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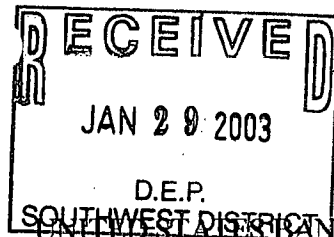

ORDER DIRECTING MEDIATION

This case came on for hearing on January 8, 2003, for a status conference. After reviewing the pleadings and considering that the nature of the dispute between the debtor and the Official Committee of Bondholders could possibly be resolved by mediation, it is

ORDERED:

1. The debtor and the Official Committee of Bondholders are directed to mediation for possible resolution of all issues raised in their dispute.
2. Mediation is to occur at a mutually convenient time and is to be completed by **March 24, 2003.**
3. The Parties shall have ten (10) days from service of this order to submit a joint stipulation specifying the name of an agreed mediator or to file a notice that the Parties cannot agree on the selection of the designated mediator. If the Parties cannot agree on a mediator, the Clerk is directed to select a mediator from the approved panel of mediators and to inform the Parties of the designated mediator.
4. The Parties are directed to furnish a copy of all relevant documents associated with the matter referred to mediation, together with a Statement of Mediation Position, using the official form, to the mediator and the opposing party or parties within twenty (20) days from entry of this Order. The Statement of Mediation Position shall not be filed with the Court.

5. All parties are directed to proceed with the mediation in good faith in an attempt to resolve all of the remaining issues.

6. Every party participating in the mediation is directed to send a representative with full settlement authority.

7. The Parties are directed to each pay an equal share of the cost of the mediation.

8. Following the conclusion of the mediation, the mediator is directed to submit a written report indicating whether any settlement was reached. If a settlement is reached, the Parties are directed to file a written agreement executed by the Parties and their counsel within fifteen (15) days from the conclusion of the mediation and to promptly seek necessary court approval.

9. All documents and statements made by the Parties, attorneys and other participants presented or made during the mediation proceedings shall, in all respects, be privileged and not reported, recorded, or placed into evidence, made known to the Court or construed for any purpose as an admission. No party shall be bound by any statement made or action taken at the mediation conference unless a settlement is reached, in which event, the agreement shall be reduced to writing pursuant to the prior paragraph

10. In order to assist the parties in preparing for the anticipated mediation, the Committee needs to allow various parties interested in either purchasing or investing in the debtor's operations to have access to the debtor's premises and operations to complete a due diligence investigation. Accordingly, the Court directs:

a. All parties participating in this due diligence process to act in good faith.

b. Any party desiring to have access to the debtor's financial records or premises must complete a confidentiality agreement providing that all information obtained during the course of the due diligence inspection will remain confidential and shared only to the extent necessary to determine their positions in connection with this Chapter 11 proceeding.

c. The debtor is directed to supply full access to its employees' financial records and plant operations as reasonably necessary to allow the due diligence inspection to occur.

d. All due diligence inspections must be concluded on or before **February 14, 2003**.

e. Any party participating in a due diligence inspection must provide the debtor with reasonable notice of all records or access requested. All inspections and reviews must occur during reasonable business hours unless the parties agree otherwise.

f. All parties participating in a due diligence inspection are directed at all times to act in a safe and responsible manner in light of the dangerous equipment operated in the course of the debtor's business.

g. The debtor may assign, if desired, an employee to accompany each person participating in a due diligence inspection when the person is walking through any of the plant operations to insure that all safety concerns are satisfied.

h. Any party who believes that access to the records or the premises is unjustly denied by the debtor, or if the debtor believes a party participating in the due diligence process is requesting unnecessary access or is not acting in good faith, such person may request an emergency hearing to resolve the dispute.

The facility is renewing its permit as a waste tire processing facility. The facility is required to provide financial assurance for third-party closure of the facility (clean-up, transport and disposal of remaining waste tires, tire products, and residuals) which is based on the maximum permitted storage capacity of the facility. There are no monitoring or post-closure care requirements for a waste tire processing facility. The facility has and is currently providing adequate financial assurance for third party closure. I was not necessarily concerned about the facility, but just wanted to check with you to make sure that there were not issues specifically related to the bankruptcy or re-organization process that the applicant should address and/or we should consider prior to issuance of the permit. 1) Have you heard of or received any further information on the bankruptcy or re-organization that we should consider in processing the facility's permit renewal? What type of permit?

The corporation filed a plan and disclosure statement on 12/20, which the judge has set for hearing (I don't have the date yet, but will ask Debtor's counsel for immediately)

2) Is there information we should be requesting or are there questions we should be asking the applicant related to this matter as part of review of the facility's permit renewal application?

What do we require with regard to an application? Adequate assurance of ability to perform? If we are concerned that the corporation will be unable to meet one of our standards, then we should request information about it. I'm ignorant of what we require (e.g. financial assurance - amount?)

Our first RAI on the application needs to be sent by 2/13/03, so if you could get back to me by 2/7/03, I would appreciate it.

Let's talk next week about the nature of the permit, the normal requirements and what concerns you have. Is there a closure responsibility associated with this (i.e. tire destruction, run off protection, liner?)

The Department received your December 2, 2002 letter notifying the Department of the change in operation of your facility to Plan B. The Department requests the following clarification on the proposed change prior to Department approval:

1) The current approved Plan A (8/30/99) provides for twelve 30 cu.yd. tire processing residuals dumpsters (3 fiber, 5 tread steel, 2 wire, 1 rim, 1 tube), one 1 cu.yd. residual dumpster, and one 1 cu.yd. office dumpster. Plan B (6/30/98) only provides for ten 30 cu.yd. tire processing residuals dumpsters (2 fiber, 2 tread steel, 2 wire, 2 rim, 2 tube), one 1 cu.yd. residual dumpster, and one 1 cu.yd. office dumpster. Your December 2, 2002 letter indicates you will have fourteen 30 cu.yd. dumpsters at the facility. Please clarify the number of dumpsters for each waste stream you plan on having at the facility.

2) Please confirm the facility's intent to implement the following changes in site layout and facility operation in accordance with Plan B:


- a) Relocate facility waste stream dumpsters to site locations consistent with Plan B.
- b) Relocate "Tire Pile" from outdoor location identified as "C" in Plan A to the indoor location identified as "E" in Plan B, and eliminate the storage of "Mesh Sized Rubber" at the site in general and specifically in the indoor area identified as "H" in Plan A.
- c) Eliminate use of the "Chip Storage" area identified as "B2" in Plan A.
- d) Cease acceptance of OTR and truck tires at the facility and elimination of the area identified as "E2" in Plan A.
- e) Eliminate "Granular Storage Piles" in the locations identified as "R1", "R2", and "R3" on Plan A.

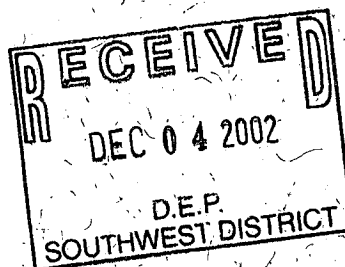

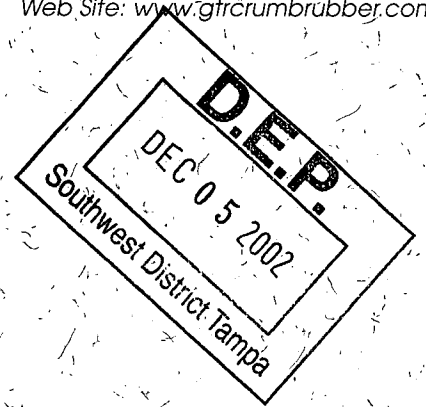

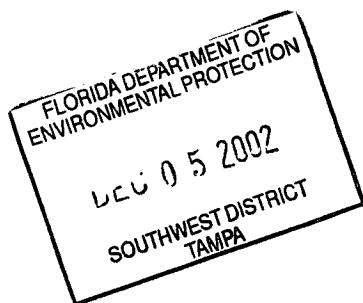

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS MANUAL

The emergency plan for the waste tire processing facility operated by Global Tire Recycling of Sumter County, Inc. addresses measures that should be taken in emergency situations that may occur during the operation of the facility. The Emergency Plan has been submitted to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection as part of Global's application to secure a waste tire processing facility permit.

The emergency plan describes the actions to be taken by plant personnel to minimize hazards to human health and the environment resulting from fire, explosion, spills, industrial accidents or other emergency conditions.

Coordination letters will be sent to the responsible officials of each of the emergency services listed herein. The letters will explain the facility and invite each contact person to visit in order to acquaint himself with the plant. A copy of the Emergency Preparedness Manual with all amendments will be available on site. Amendments to the emergency plan will be submitted to the Department whenever the facility changes its design or operation in a way that materially increases the potential for an emergency situation or changes the necessary emergency response, or whenever the emergency coordinators change.

Personnel and User Safety

Every attempt will be made to reduce the possibility of an emergency at the plant. Smoking will be prohibited at all times on the entire premises and all employees and visitors will be notified of the ban. No open flame will be permitted within 25 feet of a tire pile, rubber in process, product storage area, flammable residue such a fiber or other flammable material. Production personnel will be trained in the safe operation of all equipment and will be required to wear appropriated protective gear.

An emergency response training program will be established for personnel including:

- Identification of Emergency Coordinators
- Identification of duties and responsibilities of the Emergency Coordinators and other emergency response personnel
- Identification of communication systems
- Development of an evacuation plan
- Summary of first aid for selected medical emergencies
- Summary of available emergency services

Emergency Coordinators and Chain of Command

If an emergency situation occurs at the site, employees must contact the designated Emergency Coordinators. Emergency Coordinators assume responsibility in the order listed below:

A security guard will be on duty at the plant site during normal business hours. This person will respond to all alarms and emergency situations during business hours and will report any emergency or potential emergency situations to the designated emergency coordinators and to the proper emergency response agencies. After normal business hours, Global's security system monitoring company (Telemetrix Systems, Inc.) will respond to all alarms and will report any emergency or potential emergency situations to the designated emergency coordinators and to the proper emergency agencies.

In summary, all office, production and security personnel will be instructed that in an emergency situation they must first warn other personnel so that they may move away from the area of imminent danger to a safe area; second, immediately call 911, describing the nature of the emergency and the address and telephone number of the plant, and third, call the primary and then secondary emergency coordinator(s) if they are not already on site and are not aware of the situation.

Duties and Responsibilities of the Emergency Coordinator

Emergency Plan Implementation

The decision to implement the emergency plan at the facility will depend on whether a fire, explosion, or other emergency incident could potentially endanger public health and safety or the environment. The following information provides the Emergency Coordinator with criteria to assist in making this decision.

Fire and/or Explosion

- The fire spreads and could ignite other materials on site or at other locations on site or could cause heat-induced explosions.
- The fire could spread to off-site areas.
- Use of water and/or chemical fire suppressant could result in contaminated runoff.
- An imminent danger exists that an explosion could occur, causing a safety hazard.
- An imminent danger exists that an explosion could ignite other materials at the facility
- An explosion has occurred

Material Release or Spill

- The spill could result in release of flammable liquids or vapors, causing a fire or gas explosion hazard.
- The spill can be contained on-site, but the potential exists for groundwater contamination.
- The spill cannot be contained on-site, resulting in off-site soil contamination and/or ground or surface water pollution.

Emergency Response Procedures

Whenever there is any type of reported incident at the facility, the Emergency Coordinator must immediately notify facility personnel, identify and assess the source and extent of the emergency, and take action to control the situation.

Notification

In the event of an imminent or actual emergency occurrence, the first person on the scene should notify the Emergency Coordinator who will initiate a proper response to the situation. Notification of the Emergency Coordinator should be performed second only to notification of on-site personnel, site evacuation if necessary, and calling Emergency 911 depending on the emergency situation.

The Emergency Coordinator will alert all facility personnel through the internal communications system and aid in any necessary evacuation. Progression of notification will continue to local, State and Federal response agencies deemed appropriate by the Emergency Coordinator. A list of the Designated Emergency Coordinators is included in Appendix A-1. This list will be posted in a conspicuous location on site. A list of the Emergency Response Agencies and Contacts is included in Appendix A-2 and a copy will be posted in a conspicuous location on site. Personnel on site should contact those Emergency Response Agencies as soon as possible by calling 911. Do not wait to notify the Emergency Coordinator before calling 911 if the Emergency Coordinator is not on site. In case of an emergency situation, an assessment of

the potential hazard must be made. If the Emergency Coordinator determines that the facility has had a fire, explosion, spill or other incident that presents a possible hazard to public health and safety or to the environment, and initiates the Emergency Plan, contact with the Wildwood Fire and Police Departments must be made, informing them of situations where an evacuation of the surrounding area is necessary. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection must also be advised of all the pertinent facts regarding the incident through its emergency response contact at 1 (800) 320-0519.

When making a report the following information should be provided:

- Name and telephone number of person making the report
- Name, address and telephone number of the facility
- Type and time of incident occurrence
- Type and quantity of materials involved
- Extent of any injuries
- Possible hazards to public health and safety or the environment

Control Procedures

The nature of the work carried out at Global's plant makes the occurrence of emergency situations a possibility, even though the possibility may be remote. Emergencies can happen quickly and unexpectedly, requiring immediate response.

Immediate action by facility personnel will concentrate on: (1), extinguishing the fire or containing any leaks, and (2), preventing the plant's automatic emergency water sprinkling system from engaging unnecessarily. Immediate emergency medical attention will be given to injured personnel. Possible sources of ignition should be removed from the area, if this can be done without risk, and all work shall stop until the fire or incident can be safely controlled.

Storage and Treatment of Released Materials

Immediately after an emergency situation, the Emergency Coordinator will make arrangements for the storage or disposal of any recovered wastes, water or any contaminated materials resulting from the incident. The owner will notify the Department of any such incident and comply with its directives. Wastes generated will be collected and transported to a permitted disposal site.

Post-Emergency Equipment Maintenance

Following an incident all emergency response equipment used must be cleaned and made fit for reuse, or replaced as necessary, so that the equipment will be available when facility operations resume. An inspection of the emergency equipment used in response must take place before operations resume to assure that each item is in proper working condition. Remedial activities as a

result of this inspection may include recharging fire extinguishers, replacing personal protective gear, and restocking disposable items.

Internal Communication/ Warning System

Telephones and a paging system will be available at the site for alerting facility personnel in the event of an emergency. Units will be located in readily accessible areas at the plant. A siren alarm system will be installed which can be activated from various strategic locations within the plant should an emergency situation arise. This system provides personnel with immediate emergency notification and necessary instructions in the event of an incident.

Evacuation Plan

In an emergency situation, and when time permits, the Emergency Coordinator is the individual responsible for determining when evacuation of the facility is required. Imminent or actual dangers that constitute a situation requiring evacuation include:

- A generalized fire that has activated the automatic emergency sprinkler system or threat of generalized fire that cannot be avoided.
- An explosion or the threat of explosion that cannot be averted.
- A major spill or leak that cannot be contained and which constitutes a threat to human health.

When time permits and evacuation is required, the following procedures should be followed:

- Alert all personnel using the plant telephone and paging systems, as well as by activating the siren alarm system.
- Shut down all machinery and other equipment.
- All personnel should proceed to a designated meeting point. For all plant personnel, this would be the parking lot east of the office area
- Once assembled, standby to afford assistance if and as needed

Should a situation occur for which an alternative meeting place is necessary, employees will proceed to the guardshed.

When time does **not** permit, proceed to the evacuation route:

Evacuation Route: Personnel should proceed past the gate out of the perceived danger zone and notify appropriate emergency personnel.

Fire Fighting and Other Emergency Equipment

The plant will maintain a supply of fire extinguishers in order to contain and extinguish a fire before it activates the plant's automatic emergency water sprinkling system. The fire extinguishers will be placed at or near major pieces of equipment and in other areas and signs will mark their locations. Extinguishers are of the dry chemical type and are maintained in conformity with state and local fire codes and regulations. A list of emergency supplies is attached as Appendix A-3.

In any situation where use of fire extinguishers fails to contain a fire the automatic emergency water sprinkling system will be activated. This system will spray water at a rate of 1155 gallons per minute throughout the production and storage areas inside the plant. All runoff resulting from engagement of the sprinkler system will be contained in an exterior stormwater retention system. The Production Area Fire Protection plan was submitted as Page M-2 of the Project Drawings (Attachment B to the application). Details of the pollution control baffle unit are given at Page No. 4 of the Site Plan, (Attachment D to the application), and as Exhibit C to the addendum to the application dated April 17, 1998.

Exhibit C shows the location and detailed drawings of the pollution control inlet prior to discharge into the on-site water retention basin. During a fire, all floating debris and oily substances will be prevented from entering the outlet pipe by the aluminum skimmer installed on the pollution control inlet. The inlet also provides a 12" sump below the bottom of the outlet pipe to prevent the heavier solids from entering the outlet pipe and allowing them to settle for clean up. The storm drainage system was designed for a 25 year/24 hour storm event that will produce a 11.44 CFS (5,134GPM) runoff rate, which should be well above the volume produced from fire suppression. The elevation of each portion of the pollution control inlet is shown on Exhibit C. In the event of a fire, after suppression, Global will inspect, clean out, maintain and return to original condition all indoor drains and storm grate inlets, the pollution control inlet, and the on-site water retention area in order to remove any contaminants or results from the fire remaining after percolation of the fire suppression. It should be emphasized that the skimmer and sump at the pollution control inlet are designed to prevent both lighter-than-water floating debris and contaminants and heavier-than-water settling debris from passing through the pollution control inlet and entering the water retention area.

First Aid/Safety Equipment

First aid and safety equipment will be located in strategic locations on the site. First aid kits, located in the office area as well as in the foreman's office and in the machine shop area, will contain a full range of items necessary to care for minor injuries needing prompt attention.

Medical Emergencies/First Aid

In cases of medical emergency, trained medical response personnel should be contacted immediately. First aid administered by on-site personnel should continue until professional assistance arrives

First aid is the immediate care of a person who has been injured or has suddenly taken ill. It is intended to prevent death or further illness or injury, and to relieve pain. The objectives of first aid care are:

- 1) To control conditions that might endanger life
- 2) To prevent further injury
- 3) To relieve pain and treat for shock
- 4) To make the injured person as comfortable as possible

Initial responsibility for first aid rests with the first person at the scene, who should react quickly, but in a calm and reassuring manner. Emergency medical assistance (911) should be called as soon as possible, being clear as to suspected types of injury or illness. The injured person should not be moved, except when necessary to prevent further injury.

Pulmonary Resuscitation (General Guidelines)

If the victim is unresponsive and no breathing is apparent, begin mouth-to-mouth resuscitation immediately. Delay increases the risk of serious disability or death:

1. Carefully place the patient flat on his/her back and kneel at the patient's side. In cases where the patient is a violent accident victim, use caution and your best judgment. If the victim is in an awkward position, roll victim as a unit onto his/her back, keeping the body from twisting and the spine in alignment
2. Establish an airway. Check the victim's mouth with your finger to be sure that no obstruction is present, and then tip the patient's head back until the chin points straight up. This will help prevent the tongue from blocking the airway.
3. Pinch the patient's nostrils and begin mouth-to-mouth resuscitation by taking a deep breath and placing your mouth over the patient's mouth so as to make a leak-proof seal. Blow your breath into the patient's mouth until you see the chest rise.
4. Remove your mouth and allow the patient to exhale
5. Repeat the procedure at a rate of once every 5 seconds.

Heart (Cardiac) Resuscitation (General Guidelines)

In the unresponsive patient, check for a cardiac pulse. Locate the larynx (adam's apple) with the tips of the fingers, and slide the fingers into the groove between the larynx and the muscle at the side of the neck. If no pulse is felt, circulation must be re-established within 4 minutes to prevent brain damage.

With the patient flat on his/her back, kneel at the waist, facing the head.

Place the heel of your right hand over the heel of your left hand on top of the patient's breast bone slightly more than one inch above its lower tip, holding your fingers off the patient's chest.

Shift your weight to the patient's chest and compress it at least one and one-half to two inches, then remove the pressure.

Continue at a rate of 80 compressions per minute

Alternate one breath and 5 compressions until medical personnel arrive.

Heavy Bleeding

Heavy bleeding is caused by injury to one or more large blood vessels. Lay the patient down. Control bleeding by applying firm pressure directly over the wound with a clean handkerchief, cloth, or your hand. A tourniquet should be applied only in cases of amputation or other injury to a limb in which there is no other way to stop the bleeding. If a tourniquet is used, a record of the time it was applied must be kept. Once a tourniquet is applied, do not loosen or remove it.

Shock

Shock, or traumatic shock, usually accompanies severe injury and may be caused by injuries of all types. The signs of shock include pallor, cold and clammy skin, beads of perspiration on the forehead and palms, weakness, nausea or vomiting, shallow breathing, and a rapid pulse that may be too faint to be felt at the wrist. The following procedures should be followed:

1. Correct the cause if possible (e.g., control bleeding). Avoid moving the victim if neck or spine injuries are suspected.
2. The patient's position should be based on his injuries; if in doubt, keep the patient lying down until emergency medical aid arrives.
3. Keep the patient's airway open. If he or she is about to vomit, turn the head to one side.
4. Keep the patient warm so as to prevent chilling and loss of body heat.

Additional Illnesses and Injuries (General First Aid Guidelines)

After requesting emergency medical assistance, the following points should be addressed in specific emergencies:

1. Abdominal -pain - Keep the patient quiet. Give nothing by mouth.
2. Back and neck inquiries - Keep the patient quiet. Do not move the patient or lift the head unless absolutely necessary.
3. Chest pains - Keep the patient calm and quiet. Place the patient in the most comfortable position (usually half sitting)
4. Convulsion or epileptic seizure - Place the patient on the floor or a couch. Do not restrain the patient's movements except to prevent injury. Do not place a blunt object between the teeth, put any liquid in the mouth, slap the patient, or douse the patient with water
5. Electric shock - Throw the switch to turn off the current. Do not touch the victim until he/she is separated from the current source. Begin mouth-to-mouth resuscitation if respiration has ceased. Begin heart (cardiac) resuscitation if heart stops.
6. Fainting - Simple fainting can usually be treated by laying the person down.
7. Unexplained unconsciousness - Look for emergency medical identification around patient's neck or wrist, or in his/her wallet. Keep the patient warm, lying down, and quiet until he/she regains consciousness. Do not move the patient's head if there is bleeding from the nose, mouth, ear or eyes. Do not give the patient anything through the mouth. Keep the patient's airway open to aid breathing. Do not cramp the neck with a pillow.

Chemical Ingestion or Contamination

Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) will be maintained to assist in the treatment of injuries for all chemicals used on site such as pesticides, herbicides, cleaners and chemicals used in testing product to comply with customer or Department of Transportation specifications. **In all cases of chemical injuries, try to determine the chemical, review the MSDS information, and follow any specific instructions given therein.**

General Instructions: Ingestion of Chemicals

Seek medical assistance by calling a physician and the poison information center. These telephone numbers will be posted where chemicals are stored and used.

Dilute the chemical by having the victim drink a glass of water or milk if he is conscious and not having convulsions. Discontinue dilution if it make patient nauseated.

Save the label or container of the suspected chemical for identification. If the victim vomits, save sample of the vomited materials for analysis.

If the victim becomes unconscious, keep his airway open. Give artificial respiration or cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) if necessary. Only administer CPR if you are trained to do so. **Call Emergency 911 as soon as possible.**

Chemicals Spilled on the Body

- Wash away the chemical with large amounts of water, using a safety shower or hose, as quickly as possible and for at least 5 minutes. Remove the victim's clothing from the areas involved. No time should be wasted because of modesty. The rescuer should take precautions so as to avoid contaminating himself.
- If first aid directions for burns caused by specific chemicals are available from the MSDS or from some other source, follow these directions after the initial flushing with water.
- Apply a dressing bandage and get medical aid.

Chemicals on the Skin in a Confined Area

Immediately flush with cool water and wash by using a mild detergent or soap (preferred) and water. If a delayed reaction (the physiological effects of some chemicals, e.g., methyl and ethyl bromides, may be delayed as much as 48 hours) is noted, obtain medical attention promptly and explain carefully what chemicals were involved. **Follow measures set out in the MSDS.**

EXTRICATION

In some types of accidents it may be impossible for the victim to free himself. In cases where the victim is trapped in a vehicle there may be a danger not only to the victim but also to the first aid rescuer. It is necessary for the first aid rescuer to get to the accident victim if it is safe to do so in order to provide life saving support until trained emergency rescue personnel arrive.

Accidents involving machinery – Victims pinned in or under machinery may suffer severe injuries and there may be traumatic shock. First aid should be administered promptly, and emergency rescue personnel should be called immediately.

The machinery should be stopped and the power cut off. If the equipment does not have automatic release capabilities, or it is not functional, the equipment may have to be dismantled. In such cases, the person administering first aid should attempt to control bleeding, treat shock, keep the victim's airway open, keep the victim as comfortable as possible, and be reassuring while waiting for trained emergency rescue personnel.

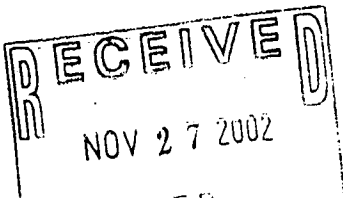

This case came on for consideration on the Debtor's Motion to Use Additional Cash Collateral to Meet Financial Responsibility Requirements of Florida Department of Environmental Protection (the "Motion") (Doc. No. 151) filed on November 18, 2002. The Motion was served with a negative notice provision, which is not permitted in this Court. Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that the Motion (Doc. No. 151) is stricken without prejudice.

No later than ten (10) days after the date of service of this order, the debtor, through its counsel, shall serve by mail a solicitation package upon all creditors, equity security holders, administrative claim applicants, the trustee (if any), attorney for the creditor's committee (if any), each member of the creditors committee (if any), Internal Revenue Service, Post Office Box 35045, Stop 5720, Jacksonville, Florida 32202, The Securities and Exchange Commission, Branch of Reorganization, 3475 Lenox Road, Northeast, Suite 1000, Atlanta, Georgia 30326-1232, United States Trustee, SouthTrust Bank Building, 135 West Central Boulevard, Room 620, Orlando, Florida 32801, attorneys who have appeared in this case and on professionals who have been employed by the debtor or any official committee with the approval of the court, and other parties in interest in the debtor's case as provided in F.R.B.P. 3017(d). Counsel shall then promptly file a certificate of such service. For this purpose, counsel shall obtain from the clerk and use a current mailing matrix. The solicitation package shall be comprised of the amended disclosure statement, the amended plan of reorganization, and a ballot for accepting or rejecting the amended plan.

8. Administrative Claim Bar Date. All creditors and parties in interest that assert a claim against the debtor which arose after the filing of this case, including all attorneys, accountants, auctioneers, appraisers, and other professionals for compensation from the estate of the debtor pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 330, must file applications for the allowance of such claims with the court no later than fourteen (14) days before the date of the Confirmation Hearing (the "Administrative Claims Bar Date"). The requirement to file applications for administrative claims shall not apply to claims that arise after the Administrative Claims Bar Date. Any applications filed will be heard at the Confirmation Hearing if properly scheduled and noticed by the debtor. Any application not heard at the confirmation will be scheduled for hearing in the normal course.

9. Section 1111(b) Election. An election pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §1111(b) must be filed no later than 7 days before the date of the Confirmation Hearing.

10. Confirmation Affidavit. Four days prior to the confirmation hearing scheduled in paragraph 2 above, the debtor shall file a confirmation affidavit which shall contain the factual basis upon which the debtor relies in establishing that each of the requirements of Section 1129 of the

Bankruptcy Code are met. The confirmation affidavit should be prepared so that by reading it the court can easily gain an understanding of the significant terms of the amended plan of reorganization and facts of the case.

This case came on for hearing on August 22 and 26, 2002, to consider various issues and matters relating to the confirmation of the debtor's proposed plan of reorganization in this case. After reviewing the various motions and matters and considering the position of all interested parties, it is

ORDERED:

1. Approval of the debtor's Second Amended Disclosure Statement (Doc. No. 100) is denied. The debtor is directed to file an amended disclosure statement incorporating the modifications discussed during the hearing no later than **August 30, 2002**.
2. The debtor, the Official Bondholders' Committee, and Bank of New York as Indenture Trustee are each allowed to include a separate solicitation letter in the solicitation package to be mailed to bondholders. The solicitations initially filed (Doc. Nos. 104, 105, and 106) are directed to be modified by the parties incorporating the modifications discussed during the hearings and to be filed with the Court no later than **August 30, 2002**.
3. In addition, counsel for the debtor is directed to prepare a transmittal letter for the solicitation package as well as two forms of ballots. One ballot shall be sent only to the bondholder classes, and the other ballot shall be sent only to the non-bondholder classes. The debtor is directed

to file these ballots and the transmittal letter with a notice of filing with the Court on or before **August 30, 2002.**

4. Any party objecting to the amended solicitation letters, the transmittal letter, or the form of the ballots, shall first attempt to resolve any objection informally and, if an informal resolution is not reached, to file written objections with the Court on or before **September 6, 2002.** If any objections are filed and not resolved by **September 6, 2002,** the confirmation hearing date will be delayed, and a hearing will be set on any written objections.

5. However, if all of the above pleadings are timely filed by **August 30, 2002,** and no written objections are unresolved by **September 6, 2002,** then a combined hearing to consider the adequacy of the most recently amended disclosure statement to be filed by the debtor, as well as to consider the confirmation of the debtor's amended plan of reorganization, will be held on **October 9, 2002, at 2:00 p.m.**

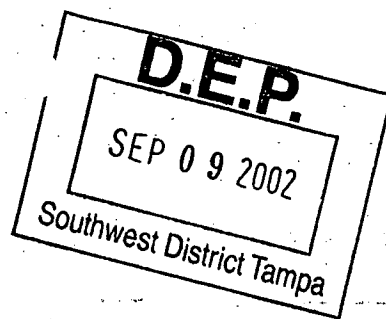

**ORDER SUSTAINING OBJECTIONS TO DEBTOR'S
AMENDED DISCLOSURE STATEMENT AND RULINGS ON RELATED MOTIONS**

This case came on for hearing on July 19, 2002, to consider the adequacy of the information contained in the debtor's Amended Disclosure Statement (Doc. No. 82) and the Objections filed by the Official Bondholders Committee and the Bank of New York as Indenture Trustee to the Debtor's Amended Disclosure Statement (Doc. Nos. 67, 72, and 93). After considering the evidence and the positions of interested parties, it is

ORDERED:

1. The Objections by the Official Bondholders Committee and the Bank of New York as Indenture Trustee are partially sustained. The debtor is directed to file an amended disclosure statement incorporating the additional information which must be included in its disclosure statement, further explained during the oral ruling, and to serve and file the amended disclosure statement on or before **August 12, 2002**.

2. The Official Bondholders Committee and the Bank of New York as Indenture Trustee are permitted to submit letters to enclose with the package soliciting creditor votes on the debtor's amended disclosure statement and plan. If a party desires to submit such a solicitation letter, the letter must be filed on or before **August 15, 2002**.

3. Any objections to the debtor's second amended disclosure statement or any objections to proposed solicitation letters submitted by the Official Bondholders Committee or the

Bank of New York as Indenture Trustee will be heard at a hearing to be held at **3:00 p.m. on August 22, 2002**. In addition, at this hearing, the Court will consider any other requests for procedures to ensure a fair solicitation for all creditors in this case at that hearing.

4. The Motion by Debtor to Extend Exclusivity is granted. The exclusive time for the debtor to file and solicit votes under a plan of reorganization is extended to and including **October 9, 2002**.

5. The Motion by the Official Bondholders Committee for Guidelines Under Rule 3017(e) (Doc. No. 69) is denied as moot and without prejudice to any renewed request.

6. The Motion by Official Bondholders Committee to Employ EER, LTD. as an Expert Consultant (Doc. No. 68) is denied without prejudice.

7. The Motion by the Bank of New York as Indenture Trustee to Extend the Deadline for the Election to Treat Claim as Fully Secured (Doc. No. 73) is granted. The period for the Bank of New York, as well as for individual bondholders, to determine whether to exercise its rights under Section 11(b) of the Bankruptcy Code is hereby extended to **October 2, 2002**. Any further extension shall be made by separate motion.

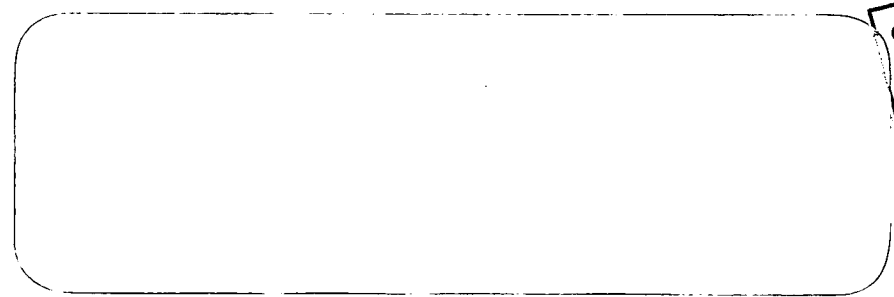

A form telling the bankruptcy court how much the debtor owed a creditor at the time the bankruptcy case was filed (the amount of the creditor's claim). This form must be filed with the clerk of the bankruptcy court where the bankruptcy case was filed.

Secured Claim

A claim is a secured claim to the extent that the creditor has a lien on property of the debtor (collateral) that gives the creditor the right to be paid from that property before creditors who do not have liens on the property.

Examples of liens are a mortgage on real estate and a security interest in a car, truck, boat, television set, or other item of property. A lien may have been obtained through a court proceeding before the bankruptcy case began; in some states a court judgment is a lien. In addition, to the extent a creditor also owes money to the debtor (has a right of setoff), the creditor's claim may be a secured claim. (See also *Unsecured Claim*.)

Unsecured Claim

If a claim is not a secured claim it is an unsecured claim. A claim may be partly secured and partly unsecured if the property on which a creditor has a lien is not worth enough to pay the creditor in full.

Unsecured Priority Claim

Certain types of unsecured claims are given priority, so they are to be paid in bankruptcy cases before most other unsecured claims (if there is sufficient money or property available to pay these claims). The most common types of priority claims are listed on the proof of claim form. Unsecured claims that are not specifically given priority status by the bankruptcy laws are classified as *Unsecured Nonpriority Claims*.

Items to be completed in Proof of Claim form (if not already filled in)

Court, Name of Debtor, and Case Number:

Fill in the name of the federal judicial district where the bankruptcy case was filed (for example, Central District of California), the name of the debtor in the bankruptcy case, and the bankruptcy case number. If you received a notice of the case from the court, all of this information is near the top of the notice.

Information about Creditor:

Complete the section giving the name, address, and telephone number of the creditor to whom the debtor owes money or property, and the debtor's account number, if any. If anyone else has already filed a proof of claim relating to this debt, if you never received notices from the bankruptcy court about this case, if your address differs from that to which the court sent notice, or if this proof of claim replaces or changes a proof of claim that was already filed, check the appropriate box on the form.

1. Basis for Claim:

Check the type of debt for which the proof of claim is being filed. If the type of debt is not listed, check "Other" and briefly describe the type of debt. If you were an employee of the debtor, fill in your social security number and the dates of work for which you were not paid.

2. Date Debt Incurred:

Fill in the date when the debt first was owed by the debtor.

3. Court Judgments:

If you have a court judgment for this debt, state the date the court entered the judgment.

4. Total Amount of Claim at Time Case Filed:

Fill in the total amount of the entire claim. If interest or other charges in addition to the principal amount of the claim are included, check the appropriate place on the form and attach an itemization of the interest and charges.

5. Secured Claim:

Check the appropriate place if the claim is a secured claim. You must state the type and value of property that is collateral for the claim, attach copies of the documentation of your lien, and state the amount past due on the claim as of the date the bankruptcy case was filed. A claim may be partly secured and partly unsecured. (See DEFINITIONS, above).

6. Unsecured Priority Claim:

Check the appropriate place if you have an unsecured priority claim, and state the amount entitled to priority. (See DEFINITIONS, above). A claim may be partly priority and partly nonpriority if, for example, the claim is for more than the amount given priority by the law. Check the appropriate place to specify the type of priority claim.

7. Credits:

By signing this proof of claim, you are stating under oath that in calculating the amount of your claim you have given the debtor credit for all payments received from the debtor.

8. Supporting Documents:

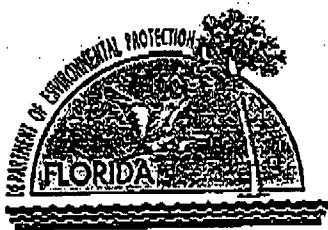

Since the modification was withdrawn, the Department agrees that the currently permitted quantities are those shown on the Storage Plan dated August 30, 1999 for 1606 tons of tires and 14 dumpsters of other waste materials.

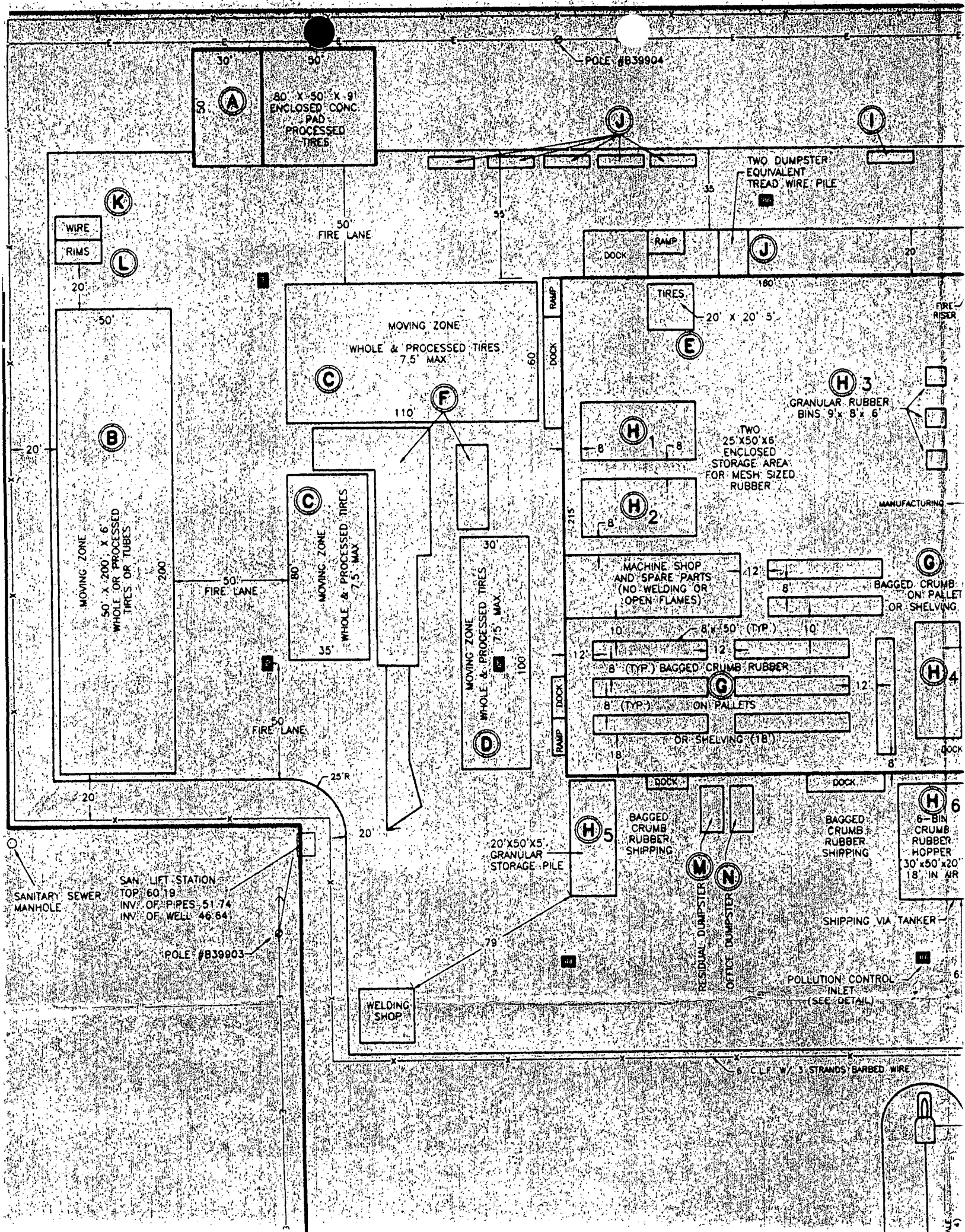

Apparently its request is not within the strictest interpretation of the Waste Tire Rule. While FDEP is willing to consider the exception, apparently it also requires the approval of the City of Wildwood's Fire Department. Management does not believe that it can obtain that approval at this time. About 2½ years ago, Global filed a Claim against the City for an amount in excess of \$500,000. Perhaps when that Claim is settled in the Court, Global can pursue that approval. In the meantime, if we can devise a different configuration of Moving Zones that achieves our goal and fits within the letter of the Waste Tire Rule, we will reapply for a modification.

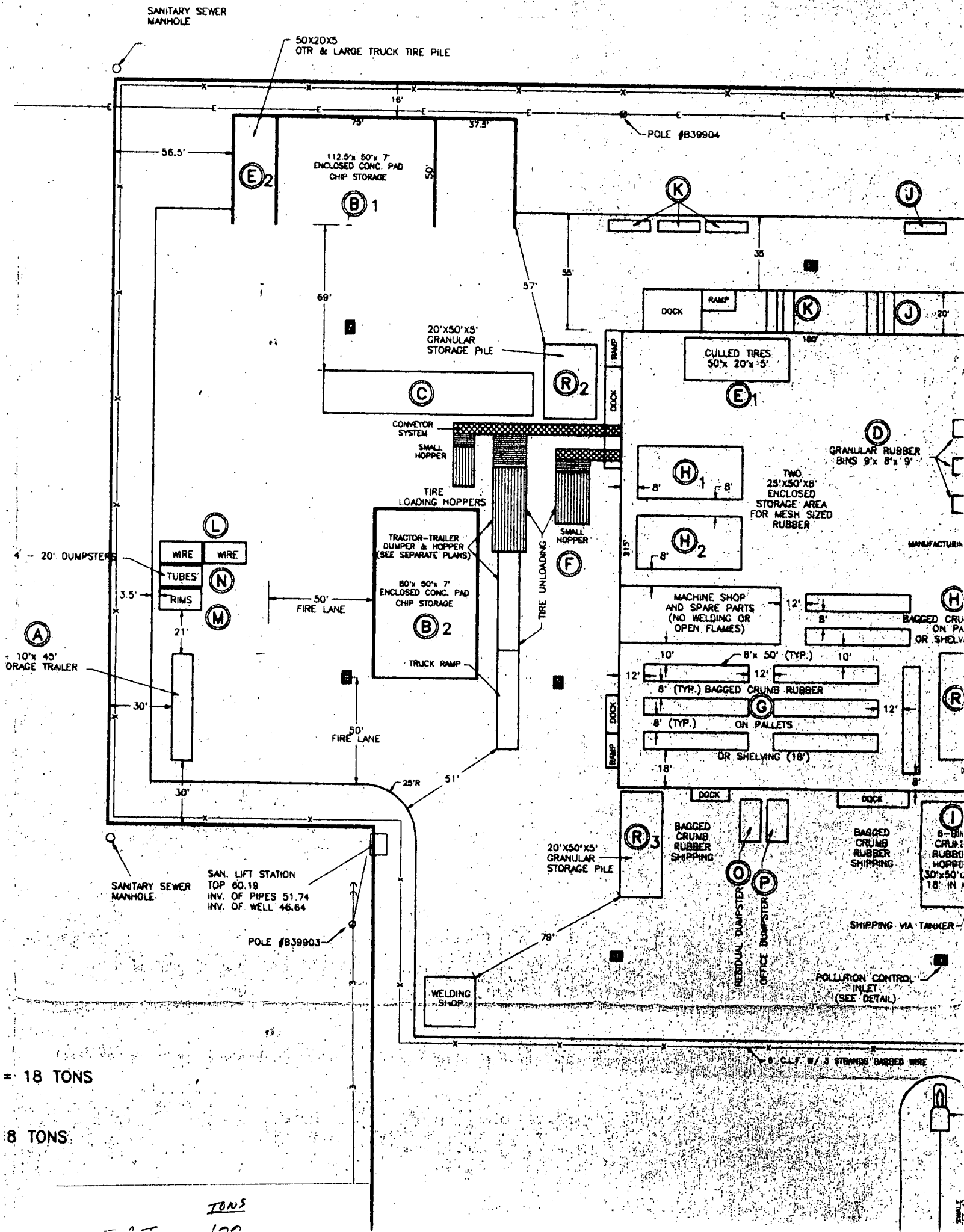

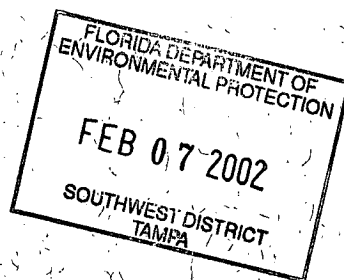



Dear Mr. Butera:

I want to take this opportunity to provide you and the employees in your departments with advance notification and explanation of planned changes within Global Tire Recycling. I am doing this because sometimes the rumor mill can get the facts wrong, which can cause unnecessary concerns among all of the participants in the industry.

In four to six months, Global will be using its Wildwood crumb rubber production operations as the basis for a new joint venture with another, larger company in the crumb rubber industry called Recovery Technologies Group, Inc. Eventually, that joint venture will double the production capacity for our current operations and make other improvements to enhance our product quality. This planned action has been necessitated by the fact that, despite Global's relatively large, sophisticated operations, its costs to make the Type B granular rubber product in strict accordance with the FDOT Specifications remain too high. This high cost of production, combined with the artificially deflated price in the market place for this product, makes it impossible for Global to be profitable and a long-term viable entity. The only answer to this predicament, given that we cannot count on rational pricing to return anytime soon, is to team up with another company that is willing to commit several million dollars to expand the current operations to try to achieve the required economies of scale to be profitable.

The transition to the new entity should be fairly "seamless" to most of the industry. The only noticeable change will be that, at some point, we will begin operating as Recovery Technologies Group of Florida, LLC, with all of the current personnel still running the operations. Of course, before that point we will be working behind the scene (so to speak) with the various departments within your Office to obtain the necessary approvals and permits for the new entity. I assume that we will need to submit a new application for a Waste Tire Processing Permit in the name of the new entity; and that we will have to submit

a new Storage Plan and provide for the corresponding new Financial Assurances instrument. We also will need the Storm Water Runoff Permit and Air Quality Permit for the new entity. Also, at a later date before the actual expansion is implemented, I know that we will have to obtain all of the necessary approvals before that work actually is undertaken. It is a long and difficult course that we have chosen to take; but I am confident that it will be worth it. We will coordinate all of this through the appropriate personnel within your departments who always are so helpful in that regard.

Thank you for the opportunity to explain to you the upcoming developments within Global. We look forward to a continuing, long-term relationship.



On Thursday, May 24th at approximately 11:30 AM, there was an incident at the Wildwood facility, which I reported to you via telephone the next morning. I am following up with this report.

Either there was a short in the motor, or there was a build-up of scrap tire wire at the end of the discharge belt conveyor that takes this material through the sheet metal wall to the outside. This electrical short, or the material build-up, either caused the motor to over-heat, or the metal itself overheated, such that the fiber that is entrapped with the metal ignited. It was a very windy day, which, no doubt, helped to ignite the fire.

That fiber then dropped down on to the pile of metal and fiber, which caused most of the fiber in that pile to ignite as a fire outside the building. The entire pile of material was about 20 tons, of which about 17.5 tons was metal. There was about 1/2 a ton of fiber mixed in with the steel that actually burned. Mixed in with this material was about two tons of granular rubber. Some of the rubber "fines" may have ignited, but most of the rubber did not burn; however, it did get hot enough to begin to smolder.

As you may know, we keep a good supply of F-500, non-hazardous, fire suppressant material on hand, so our employees were able to quickly contain the fire - but not totally extinguish it. We had called the local fire department as standard procedure. They arrived and put out the remaining portion of the fire and they continued to hose down the pile to ensure that the smoldering rubber did not ignite.

At no time was the facility, or human life in danger; and there was no adverse impact to the environment. No tires, or rubber chips, or finished rubber product material ever caught on fire. The fiber material mostly "flashed", so there was very little run off of burnt material - - maybe just some ashes. Most of the granular rubber that was mixed in with the wire and fiber did not ignite, or melt. There was no visible run off of rubber material, or oily substance, into the drains, which are connected to our retention pond - - not any wetlands. The sprinklers inside of the building did not turn on, as the fire was not inside.

Just to be safe, we shut down the operations until we could have inspections performed by an electrical P.E. and a structural P.E. They confirmed that there was only superficial damage. The City gave us authorization to resume operation, which we did the next afternoon.

The material in question has been removed from the premises by Waste Management, as they would have done in the normal course of business.

To ensure that this does not occur again, we have instituted a procedure of more frequent monitoring of that conveyor to check for possible build-up of wire material in the belt. As a fail-safe measure, this week we will install a misting device over the end of the conveyor and over the pile that is under it. This will wet the fiber and cool the wire to prevent a flash combustion, even if there is another wire build-up in the conveyor, or over-heating of the motor.

Enclosed are some photos. You will note the small area where the fire was contained and the superficial damage to the outside of the building. One photo shows an example of the burned material. The fiber has been burned off, while the rubber still is in tact with the wire.

You also can see that the company's retention pond is completely dry. There are no oily substances of any type in the pond. The small amount of water that was used to fight the fire went down the storm drain to the short canal that connects to the retention pond. There is about 1/4" to 1/2" of loose, dry, granular rubber in the canal section. It is the result of over 2 1/2 years of surface run off from the paved area of the facility. It is non-hazardous; but, just to demonstrate our sensitivity to the communities' potential concerns, this week we will have a backhoe operator scrape out about 6" from the entire length of the canal. That material will be placed in a dumpster and will be removed by Waste Management.

Gentlemen:

It has been brought to my attention that the City of Wildwood has asked for your comments and actions with respect to road debris that it has attributed to Global's waste tire recycling facility. It has provided you with its correspondence to Global on the matter; however, it has not provided you with the corresponding responses and actions by Global. Let me do that here via the attachments to this letter.

For over two and one-half years, Global has been disposing of its scrap wire in a very responsible manner. It has used the services of Waste Management. This practice has not changed and there never has been a problem. Yet on April 4th, the City notified us that it believed that our scrap wire was the cause of some flat tires.

Rather than getting defensive or argumentative about it, we took a very proactive position. We began lining the back of every dumpster to ensure that not even the smallest piece of wire could escape through the small cracks around the rear door. We began sweeping off every dumpster and pushing all material away from the edges. All dumpsters are covered with a tarp. We then purchased a 5' bar magnet and began a daily routine of running it up and down the roads in the industrial park to ensure that no wire was escaping the dumpsters. None has been detected.


Even though Global instituted these extraordinary measures, apparently Waste Management had an accident. They must not have secured their dumpster's door properly, such that at some point along SR 301, it came open. This allowed some scrap wire and rubber to fall onto the highway. The driver eventually was pulled over and he secured the door. Unfortunately, he did not clean up the wire and he did not request

GTR means ground tire rubber

anyone from his headquarters to do so either. That would have been the responsible action to take, rather than leaving it to the City to clean up. The City's response was to notify everyone but the responsible party, namely, Waste Management.

The City has tried to portray Global as being unresponsive and irresponsible. Let me assure you that that is not the case. Global takes its responsibilities to dispose of all waste materials in a legal and environmentally sound manner very seriously. Its proactive actions support that corporate policy. As a result, contrary to the City's allegations, there is no ongoing problem with respect to waste disposal at Global's facility. I would welcome a visit at any time by you to verify this and to discuss it further, if warranted.

Dear Mr. Dixon:

A member of your staff called us last week regarding road debris along Hwy 301. We really appreciate your making us aware that scrap wire and rubber again being seen coming out of one of the Waste Management dumpsters.

We discussed the problem with the Waste Management driver. He said that various motorists, who had been trying to get his attention, had flagged him down. Apparently, he had not secured the door on the dumpster after he had unloaded it the last time. As a result, it was flapping open as he drove along the highway, which let material fall out the back.

We hope that this is the first and last time that this will occur as a result of an insecure door. Waste Management has been notified of the problem. We also have alerted our people to check to ensure that they have secured the door properly.

Other than this incident, we think that we have corrected the problem with scrap material falling onto the streets by changing the way we load waste trucks. Thank you for your letter of April 4th on the subject of road debris. I apologize for not being aware of the fact that some of the waste material that Waste Management has been hauling away for Global was falling onto the street.

I have studied the matter and the following will be the corrective actions taken. First, all material on the top ledge and near the sides will be swept, or pushed, inward. Any material on the sides of the dumpster will be swept off before it leaves the property. With the cover that goes across the entire top of the dumpster, this will ensure that no loose material will either fall off or be blown off during transit.

Second, a liner will be placed across the small opening around the back door of the dumpster before it is loaded. This will ensure that no loose material will trickle out of the crack during transit.

Third, we will purchase a five-foot bar magnet that can be attached to the front of our BobCat. We will periodically drive with it up and down Industrial Drive to confirm that no wire is escaping from any of Global's dumpsters. If any is detected, we will take the necessary corrective actions to eliminate it.

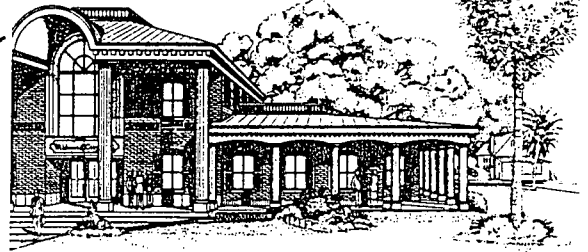

This is a result of your trucks being overloaded, causing debris to fall out from the sides and back of the "roll off". Also the "roll off" of the tailgate is letting strands of wire fall out of the bin continuously as the vehicle travels. We have followed this trail of wire onto Highway 44.

This Department as well as the Public Works Director, Gene Kornegay, is willing to meet with you to hear your options in an attempt to resolve this issue. You may contact this office at 352/330-1330 extension 119 or 120 to schedule an appointment.

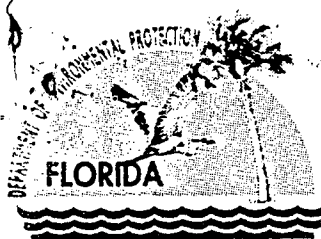



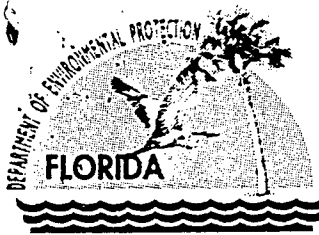

This permit is issued under the provisions of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes, and Florida Administrative Code Rule(s) 62-4 and 62-711. The above named permittee is hereby authorized to perform the work or operate the facility shown on the application and approved drawing(s), plans, and other documents, attached hereto or on file with the Department and made a part hereof and specifically described as follows:

To construct and operate a waste tire processing facility (approximately 10 acres), referred to as the Global Tire Recycling Waste Tire Facility, subject to the specific conditions attached, for storing and processing waste tires, located at 1201 Industrial Road, 2 miles east of I-75 and north of S.R. 44, in Wildwood, Sumter County, Florida. The specific conditions attached are for the construction and operation of:

1. Waste Tire Processing Facility

Replaces Permit No.: N/A, new facility.

This permit contains compliance items summarized in Attachment 1 that shall be complied with and submitted to the Department by the dates noted. If the compliance dates are not met and submittals are not received by the Department on the dates noted, enforcement action may be initiated to assure compliance with the conditions of this permit.

"Protect, Conserve and Manage Florida's Environment and Natural Resources"

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations and restrictions set forth in this permit, are "permit conditions" and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Sections 403.141, 403.161, 403.727, or 403.859 through 403.861, Florida Statutes. The permittee is placed on notice that the Department will review this permit periodically and may initiate enforcement action for any violation of these conditions.
2. This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department.
3. As provided in subsections 403.087(6) and 403.722(5), F.S., the issuance of this permit does not convey any vested rights or any exclusive privileges. Neither does it authorize any injury to public or private property or any invasion of personal rights, nor any infringement of federal, State, or local laws or regulations. This permit is not a waiver of or approval of any other Department permit that may be required for other aspects of the total project which are not addressed in this permit.
4. This permit conveys no title to land or water, does not constitute State recognition or acknowledgment of title, and does not constitute authority for the use of submerged lands unless herein provided and the necessary title or leasehold interests have been obtained from the State. Only the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund may express State opinion as to title.
5. This permit does not relieve the permittee from liability for harm or injury to human health or welfare, animal, or plant life, or property caused by the construction or operation of this permitted source, or from penalties therefore; nor does it allow the permittee to cause pollution in contravention of Florida Statutes and Department rules, unless specifically authorized by an order from the Department.
6. The permittee shall properly operate and maintain the facility and systems of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) that are installed and used by the permittee to achieve compliance with the conditions of this permit, are required by Department rules. This provision includes the operation of backup or auxiliary facilities or similar systems when necessary to achieve compliance with the conditions of the permit and when required by Department rules.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

7. The permittee, by accepting this permit, specifically agrees to allow authorized Department personnel, upon presentation of credentials or other documents as may be required by law and at reasonable times, access to the premises where the permitted activity is located or conducted to:

- (a) Have access to and copy any records that must be kept under conditions of the permit;
- (b) Inspect the facility, equipment, practices, or operations regulated or required under this permit; and
- (c) Sample or monitor any substances or parameters at any location reasonably necessary to assure compliance with this permit or Department rules.

Reasonable time may depend on the nature of the concern being investigated.

8. If, for any reason, the permittee does not comply with or will be unable to comply with any condition or limitation specified in this permit, the permittee shall immediately provide the Department with the following information:

- (a) A description of and cause of noncompliance; and
- (b) The period of noncompliance, including dates and times; or, if not corrected, the anticipated time the noncompliance is expected to continue, and steps being taken to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance.

The permittee shall be responsible for any and all damages which may result and may be subject to enforcement action by the Department for penalties or for revocation of this permit.

9. In accepting this permit, the permittee understands and agrees that all records, notes, monitoring data and other information relating to the construction or operation of this permitted source which are submitted to the Department may be used by the Department as evidence in any enforcement case involving the permitted source arising under the Florida Statutes or Department rules, except where such use is prescribed by Sections 403.111 and 403.73, F.S. Such evidence shall only be used to the extent it is consistent with the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure and appropriate evidentiary rules.

10. The permittee agrees to comply with changes in Department rules and Florida Statutes after a reasonable time for compliance; provided, however, the permittee does not waive any other rights granted by Florida Statutes or Department rules.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

11. This permit is transferable only upon Department approval in accordance with Rule 62-4.120 and 62-730.300, Florida Administrative Code, as applicable. The permittee shall be liable for any non-compliance of the permitted activity until the transfer is approved by the Department.

12. This permit or a copy thereof shall be kept at the work site of the permitted activity.

13. This permit also constitutes:

- () Determination of Best Available Control Technology (BACT)
- () Determination of Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD)
- () Certification of compliance with State Water Quality Standards (Section 401, PL 92-500)
- () Compliance with New Source Performance Standards

14. The permittee shall comply with the following:

- (a) Upon request, the permittee shall furnish all records and plans required under Department rules. During enforcement actions, the retention period for all records will be extended automatically unless otherwise stipulated by the Department.
- (b) The permittee shall hold at the facility or other location designated by this permit records of all monitoring information (including all calibration and maintenance records and all original strip chart recordings for continuous monitoring instrumentation) required by the permit, copies of all reports required by this permit, and records of all data used to complete the application for this permit. These materials shall be retained at least three years from the date of the sample, measurement, report, or application unless otherwise specified by Department rule.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

- (c) Records of monitoring information shall include:
1. the date, exact place, and time of sampling or measurements;
 2. the person responsible for performing the sampling or measurements;
 3. the dates analyses were performed;
 4. the person responsible for performing the analyses;
 5. the analytical techniques or methods used;
 6. the results of such analyses.

15. When requested by the Department, the permittee shall within a reasonable time furnish any information required by law which is needed to determine compliance with the permit. If the permittee becomes aware that relevant facts were not submitted or were incorrect in the permit application or in any report to the Department, such facts or information shall be corrected promptly.

16. In the case of an underground injection control permit, the following permit conditions also shall apply:

- (a) All reports or information required by the Department shall be certified as being true, accurate and complete.
- (b) Reports of compliance or noncompliance with, or any progress reports on, requirements contained in any compliance schedule of this permit shall be submitted no later than 14 days following each schedule date.
- (c) Notification of any noncompliance which may endanger health or the environment shall be reported verbally to the Department within 24 hours and again within 72 hours, and a final written report provided within two weeks.
 1. The verbal reports shall contain any monitoring or other information which indicate that any contaminant may endanger an underground source of drinking water and any noncompliance with a permit condition or malfunction of the injection system which may cause fluid migration into or between underground sources of drinking water.
 2. The written submission shall contain a description of and a discussion of the cause of the noncompliance and, if it has not been corrected, the anticipated time the noncompliance is expected to continue, the steps being taken to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance, and all information required by Rule 62-28.230(4)(b), F.A.C.
- (d) The Department shall be notified at least 180 days before conversion or abandonment of an injection well, unless abandonment within a lesser period of time is necessary to protect waters of the State.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

17. The following conditions also shall apply to a hazardous waste facility permit.

(a) The following reports shall be submitted to the Department:

1. Manifest discrepancy report. If a significant discrepancy in a manifest is discovered, the permittee shall attempt to rectify the discrepancy. If not resolved within 15 days after the waste is received, the permittee shall immediately submit a letter report, including a copy of the manifest, to the Department.
2. Unmanifested waste report. The permittee shall submit an unmanifested waste report to the Department within 15 days of receipt of unmanifested waste.
3. Biennial report. A biennial report covering facility activities during the previous calendar year shall be submitted by March 1 of each even numbered year pursuant to Chapter 62-730, F.A.C.

(b) Notification of any noncompliance which may endanger health or the environment, including the release of any hazardous waste that may endanger public drinking water supplies or the occurrence of a fire or explosion from the facility which could threaten the environment or human health outside the facility, shall be reported verbally to the Department within 24 hours, and a written report shall be provided within 5 days. The verbal report shall include the name, address, I.D. number, and telephone number of the facility, its owner or operator, the name and quantity of materials involved, the extent of any injuries, an assessment of actual or potential hazards, and the estimated quantity and disposition of recovered material. The written submission shall contain:

1. A description and cause of the noncompliance.
2. If not corrected, the expected time of correction, and the steps being taken to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance.

(c) Reports of compliance or noncompliance with, or any progress reports on, requirements in any compliance schedule shall be submitted no later than 14 days after each schedule date.

(d) All reports or information required by the Department by a hazardous waste permittee shall be signed by a person authorized to sign a permit application.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

1. **Classification.** This site shall be classified as a waste tire processing facility and shall be constructed, operated and closed in accordance with all applicable requirements of Chapters 62-4 and 62-711, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.).

2. **Permit Application Documentation.** This permit is valid for construction and operation of the waste tire processing facility in accordance with the reports, plans and other information as follows:

- February 1998 Application and supporting information by Global received February 13, 1998;
- Response by Global and supporting information dated April 17, 1998 received April 20, 1998;
- Response by Global received June 3, 1998;
- Revised Site Plan (with storage locations and quantities - Plan B) revised June 30, 1998 and revised Maintenance and Operation Instructions revised June 30, 1998, received July 1, 1998;
- Revised Site Plan (with storage locations and quantities - Plan A) revised August 30, 1999 and revised Emergency Preparedness Manual revised August 27, 1999, received September 13, 1999;
- and in accordance with all applicable requirements of Department rules. Items required for compliance with this permit, including but not limited to receipt and approval of Certification of Construction Completion with record drawings, and proof of financial assurance, shall be provided prior to acceptance of waste tires or operation unless otherwise approved in writing by the Department.

3. **Certification of Construction Completeness.** Within sixty (60) days after the specified construction has been completed, and prior to acceptance of waste tires or operation, the following activities shall be completed:

- a. The owner or operator shall submit a Certification of Construction Completion, Form 62-701.900(2), signed and sealed by the professional engineer in charge of construction to the Department for approval, and shall arrange for Department representatives to inspect the construction in the company of the permittee, the engineer, and the facility operator.
- b. The owner or operator shall submit Record Drawings showing all changes (i.e. additions, deletions, revisions to the plans previously approved by the Department).

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

c. The owner or operator shall submit a narrative indicating all changes in plans and the cause of the deviations and certification by the design engineer to the Department.

4. **Permit Modifications.** Any construction or operation activities not previously approved as part of this permit shall require a separate Department permit unless the Department determines a permit modification to be more appropriate. Permits shall be modified in accordance with the requirements of 62-4.080, F.A.C. A modification which is reasonably expected to lead to substantially different environmental impacts which require a detailed review by the Department is considered a substantial modification.

5. **Permit Renewal.** No later than one hundred eighty (180) days before the expiration of the Department permit, the permittee shall apply for a renewal of a permit on forms and in a manner prescribed by the Department, in order to assure conformance with all applicable Department rules. Permits shall be renewed at least every five years as required by F.A.C. 62-4.070(4).

6. **Prohibitions.** The prohibitions of F.A.C. Rule 62-711.400 shall not be violated.

7. **Financial Assurance.** The permittee shall provide financial assurance for the facility in accordance with F.A.C. 62-711.500(3).

a. All costs for closure shall be adjusted and submitted **annually, by March 1st each year** to: Solid Waste Manager, Solid Waste Section, Department of Environmental Protection, 3804 Coconut Palm Drive, Tampa, Florida 33619-8318.

b. Proof that the financial mechanism has been adequately funded shall be submitted **annually, by September 1st each year**, to: Financial Coordinator, Solid Waste Section, Department of Environmental Protection, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400.

8. **Processing and Storage Requirements.** All waste tires shall be processed and stored in accordance with F.A.C. 62-711.530 and 62-711.540, and the revised Site Plans with storage area locations (Plan A and Plan B, attached).

- Storage at the processing facility is limited to either 1620 tons of waste tires (including other miscellaneous wastes) for Plan A, or 1821 tons of waste tires (including other miscellaneous wastes) for Plan B, and shall comply with the requirements of FAC Rule 62-711.530. **Either Plan A only or Plan B only will be required for compliance, no mixing and matching, and each plan requiring written approval of related cost estimates and proof of financial assurance prior to implementation.**

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

- If the facility has reached its permitted storage capacity for any area, the permittee shall not accept additional waste tires until sufficient capacity has been restored.
- All incoming waste tires shall be handled on a first-in, first-out basis. In the event of equipment breakdown or scheduled maintenance, the permittee shall ensure that sufficient reserve equipment is operating at the site within 72 hours of occurrence or the facility shut down.
- At least 75 percent of the whole tires, used tires, and processed tires that are delivered to or are contained on the site of the waste tire processing facility at the beginning of each calendar year shall be processed or removed for disposal or recycling from the facility during the year, or disposed of at a permitted solid waste management facility.

Amended 09/24/1999.

9. **Operation Plan and Operating Record.** A copy of the Department approved permit, operational plan, construction reports and record drawings, and supporting information shall be kept at the facility at all times for reference and inspections.
10. **Operating Personnel.** A trained supervisor or foreman shall be responsible for maintaining the facility in an orderly, safe, and sanitary manner. Sufficient personnel shall be employed to adequately operate the facility.
11. **Reporting Requirements.** Waste Tire Processing Facility Quarterly Report, Form #62-711.900(4) attached summarizing facility operations shall be submitted **quarterly** to the Department by January 20th, April 20th, July 20th, and October 20th, pursuant to FAC Rule 62-711.530(5).
12. **Fire Safety Survey.** A fire safety survey shall be conducted at least annually and the survey report shall be made available to the Department upon request.
13. **Stormwater System Management.** Stormwater shall be managed as required by F.A.C. 62-711.540(3)(a). The site shall be managed to divert stormwater around and away from the storage piles.
14. **Emergency Preparedness Manual.** A copy of the facility's emergency preparedness manual shall be kept at the site and a copy shall be kept at an off-site location.
15. **Control of Nuisance Conditions.** The owner or operator shall control mosquitoes and rodents as so to protect the public health and welfare. The operating authority shall be responsible for the control of odors and fugitive particulates arising from this operation. Such control shall minimize the creation of nuisance conditions on adjoining property. Complaints received from the general public, and confirmed by Department personnel upon site inspection, shall constitute a nuisance condition, and the permittee must take immediate corrective action to abate the nuisance.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

16. **Facility Maintenance and Repair.** The site shall be properly maintained including all equipment and building maintenance, minimized grass, underbrush and other flammable vegetation, prevention of ponding, and maintenance of berms and other systems designed to protect water bodies from liquid runoff from a potential waste tire fire. In the event of damage to any portion of the waste tire site, fire, or failure of any portion of the waste tire processing or storage systems, the permittee shall immediately (within 24 hours) notify the Department of Environmental Protection explaining such occurrence and remedial measures to be taken and time needed for repairs. Written detailed notification shall be submitted to the Department within seven (7) days following the occurrence.

17. **Professional Certification.** Where required by Chapter 471 (P.E.) or Chapter 492 (P.G.), Florida Statutes, applicable portions of permit applications and supporting documents which are submitted to the Department for public record shall be signed and sealed by the professional(s) who prepared or approved them.

18. **Closure.** The facility shall be closed in accordance with the requirements of FAC Rule 62-711.700. The waste tire processing facility owner or operator shall notify the Department at least ninety (90) days prior to the date when tires will no longer be accepted for storage or processing, as required by F.A.C. 62-711.700(2).

19. **General Conditions.** The permittee shall be aware of and operate under the "General Conditions". General Conditions are binding upon the permittee and enforceable pursuant to Chapter 403, Florida Statutes.

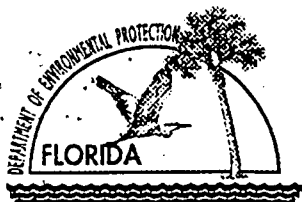

Enclosed is Modification Number 136808-002 to Permit Number 136808-001-WT, issued pursuant to Section(s) 403.087(1), Florida Statutes.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's proposed agency action may file a timely petition for an administrative hearing under sections 120.569 and 120.57 of the Florida Statutes, or may choose to pursue mediation as an alternative remedy under section 120.573 before the deadline for filing a petition. Choosing mediation will not adversely affect the right to a hearing if mediation does not result in a settlement. The procedures for pursuing mediation are set forth below.

A person may pursue mediation by reaching a mediation agreement with all parties to the proceeding (which include the applicant, the Department, and any person who has filed a timely and sufficient petition for a hearing) and by showing how the substantial interests of each mediating party are affected by the Department's action or proposed action. The agreement must be filed in (received by) the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station 35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, by the same deadline as set forth above for the filing of a petition.

The agreement to mediate must include the following:

- (a) The names, addresses, and telephone numbers of any persons who may attend the mediation;
- (b) The names, address, and telephone number of the mediator selected by the parties, or a provision for selecting a mediator within a specified time;
- (c) The agreed allocation of the costs and fees associated with the mediation;
- (d) The agreement of the parties on the confidentiality of discussions and documents introduced during mediation;

(e) The date, time, and place of the first mediation session, or a deadline for holding the first session, if no mediator has yet been chosen;

(f) The name of each party's representative who shall have authority to settle or recommend settlement; and

(g) Either an explanation of how the substantial interests of each mediating party will be affected by the action or proposed action addressed in this notice of intent or a statement clearly identifying the petition for hearing that each party has already filed, and incorporating it by reference.

(h) The signatures of all parties or their authorized representatives.

As provided in section 120.573 of the Florida Statutes, the timely agreement of all parties to mediate will toll the time limitations imposed by sections 120.569 and 120.57 for requesting and holding an administrative hearing. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, the mediation must be concluded within sixty days of the execution of the agreement. If mediation results in settlement of the administrative dispute, the Department must enter a final order incorporating the agreement of the parties. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by such a modified final decision of the Department have a right to petition for a hearing only in accordance with the requirements for such petitions set forth above, and must therefore file their petitions within fourteen days of receipt of this notice. If mediation terminates without settlement of the dispute, the Department shall notify all parties in writing that the administrative hearing processes under sections 120.569 and 120.57 remain available for disposition of the dispute, and the notice will specify the deadlines that they will apply for challenging the agency action and electing remedies under those two statutes.


The petition for an administrative hearing must conform to the requirements of Chapters 62-103 and 28-5.201, F.A.C., and must be filed (received) in the Department's Office of General Counsel, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, 32399-2400, within fourteen (14) days of receipt of this notice. Failure to file a petition within fourteen (14) days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative determination (hearing) pursuant to Section 120.57, Florida Statutes. This permit is final and effective on the date filed with the Clerk of the Department unless a request for extension of time in which to file a petition is filed within the time specified for filing a petition and conforms to Rule 62-103.070, F.A.C. Upon timely filing of a petition or a request for an extension of time this permit will not be effective until further Order of the Department.

The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date the Final Order is filed with the Clerk of the Department.

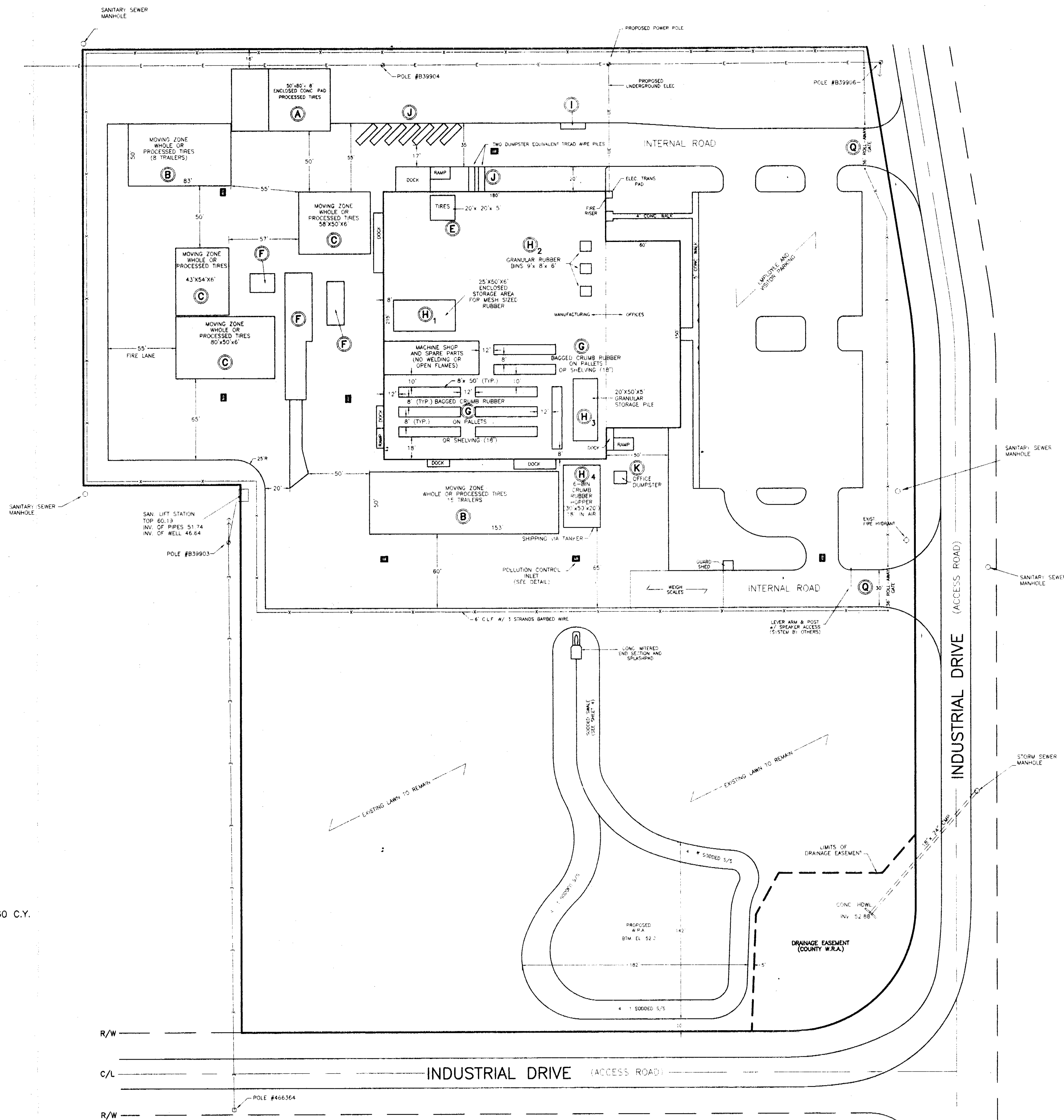

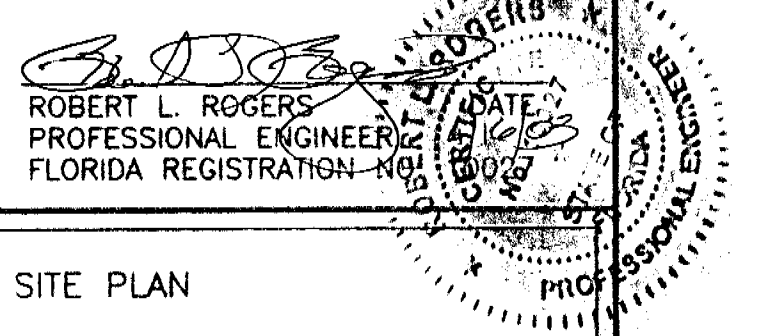
