In order to complete review of your application pursuant to Section 403.087(4), Florida Statutes (F.S.), Sections 62-4.055, 62-4.070(1), 62-701.320, and 62-711.300 (2) Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), please provide the following information.

- I. Please revise the closure cost estimate to show the tonnage of tires that have been processed but do not meet Wheelabrator Ridge Energy's specifications for the disposal at Florida Tire Recycling, Inc.
- II. Please submit a letter from Wheelabrator Ridge Energy Inc. stating that there will be no charge to the State of Florida as a 3rd party for disposal of processed tires that meet Wheelabrator Ridge Energy's specifications.
- III. Please provide a copy of Wheelabrator Ridge Energy's specifications.
- IV. Please provide a letter from a corporate officer of Florida Tire Recycling, Inc. to authorize John Wilson to sign the application.

NOTE: Rule 62-4.055(1), F.A.C. states in part that within thirty days after receipt of an application for a permit and the correct processing fee the Department shall review the application and shall request submittal of additional information the Department is authorized by law to request. The applicant shall have ninety days after the Department mails a timely request for additional information to submit that information to the Department. If an applicant requires more than ninety days in which to respond to a request for additional information, the applicant may notify the Department in writing of the circumstances, at which time the application shall be held in active status for one additional period of up to ninety days. Additional extensions shall be granted for good cause shown by the applicant. A showing that the applicant is making a diligent effort to obtain the requested additional information shall constitute good cause. Failure of an applicant to provide the timely requested information by the applicable deadline shall result in denial of the application.

In addition, all submittals must be signed and sealed by a professional engineer licensed in the state of Florida.
