Item 5.7: A formal wetland identification was not performed, but there seemed to be waste in wetlands. Facility representative Ron Wiesman stated that the pile was leftover from an attempt to place the DDMS further west. Please remove this pile of yard waste so that it is not located within potential wetlands and send photo documentation to the Department of its removal within 15 days of receipt of this report. The current pile may be located near the wetland edge as the soil was dark and there was deep rutting from where vehicles had been stuck previously. Please ensure the yard waste pile is not in wetlands and keep the pile as close to the access road as possible (east side of DDMS).

Item 15.14: During the inspection on the north side of the pile there was not a sufficient 20ft all-weather access lane due to some logs sticking out past the pile. Please ensure the pile maintains a 20ft all-weather access lane along the perimeter of the pile.
