I am in receipt of your letter dated July 2, 1999 along with field inspection check lists. In compliance with your request, all items marked "NO" will be responded to.

West Pasco Class III Landfill

Item #14 FAC 62-701.500 (1)

62-701.500 Landfill Operation Requirements.

(1) Operating personnel. All Class I and Class III landfills shall have at least one trained operator at the landfill during all times when the landfill receives waste. Trained operators are those who have satisfied the requirements of Chapter 16 62-703, FAC. If an operator is employed at a Class II landfill, that person must be a trained operator. All Class I and Class III landfills shall have at least one spotter at each working face at all times when the landfill receives waste to detect unauthorized wastes.

Response: You are correct. The TREEO Center program will be initiated for spotters. The first available class is 10/19/99 in Tampa. Pasco County will send two spotters to the course.

Item #17 All permit specific conditions compiled with response:

Item #17 refers to 62-701.320 (1) and refers to operating a facility with permit from the Department. I do believe Pasco County has a proper permit, 3051-267334 expires 5/15/2001. Specific condition #6 in the permit refers to FAC 62-701.300 (8). This section refers to depositing, Lead Acid batteries, used oil, yard trash, white goods or whole waste tires in a landfill. I am certifying to you Pasco County does not landfill any of the above listed items.

Specific condition A6 of Pasco County permit refers to 62-701.520 FAC refers to Special Waste Handling - the only section that may be applicable to west Pasco Class I or Class III sites would be 62-701.520 (5) contaminated soil. If this is the intent of the point made in the field inspection report, I shall be pleased to pass the information on to the County's hazardous waste manager for corrective action by the hazardous waste section.

I have responded to all of the department's concerns pertaining to East Pasco Class I landfill. Please communicate with me directly if you have any questions at 727-856-0119.

West Pasco Class I Landfill

There are no "NO's" noted on the West Pasco Class I Field Inspection Report, therefore, response is not required as per your letter of July 2, 1999.

East Pasco Class I Landfill

Two responses are required for East Pasco landfill as per your July 2, 1999 letter.

Item #11 Approved Operating Plans and Permits and Waste Records Maintained

62-701.500 (2), (3), (4) and (13)

Response - The East Pasco Class I landfill had on hand the proper permit, unfortunately the landfill operator showed the Department regulator a previous Department issued permit. This matter will be corrected by the time you receive this response.

Item #17 All specific conditions complied with 62-701.320 (1).

Response - 62-701.320 (1) reads "no solid waste management facility shall be constructed, operated, maintained, modified or closed without a permit issued by the Department". To the best of my knowledge, Pasco County is operating under permit S051-274380 expiration date 10/15/2001.

Item #24 Method and sequence of filling waste according to plans 62-701.500 (2) (f).

Response - Method and sequence of filling waste (2) (f). It is Pasco County's belief that the filling is in compliance with the approved plan. So little material has been received at the facility the fill area is in compliance and within the proper area.

Inquiry, frequency, amount and quality of initial cover as required 62-701.500 (7) (e).

Response - Pasco County believes that we are in compliance with subparagraph (7) (e). However, an inspection check will be made to determine if adequate cover has been maintained due to frequent and heavy recent rains. If, however, intermediate cover has been reduced, additional cover will be provided within 7 to 10 days of the Department's receipt of this letter.

May I take this opportunity to thank you for your concern and help regarding Pasco County's efforts to properly manage it's Solid Waste Facilities. Through mutual cooperative efforts we can succeed in improving the environment.

All matters discussed in the field inspection reports will be rectified within 10 working days. The training of spotters will take a little longer. Action have been taken on a training program and I will keep you informed of Pasco County's progress in this matter.

Dear Mr. Mannella:

In accordance with the (Domestic Waste Residuals Rule) FAC 62-640.100(6)(k)8.,), the referenced material must be disposed of in accordance with FAC 62-701. In FAC 62-701.340(3)d. Class III waste is defined as yard trash, construction and demolition debris, waste tires, asbestos, carpet, cardboard, paper, plastic, glass, furniture, other than appliances or other materials approved by the Department which are not expected to produce leachate which poses a threat to public health or the environment. At this time the Department cannot authorize the staging or disposal of the referenced waste in the Class III cell. All solid wastes consisting of residuals and/or streetsweepings were removed from the definition of CL III material when the solid waste rule was revised on January 6, 1993. The Department's experience with the referenced material has been heavy metal concentrations settling out and adhering to the solids in the sumps or pump stations.

The Department has no objection to disposal of the material in the West Pasco Class I Landfill, Cell SW-1. Since one of the six characteristics as defined in FAC 62-701.200(53) of initial cover is to suppress odors, the Department can not authorize the use of residuals from sewer cleaning of lift and pump stations for daily cover as they will probably generate odors and a potential for diseases. This referenced material must be covered daily.

"Protect, Conserve and Manage Florida's Environment and Natural Resources"

62-640.100 Scope, Intent, Purpose, and Applicability.

- (1) All domestic wastewater treatment facilities which use biological treatment processes generate domestic wastewater residuals as a by-product of the treatment process. The Department finds that unregulated use, disposal, or land application of these residuals poses a threat to the environment and public health. It is the intent of the Department in this chapter to regulate the management, use, and land application of residuals so as to ensure protection of the environment and public health.
 - (2) The Department also intends in this chapter to encourage the beneficial use of residuals.
- (3) This chapter establishes minimum requirements for residuals which are to be applied to land for agricultural purposes, distributed and marketed, or used for land reclamation. Included are residuals which are composted with yard trash, wood chips, or similar bulking agents and ultimately applied to land or distributed and marketed.
- (4) This chapter also establishes minimum requirements for septage which will be treated at facilities permitted by the Department and will be applied to land for agricultural purposes or land reclamation.
- (5) The purpose of Chapter 62-640, F.A.C., is to provide minimum standards for the treatment of residuals and septage to be applied to land or distributed and marketed, establish land application criteria, and define requirements for agricultural operations which have received or will receive residuals or septage.
 - (6) Applicability.
- (a) Requirements in this chapter shall apply to domestic wastewater treatment facilities, residuals management facilities, and septage management facilities that generate residuals or septage which are to be applied to agricultural sites or reclamation sites, or which are distributed and marketed.
- (b) The requirements in this chapter shall also apply to appliers or distributors of residuals or residual products, and to owners or operators of agricultural sites or reclamation sites which receive residuals.
- (c) Unless specifically provided otherwise in this chapter, requirements in this chapter shall apply to all facilities which generate residuals or apply residuals to agricultural sites or reclamation sites, or which distribute and market residuals or operate an agricultural site or reclamation site, for which complete permit applications were received after December 1, 1997.
- (d) Unless specifically provided otherwise in this chapter, requirements in this chapter shall apply to all septage management facilities that treat more than 10,000 gallons per day monthly average daily flow or more than 20,000 gallons in a single day, and that apply septage to agricultural sites or reclamation sites. The requirements of this chapter shall also apply to appliers of septage, and to operators or owners of an agricultural site or reclamation site which has had septage from facilities permitted under this chapter applied to the land after December 1, 1997.
- (e) Unless specifically provided otherwise in this chapter, requirements in this chapter that apply to residuals shall also apply to septage from facilities regulated by the Department, and to products derived from such septage, or residuals, or combinations thereof.
- (f) Unless specifically provided otherwise in this chapter, requirements in this chapter shall apply to composting facilities, as defined by this chapter, which use yard trash, wood chips, or similar bulking agents, and apply the resulting compost to land or distribute and market the resulting compost after December 1, 1997.
- (g) Facilities which have submitted a complete wastewater permit application or which have received an initial permit before December 1, 1997, are considered to be existing facilities and shall meet the requirements of this chapter in accordance with subsection (h) below.
- (h) Existing facilities in Florida shall comply with these requirements at the time of renewal or substantial revision of the wastewater permit, whichever occurs first. Existing facilities may choose to

comply with the requirements of this chapter prior to the time specified in this rule by obtaining a permit revision under Chapter 62-620, F.A.C.

- (i) Until such time as the wastewater permit is renewed or a new permit is issued for expansion or substantial modification of the facility, the facility shall comply with the requirements for land application of residuals or septage in the existing permit.
- (j) Residuals or residuals products which are generated outside of Florida but imported to Florida are subject to the provisions of this chapter beginning December 1, 1997.
 - (k) The following activities are excluded from the requirements of this chapter:
- 1. Regulation of septage management facilities that treat 10,000 gallons per day or less on a monthly average daily flow basis and no more than 20,000 gallons in a single day. These facilities are regulated by the Department of Health in accordance with Chapter 10D-6, F.A.C.
- 2. Land application of septage treated by facilities which are regulated by the Department of Health in accordance with Chapter 10D-6, F.A.C.
- 3. Disposal of residuals, septage, and other solids in a solid waste landfill. Disposal of these materials shall be in accordance with Chapter 62-701, F.A.C.
- 4. Disposal of residuals by placement on land for purposes other than soil conditioning or fertilization, such as at a monofill, surface impoundment, waste pile, or dedicated site. Disposal in such cases shall be in accordance with Chapter 62-701, F.A.C.
- 5. Incineration of residuals. Incineration of residuals shall meet the requirements of Chapters 62-210, 62-212, 62-213, 62-272, 62-273, 62-275, 62-296, and 62-297, F.A.C., and the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.
- 6. Co-composting of residuals with solid waste other than yard trash, wood chips or similar bulking agents. Co-composting of residuals with other solid waste materials shall be in accordance with Chapter 62-709, F.A.C.
- 7. Treatment, management, or disposal of industrial sludges or septage, air treatment sludges, and water supply treatment sludges.
- 8. Disposal of screenings and grit from the preliminary treatment components of wastewater treatment facilities, solids from sewer line cleaning operations, and solids from lift stations and pump stations. Disposal of these materials shall be in accordance with Chapter 62-701, F.A.C.

I have been in communication with your staff regarding Pasco County accepting approximately 3,000 tons per year of grit and debris from the City of Tampa's sewer cleaning operations, lift stations, and pump stations; this material is primarily sand. I am requesting the Florida Department of Environmental Protection review several options that have been discussed with a member of your staff, who suggested that this matter be directed to you via a written request.

Please review the following potential options I believe may be open to Pasco County:

- Stock pile the material in West Pasco Class III Landfill for eventual use as cover. Please recall that Pasco County Class III is a lined cell.
- Stock pile the material in West Pasco Class I, Cell SW-1, and use it for cover during bypassing operations and/or other cover requirements.

Your consideration and response to my request will be appreciated.

Pursuant to your letter of November 6, 1998, the following are our responses:

EAST PASCO CLASS I LANDFILL

• INQUIRY: You are asked that we furnish the missing gas monitoring reports.

Response: I do not have reference knowledge to what gas monitoring reports you are

requesting. Our records indicate reporting is current.

• INQUIRY: Written response to Ms. Amram's letter of July 3, 1997 is still required.

• Response: Pasco County's Solid Waste consultant was directed to respond to Ms.

Amram's letter, but did not do so. I have again instructed Law Engineering

and Environmental Services to prepare a timely response.

• INQUIRY: Explain the sudden diminished methane concentrations reported for the July 24, 1998 event.

• Response: Law Engineer and Environmental Services has been directed to respond to this inquiry.

● INQUIRY: Please provide delinquent groundwater monitoring evaluation in accordance with F.A.C. 62-71.510(9) and Specific Condition 38 of the permit.

• Response: Pasco County records indicate that we are in compliance with F.A.C. 62-701.510(9). A groundwater monitoring plan evaluation is currently being prepared by Law Engineering and Environmental Services which will be submitted to the FDEP when completed.

WEST PASCO CLASS III

• INQUIRY: Please provide all past gas monitoring data for the Class III since issuance of the permit.

Response: Pasco County will be unable to provide the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) any past gas monitoring data for the Class III Landfill since gas monitoring has never been implemented or requested since operation started in 1991. Gas monitoring shall commence on November 16, 1998 in compliance permit requirements.

• INQUIRY: The load checking program does not meet FDEP requirements. Please ensure that this is addressed immediately.

• Response: The FDEP is correct. A new scale house attendant did not fully understand the importance of load checking. This problem has been resolved.

• INQUIRY: Please provide delinquent ground water monitoring evaluation in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.510 (9) and Specific Condition 37 of the permit.

Response:

Pasco County records indicate that groundwater monitoring reports are current with the FDEP. The Specific Condition 37 requiring a groundwater monitoring plan evaluation will be provided to the FDEP by Law Engineering and Environmental Services in the immediate near future when the evaluation is completed.

EAST PASCO TRANSFER STATION

• INQUIRY: It was evident during the inspection some kind of spill occurred. The

staff explanation of what exactly happened was not very clear.

Response: The FDEP is correct.



INTRODUCTION:

Pasco County Permit Number SO51-267334 issued on May 20, 1996, expiration of May 15, 2001, notes in Specific Conditions, "yard trash accepted at the site shall be processed and recycled or disposed of within 12 months."

Pasco County receives and processes approximately (on average) 3,000 tons of yard trash per year. The recycling of this yard trash, as chipped (processed) mulch within a twelve month period, I believe may be recycled in the following ways:

- Giving mulch to Pasco County residents at no charge;
- Giving mulch to Pasco County landscapers (commercial);
- Using mulch for West Pasco haul roads and perimeter roads;
- Provide mulch to roads on other Pasco County sites, i.e., wastewater treatment plants, storage areas, etc.
- Provide mulch for Pasco County park trails and pathways;
- Provide mulch that cannot be recycled or used elsewhere as fuel for the Resource Recovery Facility.

To place volumes and or to anticipate the exact amount of mulch to be used annually will be most difficult. The annual placement of mulch will vary from year to year; less mulch will be used next year for on-site haul roads and perimeter roads at West Pasco. Pasco County may pursue an aggressive public relations program advising residents that mulch is available for home use at no charge which may increase citizen participation.

The Solid Waste Division can provide a tonnage audit of mulch and its use for review and for possible Pasco County recycling credits.

The management of yard trash at the West Pasco Class III landfill site does not appear to comply with Department rules and policy, or the current permit specific condition #6. Clarification is provided as follows:

- According to Florida Administrative Code (FAC) 62-701.300(1)(a), "No person shall store, process, or dispose of solid waste except at a permitted solid waste management facility or a facility exempt from permitting under this chapter." Yard trash accepted at the landfill site is solid waste, however the site is not permitted for disposal or to store yard trash longer than 12 months.
- FAC 62-701.200(32) states that "Disposal means the discharge, deposit, injection, dumping, spilling, leaking, or placing of any solid waste into or upon any land or water so that such solid waste or any constituent thereof may enter other lands or be emitted into the air or discharged into any waters, including ground waters, or otherwise enter the environment". This definition is consistent with the intent of specific condition #6 of the current permit, which in part states "yard trash accepted at the site shall be processed and recycled, or disposed of within twelve months". Therefore, all yard trash accepted that is not recycled within twelve months must be disposed of at a permitted site to prevent a violation of Department rules and the current permit, and to avoid being considered on-site disposal.

6. **Special Wastes.** The design, operation, and monitoring of disposal or control of any "special wastes" shall be in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.300(8), 62-701.520 and any other applicable Department rules, to protect the public safety, health and welfare.

Shredded asphalt roofing shingles, screened through a 1" mesh, and then mixed in the ratio of 50% shredded shingles to 50% soil, and applied in a six(6) inch compacted layer may be used as initial cover within the <u>bermed</u> working area.

Ground-up construction and demolition debris, unscreened, and applied in a six (6) inch compacted layer, may be used as initial cover within the <u>bermed</u> working area. 90% of the unscreened ground-up debris shall pass a 2" screen and 50% shall pass a 1/4" screen. At least one sample shall be tested weekly to verify particle size distribution. (If any inspections disclose problems with this cover, such as failure to meet the characteristics stated in 62-701, a higher percentage of soil may be required or approval as an alternative cover may be discontinued.)

Composted yard trash, screened through 1/2" mesh, and then mixed in the ratio of 75% screened compost to 25% soil, and applied in a six (6) inch compacted layer may be used as initial cover, or applied in a one (1) foot compacted layer in addition to the six (6) inch initial cover may be used as intermediate cover.

The Solid Waste Section of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) has reviewed the groundwater quality sampling results for the East Pasco landfill, collected July 12-18, 1996; West Pasco Class I landfill, collected August 20-21, 1996; and West Pasco Class III landfill, collected July 19-August 6, 1996. It was noted that the method detection limits for several organic and inorganic parameters were greater than Florida's groundwater standards. These standards for Class G-2 groundwater are the same as the Drinking Water Standards that are listed in FAC 550.310 and .320. All monitoring for permitted sites must be conducted using method detection limits equal to or lower than the parameter's groundwater standard in order to demonstrate compliance/noncompliance with Florida's groundwater criteria and standards (FAC 62-520.400 and .420). A quick review of method detection limits for these sites showed the following parameters did not meet the standards for some or all wells tested:

Inorganic	<u>Organic</u>
Antimony Thallium Arsenic Cadmium Lead Selenium	Benzene Carbon tetrachloride 1,2-dichloroethane Tetrachloroethene Trichloroethene Vinyl Chloride

Due to the water quality history at East Pasco, this site must be resampled for these parameters using the appropriate method detection limits to demonstrate the facility's compliance with Florida's groundwater criteria and standards. These sample results should be submitted to the FDEP by December 30, 1996. The West Pasco landfills do not need to be resampled as these parameters have not exceeded Florida's groundwater quality criteria and standards in the past. All future sampling events for FDEP-permitted facilities should be analyzed using the correct detection limits.

Groundwater Contour Maps

The groundwater contour maps submitted with the East Pasco monitoring results show water elevations collected over a 3-day period for the surficial aquifer, and over a 6-day period for the

Floridan aquifer. As previously requested by the FDEP, these groundwater contour maps should use groundwater elevations measured over a short period of time. Measurements should be collected within one day for the best evaluation of groundwater flow conditions. Please collect groundwater elevations in one day for all future groundwater flow maps. In addition, the groundwater elevation for monitoring well F-2 was recorded as 71.02 feet on the groundwater reporting form, and was recorded as 71.62 feet on the map. Please clarify which elevation is correct, and submit a revised map if necessary.



RULES OF THE ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION, MODEL RULES OF PROCEDURE CHAPTER 28-5, DECISIONS DETERMINING SUBSTANTIAL INTERESTS PART II, FORMAL HEARINGS

A) PREHEARING PROCEDURES

Initiation of Formal Proceedings. 28-5.201

- Initiation of formal proceedings shall be made by petition to the Agency responsible for rendering final Agency action. The term petition as used herein includes any application or other document which expresses a request for formal proceedings. Each petition should be printed, typewritten or otherwise duplicated in legible form on white paper of standard legal size. Unless printed, the impression shall be on one side of the paper only and lines shall be double-spaced and indented.
 - (2) All petitions filed under these rules should contain:
- The name and address of each Agency affected and each Agency's file or identification number, if known;
- The name and address of the petitioner or petitioners, and an explanation of how his/her substantial interests will be affected by the Agency determination;
- A statement of when and how petitioner received notice of the Agency decision of intent to render a decision;
- A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate;
- A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, as well as the rules and statutes which entitle the petitioner to relief;
- A demand for relief to which the petitioner deems himself entitled; (f)and
 - Other information which the petitioner contends is material. (g)
- Upon receipt of a petition for formal proceedings, the Agency shall either accept or deny the petition, and if accepted shall elect either to conduct the hearing itself through the Agency head, or member thereof, assign a person authorized by Subsection 120.57(1)(a) or other authority, or request that a Hearing Officer from the Division of Administrative Hearings be assigned to conduct the hearing.
- A petition may be denied if the petitioner does not state adequately a material factual allegation, such as a substantial interest in the Agency determination, or if the petition is untimely.
- The Agency shall promptly give written notice to all parties of the action taken on the petition, and shall state with particularity its reasons
- If the Agency elects to request that a Hearing Officer of the Division of Administrative Hearings be assigned to conduct the hearing, the Agency shall forward the petition, and all materials filed with the Agency, to the Division of Administrative hearings, and shall notify all parties of its

This permit is issued under the provisions of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes, and Florida Administrative Code Rule(s) 62-4, 62-522, 62-550, and 62-701. The above named permittee is hereby authorized to perform the work or operate the facility shown on the application and approved drawing(s), plans and other documents, attached hereto or on file with the Department and made a part hereof and specifically described as follows:

To operate and maintain a landfill and related facilities (approximately 20 acres), referred to as the West Pasco Class III Landfill, subject to the specific and general conditions attached, for disposal of solid waste, located at 14606 Hays Road, 3 miles north of County Road 52, Spring Hill, Pasco County, Florida. The specific conditions attached are for the operation of:

1. Class III Landfill Disposal Facility

This permit contains compliance items summarized in Attachment 1 that shall be complied with and submitted to the Department by the dates noted. If the compliance dates are not met and submittals are not received by the Department on the dates noted, enforcement action may be initiated to assure compliance with the conditions of this permit.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

1. The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations and restrictions set forth in this permit, are "permit conditions" and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Sections 403.141, 403.161, 403.727, or 403.861, Florida Statutes. The permittee is placed on notice that the Department will review this permit periodically and may initiate enforcement action for any violation of these conditions.

- 2. This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department.
- 3. As provided in subsections 403.087(6) and 403.722(5), F.S., the issuance of this permit does not convey any vested rights or any exclusive privileges. Neither does it authorize any injury to public or private property or any invasion of rights, nor any infringement of federal, State, or local laws or regulations. This permit is not a waiver of or approval of any other Department permit that may be required for other aspects of the total project which are not addressed in this permit.
- 4. This permit conveys no title to land or water, does not constitute State recognition or acknowledgment of title, and does not constitute authority for the use of submerged lands unless herein provided and the necessary title or leasehold interests have been obtained from the State. Only the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund may express State opinion as to title.
- 5. This permit does not relieve the permittee from liability for harm or injury to human health or welfare, animal, or plant life, or property caused by the construction or operation of this permitted source, or from penalties therefore; nor does it allow the permittee to cause pollution in contravention of Florida Statutes and Department rules, unless specifically authorized by an order from the Department.
- 6. The permittee shall properly operate and maintain the facility and systems of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) that are installed and used by the permittee to achieve compliance with the conditions of this permit, are required by Department rules. This provision includes the operation of backup or auxiliary facilities or similar systems when necessary to achieve compliance with the conditions of the permit and when required by Department rules.

7. The permittee, by accepting this permit, specifically agrees to allow authorized Department personnel, upon presentation of credentials or other documents as may be required by law and at reasonable times, access to the premises where the permitted activity is located or conducted to:

- (a) Have access to and copy any records that must be kept under conditions of the permit;
- (b) Inspect the facility, equipment, practices, or operations regulated or required under this permit; and
- (c) Sample or monitor any substances or parameters at any location reasonably necessary to assure compliance with this permit or Department rules.

Reasonable time may depend on the nature of the concern being investigated.

- 8. If, for any reason, the permittee does not comply with or will be unable to comply with any condition or limitation specified in this permit, the permittee shall immediately provide the Department with the following information:
 - (a) A description of and cause of noncompliance; and
 - (b) The period of noncompliance, including dates and times; or, if not corrected, the anticipated time the noncompliance is expected to continue, and steps being taken to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance.

The permittee shall be responsible for any and all damages which may result and may be subject to enforcement action by the Department for penalties or for revocation of this permit.

9. In accepting this permit, the permittee understands and agrees that all records, notes, monitoring data and other information relating to the construction or operation of this permitted source which are submitted to the Department may be used by the Department as evidence in any enforcement case involving the permitted source arising under the Florida Statutes or Department rules, except where such use is prescribed by Sections 403.111 and 403.73, F.S. Such evidence shall only be used to the extent it is consistent with the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure and appropriate evidentiary rules.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

10. The permittee agrees to comply with changes in Department rules and Florida Statues after a reasonable time for compliance; provided, however, the permittee does not waive any other rights granted by Florida Statutes or Department rules.

- 11. This permit is transferable only upon Department approval in accordance with Rule 62-4.120 and 62-730.300, Florida Administrative Code, as applicable. The permittee shall be liable for any non-compliance of the permitted activity until the transfer is approved by the Department.
- 12. This permit or a copy thereof shall be kept at the work site of the permitted activity.
- 13. This permit also constitutes:
 - (a) Determination of Best Available Control Technology (BACT)
 - (b) Determination of Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD)
 - (c) Certification of compliance with State Water Quality Standards (Section 401, PL 92-500)
 - (d) Compliance with New Source Performance Standards
- 14. The permittee shall comply with the following:
 - (a) Upon request, the permittee shall furnish all records and plans required under Department rules. During enforcement actions, the retention period for all records will be extended automatically unless otherwise stipulated by the Department.
 - (b) The permittee shall hold at the facility or other location designated by this permit records of all monitoring information (including all calibration and maintenance records and all original strip chart recordings for continuous monitoring instrumentation) required by the permit, copies of all reports required by this permit, and records of all data used to complete the application for this permit. These materials shall be retained at least three years from the date of the sample, measurement, report, or application unless otherwise specified by Department rule.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

1. Landfill Designation. This site shall be classified as a Class III landfill and shall be operated in accordance with all applicable requirements of Chapters 62-4, 62-520, 62-522, 62-550, 62-701 and 62-703, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) and all applicable requirements of Department rules.

- 2. **Permit Application Documentation.** This permit is valid for operation of the Class III landfill and related facilities in accordance with the reports, plans and other information as follows:
 - Operation Permit Application by Pasco County submitted on March 17, 1995;
 - Supporting information and Household Hazardous Waste Facility Operation and Contingency Plans by Pasco County submitted on May 22, 1995;
 - Permit/Construction Drawings and Record Drawings by CDM and supporting information by Pasco County submitted on July 7, 1995;
 - Supporting information by Pasco County submitted August 25 and November 3, 1995;
 - Landfill Operations Plan by Pasco County submitted on May 16, 1996;
 - and in accordance with all applicable requirements of Department rules.
- 3. **Permit Modifications.** Any activities not previously approved as part of this permit shall require a separate Department permit unless the Department determines a permit modification to be more appropriate. Permits shall be modified in accordance with the requirements of 62-4.080, F.A.C. A modification which is reasonably expected to lead to substantially different environmental impacts which require a detailed review by the Department is considered a substantial modification.
- 4. **Permit Renewal**. As required by F.A.C. 62-4.090(1), no later than **sixty (60) days** before the expiration of the Department Permit, the permittee shall apply for a renewal of a permit on forms and in a manner prescribed by the Department, in order to assure conformance with all applicable Department rules. Failure to comply with this condition may result in facility operation without a permit. Permits shall be renewed at least every five years as required by F.A.C. 62-701.330(3).
- 5. **Prohibitions**. The prohibitions of F.A.C. 62-701.300 shall not be violated.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

6. **Special Wastes.** The design, operation, and monitoring of disposal or control of any "special wastes" shall be in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.300(8), 62-701.520 and any other applicable Department rules, to protect the public safety, health and welfare.

- White goods or other discarded materials that are held for the purposes of recycling shall be held no longer than ninety (90) days unless covered, and shall be stored in a manner so as not to constitute a fire or safety hazard or a sanitary nuisance, and shall comply with all applicable local and state regulations. Surface water shall be diverted away from all storage or holding areas. Any processing or volume reduction of white goods or other discarded materials will require a modification of this permit.
- All solid wastes, recovered materials or residues handled at the site shall be stored in a manner so as not to constitute a fire or safety hazard or a sanitary nuisance, and shall comply with all applicable local or state regulations. Recovered resources which may be offered for sale shall comply with applicable regulations of all appropriate state agencies.
- Yard trash accepted at the site shall be processed and recycled, or disposed of within twelve months.
- The household hazardous waste collection/storage facility shall be operated in accordance with the Operating Plan and Contingency Plan by Pasco County submitted on May 22, 1995.
- White goods, contaminated soils, waste tires, and yard trash shall not be disposed of in the lined Class III Landfill.
- 7. Landfill Operation Requirements. The permittee shall operate this facility in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.500, Landfill Operation Requirements, and the Landfill Operations Plan for Class III Landfill by Pasco County submitted on May 16, 1996.
- 8. Operating Personnel. As required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(1), at least one operator, trained in accordance with F.A.C. 62-703, shall be at the landfill at all times when the landfill receives waste. The permittee shall notify the Department in writing of a change of the primary on-site supervisor within 7 days of the effective start date of this new responsible individual. Copies of the training certificates for the newly assigned individual shall also be submitted.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

9. Operation Plan and Operating Record. Each landfill owner or operator shall have an operational plan which meets the requirements of F.A.C. 62-701.500(2). A copy of the Department approved permit, operational plan, construction reports and record drawings, and supporting information shall be kept at the facility at all times for reference and inspections. An operating record as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(3) is part of the operations plan, and shall also be maintained at the site.

- 10. Method and Sequence of Filling. The method and sequence of filling shall be in accordance with the Landfill Operations Plan for Class III Landfill by Pasco County submitted on May 16, 1996.
- 11. Waste Records. Waste quantity records shall be maintained as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(4) and submitted quarterly; by Jan. 15th, April 15th, July 15th, and Oct. 15th.
- 12. Control of Access. Access to, and use of, the facility shall be controlled as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(5).
- 13. Monitoring of Waste. Wastes shall be monitored as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(6). The permittee shall not accept hazardous waste or any hazardous substance for disposal at this site. Hazardous waste is a waste identified in Chapter 62-730, F.A.C. Hazardous substances are those defined in Section 403.703, Florida Statute or in any other applicable state or federal law or administrative rule.
- 14. Waste Handling Requirements. All solid waste disposed of in the Class III area shall be handled as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(7). Initial cover shall be applied and maintained in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.500(7)(e) so as to protect the public health and welfare. Intermediate cover shall be applied and maintained in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.500(7)(f).

All solid waste disposed of in the Class III area must be covered with at least 6 inches of compacted earth or other suitable material as approved by the Department, at the end of each work week. An intermediate cover of one (1) foot of compacted earth in addition to the six (6) inch initial cover shall be applied within seven (7) days of cell completion at all landfills if final cover or an additional lift is not to be applied within 180 days of cell completion.

15. Working Face. As required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(7)(d), the permittee shall minimize the size of the working face to minimize leachate, and unnecessary use of cover material. The permittee shall maintain the working face of a cell only wide enough to efficiently accommodate vehicles discharging waste and to minimize the exposed area. Interceptor berms shall be maintained around the active working area to prevent leachate runoff from the working face from entering the stormwater management system. Runoff from outside the bermed working face area will be considered stormwater only if the flow passes over areas which have no exposed waste.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

16. Final Cover. Portions of the landfill which have been filled with waste to the extent of designed dimensions shall be closed in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.500(7)(g) and all applicable requirements of Department rules.

- 17. Leachate Management. Leachate shall be managed in accordance with the requirements of F.A.C. 62-701.500(8), and the Landfill Operations Plan for Class III Landfill by Pasco County submitted on May 16, 1996. Each pump station shall be inspected on a semi-annual basis. Pump performance shall be verified and current draw recorded. Pumps showing reduced performance shall be removed for maintenance and a replacement pump installed immediately. Leachate generation reports shall be compiled monthly and submitted to the Department as requested. Leachate generation reports shall include the number of open, intermediate and closed acres, and the quantities of leachate collected, stored or impounded, recirculated, and hauled/piped off-site to a wastewater treatment facility, and daily precipitation amounts greater than one tenth of an inch. Leachate discharge to areas outside of the geomembrane liner is a violation of Department rules.
- 18. **Gas Monitoring**. Landfill gas shall be monitored as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(9), 62-701.400(10), and the Landfill Operations Plan for Class III Landfill by Pasco County submitted on May 16, 1996. The results of quarterly monitoring shall be submitted by **January 15th**, **April 15th**, **July 15th** and **October 15th** each year.
- 19. **Gas Monitoring Locations**. The following gas monitoring locations shall be sampled **quarterly** for the Lower Explosive Limit (LEL) of methane, as described in F.A.C. Rule 62-701.400(10)(c).

- 20. Gas Remediation. In the event that the Lower Explosive Limit (LEL) is greater than 25% inside structures both on or off of the landfill site, or greater than 100% at the property boundary, the owner shall submit to the Department, within 7 days of detection, a remediation plan detailing the nature and extent of the problem and the proposed remedy. The remedy shall be completed within 60 days of detection unless otherwise approved by the Department.
- 21. **Stormwater System Management.** Stormwater shall be managed as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(10) to meet applicable standards of F.A.C. 62-302.
- 22. **Recordkeeping.** Records shall be maintained as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(13).

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

23. Waste Burning. Open burning of solid waste is prohibited except in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.520(2). Controlled burning of solid waste is prohibited at this site except for clean vegetative and wood wastes which may be burned in a permitted air curtain incinerator in accordance with F.A.C. 62-2.500(1)(e). Any accidental fires which require longer than one (1) hour to extinguish must be promptly reported to the Department of Environmental Protection.

- 24. Closure Permit Requirements. The landfill owner or operator shall submit a closure permit application to the Department, at least 90 days prior to the date when wastes will no longer be accepted for active portions of the landfill, as required by F.A.C. 62-701.600(3).
- 25. Financial Assurance. The permittee shall provide financial assurance for this landfill site in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.630. All costs for closure and long-term care shall be adjusted and submitted annually, by September 1 each year, to: Solid Waste Manager, Solid Waste Section, Department of Environmental Protection, 3804 Coconut Palm Drive, Tampa, Florida 33619-8318. Proof that the financial assurance has been funded adequately shall be submitted annually to: Financial Coordinator, Solid Waste Section, Department of Environmental Protection, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400.
- 26. Control of Nuisance Conditions. The operating authority shall be responsible for the control of odors and fugitive particulates arising from this operation. Such control shall minimize the creation of nuisance conditions on adjoining property. Complaints received from the general public, and confirmed by Department personnel upon site inspection, shall constitute a nuisance condition, and the permittee must take immediate corrective action to abate the nuisance. The owner or operator shall control mosquitoes and rodents as so to protect the public health and welfare.
- 27. Liner Location. The top edge of the geomembrane liner shall be clearly flagged. Waste disposal and leachate runoff outside the geomembrane liner is prohibited.
- 28. Facility Maintenance and Repair. The site shall be properly maintained including erosion control, maintenance of grass cover, prevention of ponding, groundwater monitoring system repairs, and repair and maintenance of leachate collection and removal systems. In the event of damage to any portion of the landfill site facilities or failure of any part of the landfill systems, the permittee shall immediately (within 24 hours) notify the Department of Environmental Protection explaining such occurrence and remedial measures to be taken and time needed for repairs. Written detailed notification shall be submitted to the Department within seven (7) days following the occurrence.

29. Water Quality Monitoring Quality Assurance.

- a. All field and laboratory work done in connection with the facility's Water Quality Monitoring Plan shall be conducted by a firm possessing a Comprehensive Quality Assurance Plan approved by the Department to meet the requirements of F.A.C. 62-160. The Quality Assurance Plan must specifically address the types of sampling and analytical work that is required by the permit. The Quality Assurance Plan shall be required of all persons performing sampling or analysis, and shall be followed by all persons collecting or analyzing samples related to this permit. Documentation of an approved QAP shall be submitted annually to the Department with the groundwater sampling report due January 15th. Documentation shall include the completed signature page and the Table of Contents of the approved plan.
- b. The field testing, sample collection and preservation and laboratory testing, including quality control procedures, shall be in accordance with methods approved by the Department in accordance with F.A.C. 62-4.246 and 62-160. Approved methods published by the Department or as published in Standard Methods, A.S.T.M., or EPA methods shall be used.

30. Zone of Discharge.

- a. The zone of discharge for this site shall extend horizontally 100 feet from the limits of the landfill liner or to the property boundary, whichever is less, and shall extend vertically to the bottom of the first occurring aquifer.
- b. The permittee shall ensure that the water quality standards and minimum criteria for Class G-II groundwaters will not be exceeded at the boundary of the zone of discharge according to F.A.C. 62-520.420.
- 31. Leachate Sampling. Leachate shall be sampled from Tank 1 and analyzed annually for the following monitoring parameters:

If the wastes types accepted vary from the waste types listed in the permit renewal application for Cells 1 and 2, or waste types other than yard trash are stored in Cells 3 and/or 4, the permittee must notify the FDEP within 7 days. Within 30 days of this notification, the permittee must provide an evaluation of the leachate monitoring program to account for the new waste types.

90 days prior to permit renewal, leachate from Tanks 1 and 2 shall be analyzed for the parameters listed in F.A.C. Rule 62-701.510(8)(c) and (d).

32. Groundwater Monitoring Well Locations. The Groundwater Monitoring System is designed and constructed in accordance with the plans on file in the Southwest District Office. All wells are to be clearly labeled and easily visible at all times. A surveyed drawing shall be submitted showing the location of all monitoring wells (active and abandoned) which will be horizontally located by latitude and longitude (degrees, minutes, seconds), Universal Transverse Mercator coordinates, and the elevation of the top of the well casing to the nearest 0.01 foot, National Geodetic Vertical Datum. The surveyed drawing shall include the monitor well identification number, locations and elevations of all permanent benchmarks and/or corner monument markers at the site. 

LANDFILL OPERATIONS FOR SOUTHWEST DISTINGT TAMPA

The landfill addressed in this application is an integral unit of the Pasco County Solid Waste System ("System"). The System is comprised of: a mass-burn resource recovery facility; the West Pasco Class I Landfill, the West Pasco Class III Landfill and Recycling Center, the East Pasco Transfer Station and Recycling Center, and the East Pasco Class I Landfill. The Resource Recovery Facility, the West Pasco Class I Landfill, and the West Pasco Class III Landfill and Recycling Center are co-located on an 800-acre site. The Resource Recovery Facility and the West Pasco Class I Landfill are permitted under the Florida Electrical Power Plant Siting Act, while the West Pasco Class III Landfill and Recycling Center was permitted separately under Chapter 17-701, F.A.C.

The Resource Recovery Facility is designed to receive and process 1,050 tons per day of waste generated by residential, commercial and industrial sources. Three separate combustion units with a capacity of 350 tons per day and a boiler system generate steam for conversion to electrical energy. Emissions controls include dry scrubbers and fabric filter baghouses for each combustion unit. The residue ash handling system is completely enclosed. Bottom ash and grate siftings from the combustion units, as well as fly ash and spent scrubber reagent, are collected and quenched. Ash is moved by conveyor through a scalper screen to remove large materials and through a magnetic separator to remove ferrous metal. Processed residue (MSW ash) is loaded into trucks for disposal in an ash monofill disposal unit at the adjacent West Pasco Class I Landfill.

Currently no delivery of municipal solid waste (MSW) is made directly to the West Pasco Class I Landfill. Deliveries are accepted at the Solid Waste Resource Recovery Facility (SWRRF) 10 hours each day, Monday through Saturday, except legal holidays. Refuse is delivered to the SWRRF in standard packer vehicles, open body dump trucks, semi-truck transfer trailers, and by smaller private vehicles. The waste transferring vehicles pass through an entrance and exit over an automated truck scale system. The scale system is operated by an adjacent scale house with a computerized record keeping system that maintains an accurate accounting of all refuse delivered and ash residue removed from the building.

All processible waste received is dumped inside the Resource Recovery Facility in a refuse storage pit with the exception of some waste from small private vehicles which are directed to a public drop-off area outside the building. Inside the facility building on the tipping floor rollover containers are provided for removing of non-processible waste. The County provides a trained spotter on the tipping floor to observe refuse dumping. The spotter has communication links with the scale house and the facility operators to advise them of the delivery of ANY unacceptable waste.

The West Pasco Class I Landfill was designed and permitted to be constructed in a phased series of individual disposal units, with a total of 16 disposal units. Six disposal units (A-1 to A-6) are designated for ash disposal, eight disposal units (SW-1 to SW-8) for non-processible or by-pass waste, and two disposal units (I-1 and I-2) were left undesignated. The layout of the disposal units is shown in Figure 8.1. The disposal area covers approximately 160 acres, each disposal unit is approximately 10 acres in size. The initial phase of construction was completed in 1990, with the construction of disposal units SW-1 and A-1, eastern portion of the perimeter access road, retention ponds 1 and 2, an equipment maintenance building, and other associated drainage work.

The entire 800-acre site is enclosed by chain-link and barbed wire fence to limit access. To further limit access the Resource Recovery Facility, the West Pasco Class I Landfill, and the West Pasco Class III Landfill and Recycling Center are separated internally by a chain-link and barbed wire fence to control movement between the units.

5B - Contingency Operations.

Response:

Class III materials due to a natural disaster or other emergency may be stockpiled for later removal. The access road is designed to allow normal operations under adverse conditions. Cooperative lending agreements with other Pasco County departments will be pursued for back-up equipment.

EMERGENCY FIRE PROCEDURES - In the highly unlikely event that an UNCONTRULLABLE fire does occur at the landfill site:

- A. Field staff will contact scale attendant via two-way radio, provide details.
- B. Scale attendant will contact 911 requesting fire company response.
- C. Scale attendant will notify landfill operator.

D. Landfill operator will direct additional equipment and manpower as may be required.

CONTROLLABLE FIRE

- A. See Item A. above.

NATURAL DISASTER PROCEDURES - If notice is available of a pending natural disaster (tornado, hurricane, etc.) the landfill supervisor will direct staff to:

- C. Apply daily cover to working face where appropriate.
- D. Secure equipment where appropriate.

After the natural disaster has occurred, the landfill supervisor will direct staff to assess damage to and operational status of:

- A. Access roads
- B. Stormwater management system
- C. Leachate management system
- D. Landfill equipment
- E. Disposal units

K.2c Controlling types of waste received at the landfill.

Response: The Class III disposal unit is a construction and demolition disposal unit. All incoming material is inspected to acquire reasonable assurances that no oil, tires, batteries, and/or large metal are deposited in the cell. Particular care is addressed to hazardous and medical wastes; and should they be detected, arrangements will be made for proper handling and disposal under the direction of the Pasco County Hazardous Waste Manager.

processible items. Yard trash and/or lot clearing debris is not accepted. Pasco County does not intermingle the County tire program with the Class III Landfill operation.

K.2d Weighing incoming waste.

Response: No waste can enter the site without passing the main entrance scale and/or the Class III disposal unit scale. All incoming vehicles are weighed. All loaded vehicles entering the landfill site will be either weighed or AND estimates at volume will be documented prior to unloading. Vehicles with a franchise or commercial license way be weighed or volume estimated at the Class I/Resource Recovery Facility, issued a receipt indicating the weight will and payment received, and redirected to the Class III Landfill. Small vehicles will be charged by the type of vehicle and size of the load.

K.2e Vehicle traffic control and weiguing.

Response: Private refuse haulers are not permitted to drive at random into the Class III watt in this solid waste unit. Individual vehicles and trucks containing construction and demolition cross the scale for weight and placing directions. The spotter on the cell directs the vehicle on where to place his load.

ARE

Directional signs will be placed to safely direct vehicles to the current-waste unloading area. These signs will have large, legible letters and will be cleaned when necessary. Signs will be placed at points so that the route is clear to the drivers. Speed limit, safety, and prohibitive practice signs will be placed as necessary to encourage a safe, clean operating area.

Unloading will be permitted only at designated working faces of currently operating cell. Haulers will be responsible for unloading their own vehicles. A spotter will be present near the active disposal areas to direct vehicles to appropriate off-loading areas and to observe the off-loading process to ensure that nonspecified materials are not part of the delivery.

K.2f Method and sequence of filling waste.

Response: The landfill will be developed using four disposal areas (cells) as shown on Sheet 9 of the plans. Each area is approximately 3.5 acres. Disposal

cells and their integral liner and leachate collection systems are constructed with permanent roads and swales for access and surface water management.

.. Cells 1, 2, 3, and 4 have been constructed and are ready for disposal of Class III materials.



All incoming Class III materials waste will be directed to the working face. Class III materials will be placed against the side slope of the previous day's refuse. The first row will act as a berm to provide a guide for the placement of refuse for the remaining rows. In each row, cells will be constructed having a minimum length of working face to control the operation and leachate quantities, yet of sufficient length to provide adequate dumping areas and room for the landfill equipment to operate. A slope of 2:1 on a 75-foot wide working face will provide for centralization of operations, while providing maneuvering area for private and commercial vehicles unloaded each day.

The sequence of filling lined cell areas with installed leachate collection systems is developed to meet the following objectives.

- Complete subsequent lifts over lower lifts frequent enough to minimize infiltration and conserve the field capacity of the lower lift cell.
- Design landfill slopes during operation to maximize surface run-offaway from the working face and minimize leachate generation.
- Provide a bench terrace along side slopes to minimize erosion.

Efficient use of these techniques will reduce the need for intermediate cover and decrease leachate volumes.

Final cover will be applied over cell lifts within 180 days after the final lift over an area is completed. Final cover will consist of 18 inches of clayey material covered with six inches of native soils. The top six inches will be uncompacted and vegetated with native grasses or other vegetation to promote evapotranspiration.

K.2g Waste compaction and application of cover.

Response: Sufficient cover material will be available by purchase from fill dirt pit to provide a continuous supply of cover through the period of operational site life.

The Class III materials will be placed at the top of the working face, spreading outward in approximately two-foot layers. The Class III materials will be compacted as necessary by a front-end loader or bulldozer and/or landfill compactor. The material types comprising Class III refuse are not always conducive to compaction. Therefore, compaction equipment is not included as required equipment, but will be provided.

Application of initial, intermediate, and final cover is to be performed as required per Chapter 62-701.500(7), FAC. Six inches of initial cover will be applied to the working face at least once a week. Intermediate cover consisting of one foot of compacted native sandy soil from a private dirt pit will be applied within seven days of cell completion if final cover or an additional lift is not to be applied within 180 days of cell completion. Any intermediate areas that will not be landfilled or covered with final cover within six months will be seeded or covered with wood chips, straw, or other appropriate cover material to avoid slope erosion.

Final cover will be applied to the landfill once the final grades are reached. The initial final slope on top of landfill areas will be a minimum of two percent and will not exceed four percent. The perimeter sides of all completed cells will have a slope of 4:1 to minimize erosion. Areas with final cover will be seeded or planted with grass or suitable cover vegetation.

All four units are separated by a lined berm of 4'0 (plus); there is no liner penetration on the berm liner. There is no piping connection between any of the cell units. Therefore, leachate contamination or backflow into Unit 2 cannot occur. Excessive leachate flows into tanks are automatically provided

for or the leachate alarm floats (described in detail later in this narrative) are set to go off at elevations below the liner elevation of the cells. At the alarm, either the pump system will be repaired or Pasco County will utilize their tanker fleet to pump and haul leachate to the Hudson WWTP.

The leachate holding tanks each have five floats:

- 1. Low level alarm shutoff, to protect pump motors.
- 2. Low level shutoff after pumping cycle.
- 3. Turn on pumps for pumping cycle.
- 4. Float for future use (not activated at this time).
- 5. High level alarm (set at approximately 5'0 below the top of leachate holding tank).

A detailed sketch of both leachate holding tanks and the four cells showing piping to holding tanks is attached hereto. Exterior valves from Cells 2 and 3 to holding leachate tank are closed.

Both leachate holding Tanks 1 and 2 are activated and deactivated by the turn-on of the high level float and deactivated by the low level shutoff. Float Cell 1 drains into Leachate Tank 1. Cell 2, when activated, will also drain into Leachate Tank 1. Cell 2 presently drains in a vestigial state to the drainage swale around Class III's all four cells.

Cell 3 drains in a vestigial state into the drainage swale around the Class III unit. Cell 4 drains into the Leachate Holding Tank 2.

Tank pumping is implemented as previously described. Should automatic pumping fail, the high level alarm flashes, alerting the County to repair the automatic pumping system and/or the pump. In any event, if the automatic system fails, the County tanker fleet will start hauling leachate from Leachate Holding Tanks 1 and 2 to the Shady Hills WWTP. Until repairs to the automatic pumping system are made and the system once again is functional, tanker hauling will continue.

The stormwater controls will be operated to collect and convey run-off to surface water management areas for sedimentation control in accordance with Chapters 17-3 and 17-3, FAC. Surface water management areas will be maintained by periodic removal of sediments. Surface water control devices such as weirs and culverts will be routinely checked and cleaned to ensure proper performance.

All water coming into contact with emplaced Class III materials will be handled as leachate.

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

Please describe a Coutine gas monitoring program.

Response:

Of the Class III Landfill disposal's four units, only one unit (No. 4) is used for acceptance of construction and demolition (C & D) material. volume received amounted to 1,883 tons for Fiscal Year 1994-95. of Unit 4 has not been covered to date. The Class III C & D landfill is situate in excess of 750 feet from all property boundaries, with the closest structure being in excess of 1,000 feet. The scale house and landfill operators' office, the closest structure, will be checked via gas meter quarterly and the results will be reported to the department. If the methane gas levels exceed the lower explosive limits specified by the FAC, the operator shall:

- 1. Notify his supervisor, who will take measures (if necessary) to protect health and safety.
- ່ 2 . Submit to the department within seven days a remediation plan.
- 3. Complete the approved remediation construction within 60 days.
- 4. The use of pipe for gas collection shall have a condensate collection method and disposal at each low point in the conveyance system.

The Operating Record shall consist of all records, reports, analytical results, demonstrations, and notifications required by Chapter 17-701, FAC, including the Department approved permit, engineering drawings, and supporting information, and the landfill operator training verifications required by Chapter 17-703, FAC. The record is considered part of the operation plan and is kept at the Pasco County Government Center Utilities Services Branch office located in New Port Richey. Response:

Waste records are kept on file at the Public Works/Utilities Building, Pasco County Government Complex, 7536 State Street, New Port Richey, of tonnage received, leachate volume, ancillary records.

To prevent unauthorized access to the 800-acre site in West Pasco, the entire site is enclosed with either barbed wire or chain-link fencing. Interior fencing separates the Resource Recovery Facility, West Pasco Class I Landfill, and the West Pasco Class III Landfill and Recycling Center. Entrance gates at the Resource Recovery and the West Pasco Class III Landfill are chain-link and are closed and secured during non-working hours. The entrance gate to the Class I Landfill is internal.

The Landfill Supervisor will check or have checked the integrity of the perimeter fencing on a regular basis. The Landfill Operators will secure the entrance gates at the end of the operating day. The Landfill Supervisor will ensure that the existing signs indicating the hours of operations and types of waste accepted are maintained.

Item K-6 - Describe a Load Checking Program as Required by FAC 62-7801.500(6).

Response:

A load checking program has been implemented to detect and discourage attempts to dispose of unauthorized wastes at the West Pasco Class III Landfill.

A minimum of three loads each week shall be examined. Loads will be discharged at a designated location within the landfill for a content inspection. Should unacceptable wastes be found, the hauler will be notified to determine the waste sources from his haul/pickup route.

No hazardous wastes are accepted at the West Pasco Class III Landfill. Should hazardous waste be found, the following action is taken by Pasco County:

- The Environmental Deputy Sheriff is notified.
- The Pasco County Health Department is notified.
- The hauler is called and requested to report to the site by the Environmental Deputy Sheriff.
- Depending on circumstances, the Environmental Deputy Sheriff may make an arrest.
- Proper disposal of hazardous waste if any is found is required
 via licensed DOT hauler at hauler/generator's expense.

Item K-7, a through d - Describe Landfilling Procedures to Demonstrate Compliance with Each of the Following.

Response:

- a) Waste layer thickness and compaction frequencies covered in original submission, Pages 22-23.
- b) Special considerations for the first layer of waste placed above the liner and leachate collection system. The first layer of waste placed above the liner and leachate collection system will be four feet in compacted thickness and consist of special selected wastes

containing no large rigid objects that may damage the liner or leachate collection system.

- c) Slopes of cell working face and side grades above land surfaces planned lift depths during operation. The working face of the cell and side grades above the land surface shall be at a slope no greater than three feet horizontal to one foot vertical rise. Lift depth should not exceed ten feet but may vary depending on specific operations and daily volume of waste, width of working face, and good safety practices.
- d) Maximum width of working face: West Pasco Class III working face will be only wide enough to accommodate vehicles discharging waste, and to control exposed area and conserve cover material.

Solid waste will be placed into disposal units to construct lifts. The working face of the disposal unit, and side grades at a slope, no greater than three feet horizontal to one foot vertical rise. Lift thickness should not exceed ten (10) feet. A temporary berm will be constructed around the working face to minimize the formation of leachate (see Figure 8.3). The temporary berm will be moved as the working face/lift progresses.

8.7 Working Face Width

The working face will be only wide enough to accommodate vehicles dumping waste. In the ashful disposal units, and some disposal units, the working face under normal operating conditions should be minimal (±50 feet). 8.7. Initial Cover

Initial cover will be applied to solid waste disposal units in order to minimize any adverse environmental, safety, or health effects such as those resulting from birds, blowing litter, odors, disease vectors, or fires. Initial cover will not be necessary for the ash monofill disposal units.

Initial cover at the solid waste disposal units will be applied at the end of each working day. The initial cover will be comprised of soil material and be six (6) inches in compacted thickness.

8.7 Intermediate Cover

Intermediate cover, in addition to six-inch initial cover, will be applied and maintained within seven days of disposal unit completion if additional solid waste will not be deposited within 180 days of disposal unit completion. The intermediate cover, when disposal to the initial fill phase and disposal activity is shifted to a new adjacent disposal unit for more than 180 days, will be graded to provide a surface slope and will also be seeded or sodded with grass to further promote runoff and minimize infiltration. When disposal activity is resumed in the disposal unit, the intermediate cover will be pushed aside and stockpiled for use as initial cover for the resumed disposal activity.

8.7. Final Cover

Once the solid waste disposal units have been filled to the final grades, final cover will be applied in accordance with the closure plan. The top of the landfill area will be convex with an outward slope of 2 to 4 percent from

from the center. The side will be completed with slopes of 4:1. areas of fevral cover well be seeded with gross or other sutable cover.

Item 8, a through c - Describe Operational Procedures to Demonstrate Compliance with Each of These Items.

Response:

- Leachate level monitoring is by a float valve in the holding tank. a) When level limitation (one foot above liner) is reached, the duplex pumps pump leachate to the Hudson Wastewater Treatment Plant for treatment, receiving secondary treatment. Volume leachate generated is reported to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection with rainfall data each month.
- Leachate is managed by duplex pumps mounted in the leachate collecb) Removal via pressure mains to the Hudson Wastewater Treatment Plant for secondary treatment.
- Pasco County has no plans for managing leachate as a hazardous waste. If, when, and should leachate be, sometime in the future, classified as a hazardous waste, Pasco County will be obligated to comply with the law. To attempt to prognosticate ten or 15 years into the future, when present manager's replacements will be on board and rules and regulations will most likely be changed, would be an exercise in futility. This matter may be best addressed at the time of reclassification.

Rainfall is recorded by visual rain gauges and is recorded on the daily leachate log sheets.

K-9 - Describe a Routine Gas Monitoring Program for the Site.

Response:

Class III materials to be placed in the landfill will generate very low quantities of methane and other decomposition gases after the low permeability top cap material is in place. Therefore, a gas venting system will be installed in conjunction with installation of the top cap material. The impermeable bottom liner will limit downward and sideward migration of methane. Since the site closure plan includes a low permeability top cap, the gas venting system in the solid waste cells will be installed as the cells are complete and closed. The vents will provide an escape route for gases that are lighter than air, such as methane, to prevent lateral migration of these potentially explosive gases. A gas monitoring program will be implemented with readings taken monthly and reported quarterly after the cell closing.

Describe procedures for Operating and Maintaining the Landfill Stormwater Management System to Comply With the Standards of Chapters 17-3, 17-302, and 17-23, FAC.

The access road encompassing the landfill area and the disposal unit berms are elevated above existing ground elevations to prevent any surface water from entering the waste-filled area.

Additionally, a large swale is located at the base of the landfill slope on the interior side of the access road. The swale is designed to receive runoff from the predeveloped and any closed-out areas of the landfill and direct it to one of four major retention basins.

The bottom of the landfill disposal units are lined and positioned above the seasonal high water table to prevent any lateral flow into the waste-filled areas, if in the unlikely event that standing water was to occur in the swales. Also closed-out disposal units will be capped with any closed-o

The landfill supervisor will routinely inspect the stormwater management system. Particular attention will be given to inspecting the culverts under the access road for any blockage. The stormwater management system will also be inspected prior to a natural disaster if sufficient notice is available, and after any natural disaster (see Section 8.2.2.2.)

Dust Control Methods.

An operating record as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(3) is part of the operations plan, and shall also be maintained at the site.
- 10. Method and Sequence of Filling. The method and sequence of filling shall be in accordance with the December 1987 drawings by CDM "Permit and Construction Drawings", submitted on July 7, 1995.
- 11. Waste Records. Waste quantity records shall be maintained as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(4) and submitted quarterly; by Jan. 15th, April 15th, July 15th, and Oct. 15th.
- 12. Control of Access. Access to, and use of, the facility shall be controlled as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(5).
- 13. Monitoring of Waste. Wastes shall be monitored as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(6). The permittee shall not accept hazardous waste or any hazardous substance for disposal at this site. Hazardous waste is a waste identified in Chapter 62-730, F.A.C. Hazardous substances are those defined in Section 403.703, Florida Statute or in any other applicable state or federal law or administrative rule.
- 14. Waste Handling Requirements. All solid waste disposed of in the Class III area shall be handled as required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(7). Initial cover shall be applied and maintained in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.500(7)(e) so as to protect the public health and welfare. Intermediate cover shall be applied and maintained in accordance with F.A.C. 62-701.500(7)(f).

All solid waste disposed of in the Class III area must be covered with at least 6 inches of compacted earth or other suitable material as approved by the Department, at the end of each work week. An intermediate cover of one (1) foot of compacted earth in addition to the six (6) inch initial cover shall be applied within seven (7) days of cell completion at all landfills if final cover or an additional lift is not to be applied within 180 days of cell completion.

15. Working Face. As required by F.A.C. 62-701.500(7)(d), the permittee shall minimize the size of the working face to minimize leachate, and unnecessary use of cover material. The permittee shall maintain the working face of a cell only wide enough to efficiently accommodate vehicles discharging waste and to minimize the exposed area. 

This letter is to acknowledge receipt of the revised estimates dated August 14,1995, received by the Department January 17, 1996, for closure and long-term care of the West Pasco Class III Landfill. The cost estimates dated August 14, 1995, as received January 17, 1996, for closure costs of \$782,637.75 and long-term care costs of \$81,681/year (\$2,459,430 total) are APPROVED. The next annual update (revised or inflation-adjusted estimates) is due no later than August 1, 1996.

Please be advised that gas monitoring and control systems may not be required at this time. However, in the event that significant quantities of biodegradable wastes (e.g. furniture, wood, textiles, etc.) are disposed in the Class III disposal facility or landfill gases are evident, gas monitoring/control systems may be required. In the event that these systems are required, the financial assurance costs estimates shall be updated to include the gas monitoring/control systems.

A copy of these estimates will be forwarded to Mr. Fred Wick, Solid Waste Section, FDEP, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2407. Please work with him directly to assess the facility's compliance with the funding mechanism requirements of FAC 62-701.630.
