Note that all references to "Application" in the following text refer to the document entitled, "Small Waste Tire Processing Facility Permit Application, DEP Form 62-701.900(24) and the supporting documentation," Prepared by: Raymond J. Chewning, P.E., Waste Management – Vista Landfill, LLC, Apopka, Florida 32703, dated June 2009.

1. Provide information to indicate which of the following apply to your proposed Small Waste Tire Processing facility:

a) Do you plan to have a stationary shredder at the facility? A Small Waste Tire Processing Facility Permit allows up to 1500 waste tires to be stored at the facility at any one time and allows up to 1500 waste tires to be processed during any 30 day period.

b) If you are using a Contractor with a mobile shredder at your facility and the shredder is used less than 120 consecutive days each time, the Contractor needs to apply for a General Permit on DEP Form 62-701.900(19) with a fee of \$100.00 to DEP – Tallahassee. If this is the case, then Vista Landfill is eligible to apply for a Small Waste Tire Processing Facility Permit which allows 1500 waste tires to be stored at the facility at any one time and allows up to 1500 waste tires to be processed during any 30 day period.

c) If a mobile shredder operates at the facility greater than 120 consecutive days, the landfill will be considered a waste tire processing facility and shall require a permit pursuant to Rule 62-711.530, F.A.C.

2. DEP Form 62-701.900(24), Page 2 of 3, Part II-B: Provide the make, model and hourly capacity of the shredder that will be used at the facility.

3. DEP Form 62-701.900(24), Page 2 of 3, Part II-C: Provide an estimate of the quantity of waste or residue that will be generated from the processing of up to 1500 tires per month. Please note that residue means any leftover, discarded material from waste tire processing, including dust, fines, small chips, metal and fiber. Where will these materials be disposed of?

4. Operation Plan, Page 3 – Section 4(b): The "five waste tires," in the third line should be changed to "twenty-five waste tires."

5. Provide an explanation of how the owner or operator shall control mosquitoes and rodents so as to protect the public health and welfare, Rule 62-711.540(1)(j), F.A.C.
