SECTION 2 - SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

A. Administrative Requirements

- 1. <u>Documents Part of This Permit</u>. The permit application **as finally revised**, **replaced or amended** in response to the Department's Request(s) for Additional Information are contained in the Department's files and are made a part of this Permit. Those documents that make up the complete permit application are listed in APPENDIX 2.
- 2. <u>Permit Modification</u>. Any change to construction, operation or monitoring requirements of this Permit may require a modification to this Permit, in accordance with the provisions of Rule 62-701.320(4), F.A.C.

B. Construction Requirements

- General Construction Requirements. All construction shall be done in accordance with the approved Construction Plan. The Department shall be notified before any changes, other than minor deviations, to the approved Construction Plan are implemented in order to determine whether a permit modification is required.
- 2. <u>Certification of Construction Completion</u>. Upon completion of construction and prior to accepting any used tires at the facility, the engineer of record shall certify to the Department in accordance with Rule 62-701.320(9)(b), F.A.C., that the permitted construction is complete and was done in substantial conformance with the approved construction plans except where minor deviations were necessary. All deviations shall be described in detail and the reasons therefore enumerated.

The Permittee shall not accept used tires at the facility until one of the following has occurred: (1) the Department has stated in writing that it has no objection to the certification of construction completion; or (2) at least 30 days have passed since the certification was submitted and the Department has not responded in writing to the certification.

C. Operation Requirements

1. <u>General Operating Requirements</u>. The Permittee shall operate the facility in accordance with the approved Operation Plan. The Department shall be notified before any changes, other than minor deviations, to the approved Operation Plan are implemented in order to determine whether a permit modification is required.

- 2. <u>Authorized Waste and Material Types</u>. The facility is authorized to manage only the following:
 - a) Used tires stored shall not exceed 15,000, in accordance with the Approval of Alternate Procedures (Case SWAP-04-02), as defined in Rule 62-701.200, F.A.C.
- 3. <u>Unauthorized Waste Types</u>. The facility is not authorized to accept or manage any waste types not listed in C.2 above. Any unauthorized waste inadvertently received by the facility shall be managed in accordance with the approved Operation Plan.

- 5. <u>Facility Capacity</u>. If the facility has reached its permitted capacity for storage of used tires, the Permittee shall not accept additional used tires for processing until sufficient capacity has been restored.
- 6. <u>Storage and Management</u>. At least seventy-five (75) percent of the used tires and waste tires that are delivered to or are stored by the facility at the beginning of each calendar year must be removed for proper use, recycling or disposal from the facility during the year.
- 7. The site of operations shall be easily accessible by trucks and cars, with all-weather access roads maintained in a clean condition.
- 8. The Permittee shall strictly abide by the indoor and outdoor storage capacities furnished in the application for permit and to the quantity for which the financial responsibility is submitted. For storage of a larger quantity of used tires (by weight, volume or number), the Permittee shall demonstrate the indoor and outdoor capacities for storage available on the site and furnish the corresponding financial responsibility. However, the number of used tires stored shall not exceed 15,000 in accordance with the Approval of Alternate Procedures (Case SWAP-04-02).

9. Used tires shall not be processed on-site in a manner rendering them to be no longer whole.

- 10. The Permittee shall comply with the fire control requirements of the City of Avon Park Fire Department, which among other things includes compliance with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 231d, Standard for Storage of Rubber Tires (current edition). A fire survey shall be conducted semi-annually by the local fire authority showing that the Facility does not represent a fire hazard to the local community. Results of the survey shall be submitted to the Department in January and July of each year.
- 11. <u>Contingency Plan and Notification of Emergencies</u>. The Permittee shall notify the Department in accordance with the approved Emergency Preparedness Manual. Notification shall be made to the Solid Waste Section of DEP's South District Office at 239-344-5600.
- 12. <u>Housekeeping</u>. The facility shall be operated to control dust, vectors, litter and objectionable odors. All used tires shall be stored in a manner that does not create mosquito or rat harborage. Records documenting the type and quantity of insecticides and rodenticides (approved by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services) used to control vectors shall be kept on-site, and shall be made available to Department personnel upon request.

D. Closure Requirements

- 1. <u>General Closure Requirements</u>. The Permittee shall close the waste tire processing facility in accordance with the provisions of the approved Closure Plan. The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations, and restrictions set forth in this Permit are "permit conditions" and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Sections 403.141, 403.727, or 403.859 through 403.861, F.S. Neither does it authorize any injury to public or private property or any invasion of personal rights, nor any infringement of federal, state or local laws or regulations. This Permit is not a waiver of or approval of any other Department permit that may be required for other aspects of the total project which are not addressed in the Permit.
- This Permit conveys no title to land or water, does not constitute State recognition or acknowledgement of title, and does not constitute authority for the use of submerged lands unless herein provided and the necessary title or leasehold interests have been obtained from the State. Only the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund may express State opinion as to title.
- 5. This Permit does not relieve the Permittee from liability for harm or injury to human health or welfare, animal or plant life, or property caused by the construction or operation of this permitted source or from penalties therefore; nor does it allow the Permittee to cause pollution in contravention of Florida Statutes and Department rules, unless specifically authorized by any order from the Department.
- 6. The Permittee shall properly operate and maintain the facility and systems of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) that are installed and used by the Permittee to achieve compliance with the conditions of this Permit, as required by Department rules. 

The term "live load" indicates when a truck is scheduled to arrive at a certain time on a certain day and he is immediately loaded and sent on his way. This usually takes 4 hours to load. This type of procedure dictates that we save approx 500-600 waste steel truck tires to fill a trailer.

FTT ships their OTR waste tires to this company in 53' truckloads. We also live load these tires for lower shipping costs. We save approx. 200-300 OTR scrap to fill a 53" trailer.

Global Tire Recycling 1201 Industrial Drive Wildwood, Florida 34785 Sumter County 352.33.2213

FTT ships their Bias Scrap Truck Tires to this company in 53' trailer loads. We live load these trailers and this dictates we save approx. 500 tires for a full load.

Global Tire Recycling 1201 Industrial Drive Wildwood, Florida 34785 Sumter County 352.33.2213

FTT ships their passenger waste whole tires to this company. These tires are shipped in a 53' trailer that is kept at our dock and is traded out for an empty after it is fully loaded.

Part I- General Information.

- A. Applicant Information- This information is very basic and it reveals that Beck's Tire Service is the applicant of record with the address in Avon Park, FL. This section also shows that no enforcement actions have been taken against the Florida location.
- B. Facility Information- This information indicates that Florida Tire Terminal (FTT) is the facility of record. The location coordinates are provided. No construction is currently needed.
 - 1. -The dates of construction are based solely on the date that this application is accepted or rejected. The construction is very low tech with a series of berms being installed to protect against runoff. These berms and there placement were approved by the Local Fire official and were included in the alternative procedures that were approved at the state level. Two rows of barrier block are also slated for installation to form a barrier for a fire lane. This is also shown in the Facility Plan.
- C. Land Owner Information- The facility is actually located on two separate pieces of property, which are adjacent to one another. The landowner information indicates that the applicant of record, BECK'S TIRE SERVICE, INC. owns the property at 400 Feagin St. The property addressed, as 301 Feagin St. is owned by L & R Lands and the appropriate information is included within the application and the Application Addendum under item # 8.
- D. Facility Operator Information- This information indicates that BECK'S TIRE SERVICE is the operator of the facility.
- E. Preparer of Application-This information indicates that Robert A. Reisig in conjunction with Polston Engineering is the preparer of the application

Part II-Operations

A- Facility Type-FTT is a waste tire processor that does not process waste tires. We repair and regroove tires for resale.

B-Type of Facility- This indicates that FTT is a transfer station. FTT buys and is paid for the tires that come into our facility. We then cull the tires and dispose of the bad tires. The good tires are put thru our regrooving and repairing facility.

C & D-Storage-This facility will be limited to 15,000 tires in storage. The figures in the application indicate a maximum of 230.23 tons. These figures were calculated based on available space. The formula used was created by figuring how many truckloads could fit into any given area while still maintaining

compliance with the local fire officials needs. The average truckload weighs approximately 40,000 lbs (20 Tons) and that is what we based the figures on.

E- Disposal Facilities-I have attached a list of four facilities where we ship our waste tires.

F-There are no waste tires processed at FTT and in turn were taken to markets for processed tires.

The main building is approx 4000 sq. feet and this is our main office / finished product building. This is where we store most of the tires that that we sell to users and dealers. The building is made of concrete and wood frame const. and it has a steel roof. The second building is our production building. This building is new in 2006 and replaced an older building of similar size that was lost in Hurricane Charlie in 2004. The new building is approx 6000 sq. ft and it is entirely constructed from steel with a concrete floor. We repair and regroove tires in this building. The third building on property is our service building. This building is approx. 3000 sq. feet and is constructed from wood frame and steel sides and roof. This is where we mount tires on vehicles. We also assemble aircraft tire units in this building. These units are used on roadside mowers. The fourth building on property is an 1800 wood frame building with steel sides and roof. This building is used solely for steel wheel and rim storage. The fifth and last building is apprx 4000 sq. ft. and is constructed of block and wood with a steel roof. One half of this building is leased out for office space and the other half is where we store our new tires and inner tubes.

The facility itself sits on approx 3.5 acres and the surface varies from asphalt to shell and some sandy areas. A 6 ft. fence surrounds it and a block wall borders a large section. There are apprx 5 lean-toos on the property and we use these to store tires out of the weather. There are numerous fire lanes and gates and doors lock all entrances. We take extreme caution to keep the facility mowed and weeded at all times.

- b. Wetlands- There are no wetlands or water bodies within 200 ft. of the facility.
- c. Storm Water- the measures include the existing berms which are indicated on the Facility Plan.
- d. Boundaries- these boundaries are indicated on the Facility Plan.
- e. Wells-There are no wells on the property and no known wells within 200 ft.
- f. Structures- the structures that have been constructed are some shell berms that will help control rainwater runoff. These berms will also prevent runoff in case of a fire. The addition of barrier blocks will also be used to cordon off fire lanes.

The Industrial designation shall be compatible with adjacent land uses, promote a variety of employment opportunities and facilitate a diversified economic base, and promote efficient use of public facilities and services. New industry shall be located in areas with existing industrial land uses and amenities. Public Schools are prohibited within this Future Land Use Map designation. The maximum floor to area ratio for the Industrial future land use designation shall not exceed 1.00.

Light Industry (I-1) Zoning Description:

Section 2.04.02.10 of the Avon Park Land Development Code states that the purpose of the I-1 Zoning District is to provide for a variety of commercial and light industrial activities in areas where such uses will create a minimum of adverse impacts on surrounding properties. Light Industry includes but is not limited to business or office parks and warehousing. Uses permitted within the I-1 Zoning District are detailed in the Table of Land Uses in Section 2.04.01(A) of the Land Development Code. 





1.) FTT is a tire dealer that specializes in used tires. We purchase and get paid to procure our rough stock from which we process and sell our finished product. We sell used tires by repairing, regrooving, and mounting the tires. We also wholesale to other tire dealers throughout the state.

We receive our waste tires by collecting them throughout the state and bringing them to our Avon Park facility. We unload them at our unloading dock and place

them into 5 categories.

The categories include a) Bias Truck, b) Radial Steel Truck, c) Passenger, d) OTR, and f) Reusable Tires. The first 4 categories are all waste and are stored on or adjacent to the loading dock. These waste tires are shipped out when a full truck load is accumulated. The last category is the reusable group and they are stored until processed. These are stored adjacent to our production facility.



These 4400 units totaled equal approximately 230.23 tons. These 4 cells are shown on the storage cell plot plan included. The Avon Park Fire Marshall concluded that these cells would be appropriate for tire storage. This approval is outlined in the Avon Park Fire Control Survey written on Nov 9th, 2004. In Conjunction with the survey we also requested and received an approval for "Alternate Procedures" in relationship to rules 62-711.540(2)(e), 62-711.540(2)(g), and 62-711.540(3)(c). This alternative procedure approval provides F.T.T. with the ability to store tires on the current facility. The State of Florida Dept. of Environmental Protection Division of Waste Management in Tallahassee, Fl. gave this approval and a copy is included.

Mr. Reisig,

In the original plan for your business a complete fire alarm system was listed. This was based on the assumption that an alarm system was already in place and only a few devices would need to be added. The Fire Prevention code does not require an alarm in your facility so this requirement will be removed. I do encourage you to install a system that will provide early detection and notification of the fire department because of the nature of the commodities stored and sold at the facility.

One item that has not been covered is a key safe that will allow fire department access to all buildings without having to wait for a key holder to arrive. In the event of an emergency, rapid access can reduce the impact and damage to your business.

I am providing code language from the 2008 Fire Prevention code for guidance. This will become affective October 1, 2008. This should allow you to maintain an acceptable level of safety in your business.

APPROVAL OF ALTERNATE PROCEDURES

This cause comes before me upon receipt of a request by Florida Tire Terminal. for the approval of alternate procedures and requirements under Rule 62-701.310, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), for use of an alternate procedure for managing waste tires. The petitioner requests that an exception be granted from compliance with provisions of Rules 62-701.200 and 62-711.530, F.A.C., which require a waste tire processing facility to cut, burn, or otherwise alter waste tires so that they are no longer whole. The petitioner also requests an exemption from the following rules regarding the storage of waste tires:

- Rule 62-711.540(2)(e), F.A.C., which requires fire walls in certain locations;
- Rule 62-711.540(2)(g), F.A.C., which requires sprinkler systems in certain locations in lieu of fire walls; and
- Rule 62-711.540(3)(c), F.A.C., which requires a 50 foot fire lane around each ED waste tire pile.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- I. The petitioner currently operates a business that procures, repairs and sells used tires, retreaded, regrooved and new tires in Avon Park, Highlands County, Florida. The business receives shipments of used tires and sells used tires and retreaded or regrooved tires to the public. The petitioner has stated that an inventory of 15,000 tires is necessary to support the projected level of business.
- 2. The petitioner maintains some equipment to alter waste tires in preparation for retreading or to regroove them, but does not maintain equipment to cut, shred, burn, or otherwise alter waste tires so that they are no longer whole. However, the petitioner's operation does result in the removal of waste tires from the solid waste stream in Florida and the recycling, reuse, or disposal of those tires.
- 3. The Avon Park Fire Department has inspected the facility and set out fire control guidelines for the petitioner to follow to comply with NFPA Standard 231D, Standard for Storage of Rubber Tires, including the exceptions for existing buildings. This standard contains requirements, among others, that are equivalent to or more stringent than those found in Rules 62-711.540(2) and (3), F.A.C. In addition, the requirements imposed by this standard provide fire protection equivalent to that found in Rule 62-711.540(3)(c), F.A.C. The Avon Park Fire Department has notified the applicant it will require him to adhere to these standards.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Rule 62-701.310, F.A.C., authorizes the approval by the Department of alternate procedures and requirements concerning solid waste management facilities. Based upon the above findings and the information contained in the Request for Alternate Procedures the Department makes the following conclusions.

- 1. The petitioner manages waste tires, which are defined in Rule 62-701.200(134), F.A.C., as including used tires. The petitioner is therefore prohibited by Rule 62-711.400, F.A.C., from maintaining more than 1500 used tires except as an integral part of a waste tire processing facility.
- 2. A waste tire processing facility is defined in Rule 62-701.200(137), F.A.C., as a site where equipment is used to recapture reusable by-products from waste tires or to cut, burn, or otherwise alter waste tires so that they are no longer whole. The petitioner's facility contains some equipment for altering tires in preparation for retreading or to regroove them, but no equipment that would alter them so they are no longer whole. However, the petitioner has demonstrated that its facility serves the same purpose as would a waste tire processing facility that does use equipment to alter waste tires so that they are no longer whole, and will provide an equal degree of protection for the public and the environment. The petitioner has also demonstrated that its facility is expected to be at least as effective in removing waste tires from the solid waste stream as would a facility containing processing equipment. Therefore, the



Department concludes that the petitioner's facility should be regulated as a waste tire processing facility under Chapter 62-711, F.A.C.

3. The Department also concludes that compliance with NFPA Standard 213D, Standard for Storage of Rubber Tires, as required by the Avon Park Fire Department in its letter of November 9, 2004, will provide an equivalent degree of fire protection as would strict compliance with Department rules. For this reason, the relief requested from the provisions of Rules 62-711.540(2)(e), 62-711.540(2)(g), and 62-711.540(3)(c), F.A.C., is warranted.

Upon consideration of the foregoing it is therefore ORDERED that the request for alternate procedures from Rules 62-701.200, 62-711.530, 62-711.540(2)(e), 62-711.540(2)(g), and 62-711.540(3)(c), F.A.C., is GRANTED, so that the petitioner's facility may be considered a waste tire processing facility, subject to the following conditions:

CONDITIONS

- 1. This Order does not authorize the petitioner to operate the facility or to maintain more than 1500 used tires at the facility. Instead, the petitioner must obtain a separate waste tire processing facility permit from the South District Office of the Department. Failure of the petitioner to obtain such a permit may result in enforcement actions for operating a waste tire processing facility without a permit.
- 2. The petitioner shall submit a permit application for a Waste Tire Processing Facility that conforms to Chapter 62-711, F.A.C., to the South District Office of the Department within 30 days after receipt of this Order. If such a permit is issued, this



Order will be incorporated into that permit and will be reviewed at the time of permit renewal. However, unless the Department takes affirmative action to revoke or modify this Order, it will have an unlimited duration.

- 3. The petitioner may apply for a storage limit not to exceed 15,000 used tires. The storage limit shall not exceed the quantity for which financial assurance is provided as part of the waste tire processing facility permit. The facility shall not accept any waste tires if it has reached its permitted storage limit.
- 4. The petitioner shall not receive any waste tires if the tire selling business closes for any reason, unless the petitioner can demonstrate that the permitted storage limit for this facility will not be exceeded and that the proof of financial assurance is sufficient to close the site.
- 5. The petitioner shall comply with the fire control requirements set forth in the November 9, 2004 letter from the Avon Park Fire Department, which among other things, requires compliance with the NFPA Standard 231D, Standard for Storage of Rubber Tires.

NOTICE OF RIGHTS

Pursuant to Section 403.815, F.S., and Rule 62-110.106, F.A.C., you are required to publish at your own expense the enclosed Notice of Proposed Agency Action. The notice shall be published one time only within 30 days in the legal ad section of a newspaper of general circulation in the area affected. For the purpose of this rule, "publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the area affected" means publication in a newspaper meeting the requirements of Sections 50.011 and 50.031,



F.S., in the county where the activity is to take place. Where there is more than one newspaper of general circulation in the county, the newspaper used must be one with significant circulation in the area that may be affected by the permit. If you are uncertain that a newspaper meets these requirements, please contact the Department at the address or telephone number listed below. You must provide proof of publication to the Department at the address listed below within seven days of publication.

In the alternative, you may include the following language in the notice of proposed agency action for the waste tire processing facility permit, provided that the public notice allows 21 days for the filing of any petition:

Petitions by the applicant or any of the parties listed below must be filed within 21 days of receipt of this written notice. Petitions filed by other persons must be filed within 21 days of publication of the notice or receipt of the written notice, whichever occurs first. Under Section 120.60(3), F.A.C., however, any person who asked the Department for notice of agency action may file a petition within 14 days of receipt of such notice, regardless of the date of publication. The petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing. 
