on it. The Petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) at the Department's Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS-35, Tallahassee, 'Florida 32399-3000, within 21 days of receipt of this notice. A copy of the Petition must also be mailed at the time of filing to the District Office named above at the address indicated. Failure to file a petition within the 21 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information:

(a) The Department's Consent Order identification number and the county in which the subject matter or activity is located; (b) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner; the name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; (c) An explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the Consent Order; (d) A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the Consent Order; (e) A statement of all material facts disputed by petitioner, if any; (f) A statement of the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Consent Order; (g) A statement of which rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Consent Order; and (h) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wishes the Department to take with respect to the Consent Order.

Dear Mr. Arnold:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of possible violations of law for which you may be responsible and to seek your cooperation in resolving the matter. A Department inspection conducted at the Sumter County Materials Recovery Facility on June 26, 2008 indicates that violations of Florida Statutes and Rules may exist:

1) Department staff observed a significant quantity of leachate ponded on the floor of the MRF building. This leachate appeared to have overflowed from the two floor drains in the building. Facility staff indicated that they allow leachate to fill the collection tank in order to accommodate the volume of the vacuum truck employed to haul this leachate off-site. Once the tank was full to capacity, the automatic float system for the leachate sump pump had been disabled, by county staff, to avoid overfilling the tank. This resulted in leachate accumulating in the collection piping and ultimately overflowing the floor drains. Facility staff indicated that a rainfall event had also contributed to the leachate overflow on the MRF building floor. These conditions indicate a failure to operate the leachate collection system as it was designed and permitted to function. These conditions are contrary to Rule 62-701.710(3)(b) and (4)(b), Florida Administrative Code, and Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO.

Rule 62-4.160(1), Florida Administrative Code ("F.A.C.") states: "The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations, and restrictions set forth in this permit, are 'permit conditions' and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Section 403.141, 403.727, or 403.859, F.S." Rule 62-4.160(2), F.A.C. states, "This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from

the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department."

Rule 62-701.710(3)(b), F.A.C. states, "the facility shall be designed with a leachate control system to...minimize the presence of standing water." Rule 62-701.710(4)(b), F.A.C. states, "Areas where waste is stored or processed shall be cleaned at least weekly to prevent odor or vector problems..." and "...all drains and leachate conveyances shall be kept clean so that leachate flow is not impeded." Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO states, "Floors shall be free of standing liquids."

The deficiencies noted above and any other activities at your facility that may be contributing to violations of the above rules should be ceased. The operation of a facility in violation of state statutes or rules may result in liability for damages and restoration, and the judicial imposition of civil penalties up to \$10,000 per violation per day pursuant to Sections 403.141 and 403.161, Florida Statutes. It is typically Department policy to initiate enforcement action and seek civil penalties of \$3,000 for conditions such as those described above.

PLEASE BE ADVISED that this Warning Letter is part of an agency investigation, preliminary to agency action in accordance with Section 120.57(4), Florida Statutes. You are requested to contact Ms. Nancy Gaskin of this office at telephone number (813) 632-7600, extension 375, within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss this matter. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyone with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter. We look forward to your cooperation in completing the investigation and resolution of this matter.





The purpose of this letter is to complete the resolution of the matter previously identified by the Department in the Warning Letter dated August 15, 2008, a copy of which is attached. The corrective actions required to bring Sumter County's (the County's) Materials Recovery Facility (facility) into compliance have been performed. In order to resolve the matter identified in the attached Warning Letter, the Department has calculated civil penalties in the amount of \$3,000.00, along with \$500.00 to reimburse the Department costs, for a total of \$3,500.00.

The Department has determined that the entire civil penalty of \$3,000.00 may be offset through the implementation of the In-Kind Project that is described in the County's submittals dated February 17, 2009 (received February 19, 2009) and April 22, 2009 (received April 24, 2009), together attached as Exhibit I. The County shall pay the Department's costs of \$500.00 within 30 days of signing this letter. The payment must be made payable to the Department of Environmental Protection by cashier's check or money order and shall include the OGC File Number assigned above and the notation "Ecosystems Management and Restoration Trust Fund." Payment shall be sent to the Department of Environmental Protection, Attention: Sandra Wilson, 13051 N. Telecom Parkway, Temple Terrace, FL 33637.

As provided in the previous paragraph, the Department is giving the County the option to offset the civil penalty with an In-kind Project. This option requires that the County strictly comply with the requirements and deadlines for implementing, completing, and submitting a notification of In-kind Project completion to the Department. Upon signing this letter, the County shall implement the approved In-kind Project in accordance with the requirements of Exhibit I hereto. The In-kind Project must be completed no later than September 30, 2009. The County shall notify the Department by telephone or in writing when the in-kind projects starts. The County's failure to timely complete the approved In-kind Project or timely provide the Department with the notification of In-kind Project completion will cause the In-kind Project option to be forfeited and the balance of the civil penalty, \$3,000.00, shall be due within 10 days of notice from the Department.

Persons who are not parties to this Consent Order but whose substantial interests are affected by this Consent Order have a right, pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes, to petition for an administrative hearing on it. The Petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) at the Department's Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS-35, Tallahassee, 'Florida 32399-3000, within 21 days of receipt of this notice. A copy of the Petition must also be mailed at the time of filing to the District Office named above at the address indicated. Failure to file a petition within the 21 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information:

Dear Mr. Arnold:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of possible violations of law for which you may be responsible and to seek your cooperation in resolving the matter. A Department inspection conducted at the Sumter County Materials Recovery Facility on June 26, 2008 indicates that violations of Florida Statutes and Rules may exist:

1) Department staff observed a significant quantity of leachate ponded on the floor of the MRF building. This leachate appeared to have overflowed from the two floor drains in the building. Facility staff indicated that they allow leachate to fill the collection tank in order to accommodate the volume of the vacuum truck employed to haul this leachate off-site. Once the tank was full to capacity, the automatic float system for the leachate sump pump had been disabled, by county staff, to avoid overfilling the tank. This resulted in leachate accumulating in the collection piping and ultimately overflowing the floor drains. Facility staff indicated that a rainfall event had also contributed to the leachate overflow on the MRF building floor. These conditions indicate a failure to operate the leachate collection system as it was designed and permitted to function. These conditions are contrary to Rule 62-701.710(3)(b) and (4)(b), Florida Administrative Code, and Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO.

Rule 62-4.160(1). Florida Administrative Code ("F.A.C.") states: "The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations, and restrictions set forth in this permit, are 'permit conditions' and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Section 403.141, 403.727, or 403.859, F.S." Rule 62-4.160(2), F.A.C. states, "This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from

More Protocum Less Process and Aco Mate. Pas the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department."

Rule 62-701.710(3)(b), F.A.C. states, "the facility shall be designed with a leachate control system to...minimize the presence of standing water." Rule 62-701.710(4)(b), F.A.C. states, "Areas where waste is stored or processed shall be cleaned at least weekly to prevent odor or vector problems..." and "...all drains and leachate conveyances shall be kept clean so that leachate flow is not impeded." Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO states, "Floors shall be free of standing liquids."

The deficiencies noted above and any other activities at your facility that may be contributing to violations of the above rules should be ceased. The operation of a facility in violation of state statutes or rules may result in liability for damages and restoration, and the judicial imposition of civil penalties up to \$10,000 per violation per day pursuant to Sections 403.141 and 403.161, Florida Statutes. It is typically Department policy to initiate enforcement action and seek civil penalties of \$3,000 for conditions such as those described above.

PLEASE BE ADVISED that this Warning Letter is part of an agency investigation, preliminary to agency action in accordance with Section 120.57(4), Florida Statutes. You are requested to contact Ms. Nancy Gaskin of this office at telephone number (813) 632-7600, extension 375, within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss this matter. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyone with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter. We look forward to your cooperation in completing the investigation and resolution of this matter.

The Department received Sumter County's (the County's) submittal, dated February 17, 2009 (received February 19, 2009), which includes information regarding a plan already underway to connect the County's Solid Waste Department facilities and Animal Control Department to the City of Bushnell Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). The submittal, which includes a cover letter, an estimate of construction costs, and construction drawings, was provided in support of the County's in-kind project proposal to offset the \$3,000.00 penalty in the referenced case.

The Department does not object to the County's request to implement the referenced in-kind project for the entire penalty amount. Please note the value of the in-kind penalty project is one and a half times the \$3,000 civil penalty amount, which is the equivalent of at least \$4,500.00. 



The Sumter County Board of County Commissioners rejected the consent order unanimously and instructed us to litigate the matter as aggressively as possible. I must admit the Commission's anger at DEP is palpable on this issue. This is, after all, taxpayer money, of which massive amounts are being spent by the County on modernizing the leachate collection system. This is not an irresponsible, unprofessional or apathetic respondent, and the alleged "incident" complained of, if accurately described (and we make no admission that it is), is insignificant at best.

The perception is, with the development industry and the economy at a standstill, that DEP is trying to maintain it's own budget through irresponsible attacks on taxpayer funded state subdivisions for purposes of monetary collection.

The Petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) at the Department's Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS-35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, within 21 days of receipt of this notice. A copy of the Petition must also be mailed at the time of filing to the District Office named above at the address indicated. Failure to file a petition within the 21 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information:



On October 16, 2008, the Department received your October 7, 2008 letter on behalf of the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners (the County) in response to the penalty assessed in the Department's August 15, 2008 Warning Letter WL#08-0008SW60SWD for the Sumter County Materials Recovery Facility (facility).

The Department has reviewed and considered the County's response, which requests that the Department approve an offset of the \$3,500 penalty towards completion a County project that is already underway to connect the facility's existing leachate collection system to the City of Bushnell's wastewater treatment plant. The County indicated that this project would resolve any future problems with the facility's leachate collection system. The Department believes that the project constitutes a corrective action for the violation cited in the referenced Warning Letter. It is the Department's policy that civil penalties cannot be applied toward the cost of corrective actions.

The Department acknowledges the County's request, and other concerns, presented in the October 7, 2008 letter. As some background, in June 2001, the Florida Legislature enacted the Environmental Litigation Reform Act (ELRA) with the intention of streamlining the process for environmental enforcement actions for cases where the potential impacts to the environment are less serious or the magnitude of the non-compliance is low. The case at hand is a good application of the ELRA process for minor cases with small penalties that can be resolved quickly. The civil penalties were assessed in accordance with Section 403.121(3)(e) of the Florida Statutes and are consistent with the intent of ELRA. Therefore, since civil penalties cannot be applied toward the cost of corrective action, and the penalties assessed are directed by



the Florida Legislature through ELRA, the Department does not agree to waive, offset, or reduce the referenced penalty.

On September 30, 2008, the Department provided a Short Form Consent Order to the County for settlement of the referenced penalty. Upon receipt of this letter, please sign and return the Consent Order to the Department at the District address in accordance with the timeframes specified.

Subsequent to our Public Works Solid Waste Department discussing the subject matter with your staff; Sumter County would like to request that you consider a waiver of the civil penalties referenced in your September 30, 2008 settlement letter and August 15, 2008 warning letter. The County is expeditiously working to seek a final resolution of this matter by connecting the existing leachate collection system to the City of Bushnell's wastewater treatment plant. To date, plans are 90% complete and it is anticipated that this connection will cost approximately \$40,000 and be completed 120 days after Department of Environmental Protection approval. This piping system will also take the Animal Control Facility, located north and east of the Solid Waste Office, and the Solid Waste Office off of a septic system and connect them to the waste water treatment plant. The total cost of this project is expected to be approximately \$150,000. This project was in the planning stage well before the inspection of June 26, 2008, and is expected to be completed in 2009. Therefore, taking the above into consideration, as well as the following, we feel strongly that the \$3,500 civil penalty would be best utilized to offset to final resolution of the matter:

- The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) recognizes, as stated in the letter assessing the penalty, dated September 30, 2008, that "corrective actions required to bring the facility into compliance have been performed."
- 2) DEP has not had a leachate water complaint against Sumter County since a pump failure was noted in an inspection report dated 1/17/06.
- There was no failure of any part of the leachate water collection system or any pump, it was simply completely full.
- 4) An order was placed for a vacuum truck on Tuesday, June 24, 2008, to empty the leachate holding tank and collection system. The leachate collection system was not full at this time. This vacuum truck did not arrive until Friday, June 27, 2008.
- Rainfall on the evening of Wednesday, June 25, 2008 filled the leachate collection system. Another call was made for the vacuum truck on Thursday, June 26, 2008.



- 6) No leachate water escaped the concrete floor of the Materials Recovery Facility. (MRF)
- 7) The leachate pumps were turned off of automatic because the holding tank it pumps into was full and the over-flow cycles back into the leachate collection system.
- 8) A new policy concerning leachate water has been adopted by the Sumter County Solid Waste Department which is: A measuring device is used to track the level of leachate water in the collection system. The collection system is now not allowed to be over one half full before a vacuum truck is called to empty the system.
- 9) DEP personnel were informed, on their site visit of March 7, 2008, that Sumter County was making plans to connect the leachate collection system to the City of Bushnell Waste Water Treatment Plant. (WWTP) This project is now in the engineering stage with drawings to be submitted to DEP as they become available.
- 10) Construction cost to connect the leachate collection system to the WWIP is expected to be approximately \$40,000. This connection will also take the restrooms in the MRF off of a septic tank system.
- 11) Connection to the WWTP will insure this type of problem does not happen in the future. The system we are now using will be left in place for a back-up.
- 12) The Animal Control Facility and the Solid Waste Department Office will also be connected to the WWTP. This will remove both sites off of a septic system.
- 13) The total cost of connection to the WWTP will be approximately \$150,000.
- 14) Sumter County is recognized by the State of Florida as a "Small County" and qualifies for a Small County Solid Waste Grant. This grant is vital to the operation of the Sumter County Solid Waste Department.
- 15) Sumter County does not have a tax assessment for waste disposal.
- 16) Sumter County does not have any form of "flow control" for solid waste that would guarantee all of the solid waste generated in Sumter County would come to the Sumter County Solid Waste Department and there is another privately owned transfer station in operation in Sumter County.
- 17) The Sumter County Solid Waste Department operates as an enterprise fund, relying on revenue generated by the Solid Waste Department and the Solid Waste Grant to fund all operations of the Solid Waste Department.
- 18) There was never any intent by the Sumter County Solid Waste Department to violate any DEP regulation. Action was taken to avoid any problem with the leachate water and if the vacuum truck had arrived as expected the collection system would not have gotten full.
- 19) Small Counties across Florida are struggling with the economy in the turmoil it is presently in and Sumter County is not an exception to this.





Persons who are not parties to this Consent Order but whose substantial interests are affected by this Consent Order have a right, pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes, to petition for an administrative hearing on it. The Petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) at the Department's Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS-35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, within 21 days of receipt of this notice. A copy of the Petition must also be mailed at the time of filing to the District Office named above at the address indicated. Failure to file a petition within the 21 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information:

(a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner; the Department's Consent Order identification number and the county in which the subject matter or activity is located; (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Consent Order; (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Consent Order; (d) A statement of the material facts disputed by petitioner, if any; (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Consent Order; (f) A statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Consent Order; (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Consent Order.

Dear Mr. Arnold:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of possible violations of law for which you may be responsible and to seek your cooperation in resolving the matter. A Department inspection conducted at the Sumter County Materials Recovery Facility on June 26, 2008 indicates that violations of Florida Statutes and Rules may exist:

1) Department staff observed a significant quantity of leachate ponded on the floor of the MRF building. This leachate appeared to have overflowed from the two floor drains in the building. Facility staff indicated that they allow leachate to fill the collection tank in order to accommodate the volume of the vacuum truck employed to haul this leachate off-site. Once the tank was full to capacity, the automatic float system for the leachate sump pump had been disabled, by county staff, to avoid overfilling the tank. This resulted in leachate accumulating in the collection piping and ultimately overflowing the floor drains. Facility staff indicated that a rainfall event had also contributed to the leachate overflow on the MRF building floor. These conditions indicate a failure to operate the leachate collection system as it was designed and permitted to function. These conditions are contrary to Rule 62-701.710(3)(b) and (4)(b), Florida Administrative Code, and Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO.

Rule 62-4.160(1), Florida Administrative Code ("F.A.C.") states: "The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations, and restrictions set forth in this permit, are 'permit conditions' and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Section 403.141, 403.727, or 403.859, F.S." Rule 62-4.160(2), F.A.C. states, "This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from

the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department."

Rule 62-701.710(3)(b), F.A.C. states, "the facility shall be designed with a leachate control system to...minimize the presence of standing water." Rule 62-701.710(4)(b), F.A.C. states, "Areas where waste is stored or processed shall be cleaned at least weekly to prevent odor or vector problems..." and "...all drains and leachate conveyances shall be kept clean so that leachate flow is not impeded." Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO states, "Floors shall be free of standing liquids."

The deficiencies noted above and any other activities at your facility that may be contributing to violations of the above rules should be ceased. The operation of a facility in violation of state statutes or rules may result in liability for damages and restoration, and the judicial imposition of civil penalties up to \$10,000 per violation per day pursuant to Sections 403.141 and 403.161, Florida Statutes. It is typically Department policy to initiate enforcement action and seek civil penalties of \$3,000 for conditions such as those described above.

PLEASE BE ADVISED that this Warning Letter is part of an agency investigation, preliminary to agency action in accordance with Section 120.57(4), Florida Statutes. You are requested to contact Ms. Nancy Gaskin of this office at telephone number (813) 632-7600, extension 375, within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss this matter. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyone with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter. We look forward to your cooperation in completing the investigation and resolution of this matter.

Ms. Gaskin:

This letter is in response to the warning letter, referenced above, received by Sumter County on August 18, 2008, and to inform you of the new policy regarding leachate water adopted by the Sumter County Solid Waste Department.

Aqua Clean, the company that disposes of our leachate water, arrived on June 27, 2008, and hauled out 3,993 gallons of leachate water. They were originally called for a pickup on June 24, 2008. It is very rare for them to not be here the next day. Had they arrived on the 25th this problem would not have occurred.

To avoid any problem of this nature in the future, I have adopted the following policy: Effective August 21, 2008, instead of trying to have a full load of 4,000 gallons of leachate water, Aqua Clean will be called for leachate disposal when the holding tank is full and the collection system in the floor sump is no more than half full. The Solid Waste Department will devise (has devised) a way to measure the level of leachate water in the floor sump. This should eliminate any concerns of the leachate water not being handled correctly.

We are also considering a water line connection to the City of Bushnell Waste Water Treatment Plant. This will eliminate the holding tank and the leachate water will automatically be pumped from the floor sump to the Treatment Plant. Hopefully this will be approved and accomplished in 2009.

I am including a copy of my letter to Mr. Bradley Arnold, Sumter County Administrator, and to Mr. Gary Kuhl, Sumter County Public Works Director, notifying them of the adoption of the above stated policy.

I trust this meets your expectations. I welcome any questions or comments.







Dear Mr. Arnold:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of possible violations of law for which you may be responsible and to seek your cooperation in resolving the matter. A Department inspection conducted at the Sumter County Materials Recovery Facility on June 26, 2008 indicates that violations of Florida Statutes and Rules may exist:

1) Department staff observed a significant quantity of leachate ponded on the floor of the MRF building. This leachate appeared to have overflowed from the two floor drains in the building. Facility staff indicated that they allow leachate to fill the collection tank in order to accommodate the volume of the vacuum truck employed to haul this leachate off-site. Once the tank was full to capacity, the automatic float system for the leachate sump pump had been disabled, by county staff, to avoid overfilling the tank. This resulted in leachate accumulating in the collection piping and ultimately overflowing the floor drains. Facility staff indicated that a rainfall event had also contributed to the leachate overflow on the MRF building floor. These conditions indicate a failure to operate the leachate collection system as it was designed and permitted to function. These conditions are contrary to Rule 62-701.710(3)(b) and (4)(b), Florida Administrative Code, and Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO.

Rule 62-4.160(1), Florida Administrative Code ("F.A.C.") states: "The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations, and restrictions set forth in this permit, are 'permit conditions' and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Section 403.141, 403.727, or 403.859, F.S." Rule 62-4.160(2), F.A.C. states, "This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from



the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department."

Rule 62-701.710(3)(b), F.A.C. states, "the facility shall be designed with a leachate control system to...minimize the presence of standing water." Rule 62-701.710(4)(b), F.A.C. states, "Areas where waste is stored or processed shall be cleaned at least weekly to prevent odor or vector problems..." and "...all drains and leachate conveyances shall be kept clean so that leachate flow is not impeded." Specific Condition 12.a of Permit No. 126941-003-SO states, "Floors shall be free of standing liquids."

The deficiencies noted above and any other activities at your facility that may be contributing to violations of the above rules should be ceased. The operation of a facility in violation of state statutes or rules may result in liability for damages and restoration, and the judicial imposition of civil penalties up to \$10,000 per violation per day pursuant to Sections 403.141 and 403.161, Florida Statutes. It is typically Department policy to initiate enforcement action and seek civil penalties of \$3,000 for conditions such as those described above.

PLEASE BE ADVISED that this Warning Letter is part of an agency investigation, preliminary to agency action in accordance with Section 120.57(4), Florida Statutes. You are requested to contact Ms. Nancy Gaskin of this office at telephone number (813) 632-7600, extension 375, within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this Warning Letter to arrange a meeting to discuss this matter. The Department is interested in reviewing any facts you may have that will assist in determining whether any violations have occurred. You may bring anyone with you to the meeting that you feel could help resolve this matter. We look forward to your cooperation in completing the investigation and resolution of this matter.

This letter addresses the concerns noted during your inspection of the Sumter County Solid Waste Facility on June 26, 2008. Your report was received via e-mail on Thursday, July 10, 2008 with instructions to respond within 15 days. I am responding to the concerns listed on pages 10 through . 16 of your report.

1) Page 10 of the report.

FDEP Concern:

Question number 4.12 – Are all drains and leachate conveyances kept clean so that leachate flow is not impeded? 62-701.620(2)

Explanation: See 4.11. Leachate drains were observed full of liquid during the inspection.

County Action:

Aqua Clean, out of Lakeland, Fl., takes care of our leachate water. I had called them on Tuesday, June 24th to haul out the leachate and the leachate drains were not full at that time. Unfortunately, they could not send a truck to pick up the leachate until Friday, June 27th. Rain fall on Wednesday did fill the leachate drains but no leachate escaped the concrete surface as it is sloped toward the drains. Aqua Clean was here on Friday, June 27th and hauled out all of the leachate we had. All drains and leachate conveyances are kept clean so that leachate flow is not impeded. The County is considering plans to pump our leachate water to the City of Bushnell Waste Water Treatment Plant. This plant is located south of and adjoining the Sumter County Solid Waste Facility property. The FDEP will be informed of any planned construction and the County realizes this may require a permit modification.

2) Page 10 of the report.

FDEP Concern:

Question number 3.22 – Are all specific conditions in the closure or long term care permit being followed? 62-701.620(2)

Explanation: A modification to the asphalt cover system was observed during the inspection. The facility installed a shallow trench to direct storm water flow off of waste filled areas into swale. This appears to be a modification of the existing final cover system and does not appear to have been approved by the Department. It was not determined whether the trench impacted the integrity of the final cover systems. During the inspection, the Operator indicated that a sealant had been ordered to seal any cracks in the cap, but did not indicate whether this would be used to seal the new trench system. Item 3.6 of this report left unknown pending details about the construction of the trench system.

County Action:

In the previous inspection report of March 7, 2008, it was written that "FDEP staff observed ponded water in several areas on the closed landfill, including areas covered in asphalt." In my response concerning the asphalt portion I wrote that "it was concluded that rather than resurface the depressions staff would create narrow channels by recontouring the adjacent high points in the asphalt that are restricting the natural flow of storm water runoff to retention and grassed areas." This area was surveyed for elevations and the thickness of the asphalt was determined before any recontouring took place. At no time or in any area was the asphalt penetrated to the lime rock base and it is felt that the integrity of the final cover system has not been compromised but has been improved. There was no ponded water even though it had recently rained. The contours were sealed with road tar during construction.

3) Page 11 of the report.

FDEP Concern:

Question number 4.26 – Are all specific conditions in the permit being followed? 62-701.320(1)

Explanation: See 4.11, 4.12

County Action:

4.11 is covered in number 4 below and 4.12 was covered in number 1 above.

4) Page 12 of the report.

FDEP Concern:

Question number 4.11 – Is leachate collection and removal system maintained and operated as required? 62-701.710(3)(b)

Explanation: Leachate was observed pooled on the MRF building floor. The leachate tank was full and leachate was left to collect in the sump. The pumps were turned off of automatic. Operator indicated that the facilities leachate tank only holds 3,000 gallons while his hauler has a 4,000 gallon truck. The facility intentionally allows leachate to build up in the sump prior to having it hauled offsite. The drain on the MRF floor was full and had overflowed onto the floor. Several plastic recyclables from the MRF were observed in contact with the leachate and should be disposed of as class 1 waste. The facility failed to operate the leachate system so as to minimize the presence of standing water.

County Action:

As explained in item number 1, the leachate system was completely emptied on Friday, June 27th. The hauler was called on Tuesday when the drains were not completely full. The plastics that came in contact with the leachate water were disposed of as class 1 waste.

5) Page 13 of the report.

FDEP Concern:

Question number 3.4 – Is the final cover properly vegetated? 62-701.600(5)(f)2. Explanation: Facility is currently applying finished compost and re-grading portions of the site.

County Action:

The inspectors observed work in progress to avoid ponding water on the dirt portion of the closed landfill. This work will continue as needed.

6) Page 14 of the report.

FDEP Concern:

Question number 4.16 – Are areas where waste is stored or processed cleaned at least weekly to prevent odor and vector problems? 62-701.710(4)(b)

Explanation: One area of the floor inside the MRE building. NE corner adjacent to st

Explanation: One area of the floor inside the MRF building, NE corner adjacent to stairs, appeared to have not been cleaned and was littered with debris.

County Action:

This area was cleaned up and staff was instructed to make sure this area is a part of their routine cleaning.

7) Page 14 of the report.

FDEP Concern:

Question number 3.8 – Are there any areas of ponding water on the final cover? 62-701.600(5)(f)3.

Explanation: Minor ponding was observed on southern portions of the landfill. Repair work was observed on portions of the LF mainly in the northern sections.

County Action:

Work is on going to prevent ponding of water on the closed landfill.

8) Page 15 of the report.

FDEP Concern:

Question number 4.21 – Is the facility operated to control objectionable odors? 62-701.710(4)(d)

Explanation: Strong odors observed around MRF building due to LCS back up.

County Action:

A deodorant was added in the leachate drains on the tipping floor and the leachate was hauled out the next day. There is no problem with odors in the MRF.

The minor damage that was observed at the entrance of the MRF building and noted in the comments on page 16 has been repaired.

During the inspection, the Operator indicated that a sealant had been ordered to seal any cracks in the cap, but did not indicate whether this would be used to seal the new trench system. Item 3.6 of this report left unknown pending details about the construction of the trench system.
