EXHIBIT A

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MATERIAL REMOVAL AND SITE RECONFIGURATION:

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1. Although GEORGIA PACIFIC was closed for boiler repair for two weeks during the period, and as a result accepted very little material (TDF), as the summary page for the period 05/02/94 through 05/31/94 indicates, FLORIDA TIRE RECYCLING, INC. (FTR) successfully removed 3966.18 tons. During this same period FTR collected 1854.05 tons. Based on a 21 collection day month (Memorial Day was observed as a holiday by FTR) the Base Removal Amount (BRA) for the period is (2100 + 1854.05) 3954.05 tons.

As this record indicates, FTR exceeded the BRA for the month of May by 12.13 tons. Moreover, for the entire period of the Stipulation commencing on January 14, 1994 through May 31, 1994 the Company has exceeded the BRA by 1,366.06 tons.

2. All fire lanes required in the Stipulation to be in place on or before the end of May are completed. Since several of these fire lanes are used for access to the material lying in the FP&L easement there is from time to time shredded material dropped on these roadways as the front end loaders relocate the material in the FP&L easement to other storage areas on the site. Nonetheless, and for the most part, the road ways are clear and free of shreds.

3. By the end of May FTR had substantially cleared all of the shredded material from the southern access road. However, as the attached communication to Mr. Wilcox dated May 2, 1994 indicates, there remain two piles of shredded material adjacent to what FTR believed to be sensitive wetland areas and which FTR requested some direction as to the process of removal verses the risk to further damage of the wetland area. By the close of the month (May 31, 1994) FTR had not received a directive from Mr. Wilcox. As a result these two shred piles still remain marginally within the 50' perimeter road area.

4. On May 2, 1994 FTR requested the Department "immediately issue its written authorization for FTR to proceed with relocation of shredded material from the FP&L easement area to those areas of the property which lie within the "loop road" and the depositing of those materials in accordance with the storage plan contained in the Company's pending MSSW permit application."

With no response received after 17 days, FTR once again posed the question on May 19, 1994 (see attached letter dated May 2, addressed to Joseph Kahn, PE). Mr. Kahn's response on May 19, 1994 (see attached letter to Skip Robinson from Joseph Kahn, PE) still leaves the question without a clear resolution.

Now that the spring/summer rainfall has peaked, the Range Line Road swale continues to back flood FTR's property (the County has worked only 3 days cleaning the swale - very little accomplished) and without the issuance of the MSSW permit to manage the surface water, FTR is unable to build pads on which to relocate the balance of the material from the FP&L easement.

Nonetheless, FTR continues to work vigorously to move as much material as possible to other areas (working areas) of the site as well as to remove that material from the site for use as fuel or for disposal in an approved landfill.

5. On the 9th, 10th, 16th, 23rd and 24th of May, FTR worked to clear an area at the southwest corner of its property to accept pads on which to relocate the shredded material once the MSSW permit is received. Upon receipt of the MSSW permit and once the back flooding from the Range Line Road swale recedes, FTR will immediately commence the relocation of shredded material as contemplated in the plans previously submitted.

6. Throughout the month FTR continued to shred the remaining whole tires located at the southern portion of its property. At the end of May there remains only 2 whole tire piles in this area, T7 and T3; half of T7 has been shred.

#### ENGINEERING AND PERMIT APPLICATIONS:

1. On May 20, 1994 FTR sent to Mr. Coffelt's attention a copy of the signed Cross-Easement which establishes FTR's use of the southern boarder access road.

2. On May 21, 1994 Paul R. McGinnes and Associates Laboratories completed the water quality testing at the site. The report subsequently furnished to FTR has at this writing been forwarded to Jacqueline Kelly.

3. On May 23, 1994 FTR sent to Mr. Coffelt's attention a copy of the Right-of-Way Consent Agreement which authorizes FTR to use areas in the FP&L easement for wet and dry detention.

At a meeting held at FDEP on the first of June Mr. Coffelt confirmed that FTR's MSSW application was now complete and that FTR would shortly be receiving written confirmation of its "completeness".

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EXHIBIT B

FIRE EQUIPMENT: EQUIPMENT AND TRAINING

1. FTR has completed the installation of the foam equipment on one of the Company's two fire trucks and has conducted several practice sessions. At the most recent of these held at the very end of the month, Mike Gablemann of the St. Lucie / Ft. Pierce Fire Department attended and provided final hands on training. This training session was in anticipation of a demonstration to be provided on June 6, 1994 for Mr. Lurix of FDEP.



Dear Mr. Kahn,

As promised and required by Paragraph 10.L. of the Stipulation Order of January 14, 1994, FLORIDA TIRE RECYCLING, INC. (FTR) requests that DEP immediately issue its written authorization for FTR to proceed with relocation of shredded material from the FP&L easement area to those areas of the property which lie within the "loop road" and the depositing of those materials in accordance with the storage plan contained in the Company's pending MSSW permit application. The associated pads which must be constructed underlying each such storage location will be constructed as required and in accordance with the submitted application.

All of the foregoing assumes that FTR will otherwise comply with the regulations of the DEP and will not place the materials in jurisdictional wetlands or on the perimeter roads and fire lanes and that the requirements of Chapter 17-711, F.A.C. will be met.

FTR's urgent request for this written authorization arises out of the following circumstances: (1) in Paragraph 10.L. of the Stipulation Order DEP promised that it would give such written authorization in this type of circumstance; (2) various oral communications from DEP Southeast District personnel have advised FTR that it cannot relocate the FP&L easement materials to the intended final configuration locations, necessarily involving the construction of the associated pads, until the MSSW permit is issued; (3) DEP's inexplicable and unjustified change of position in late April 1994 first indicating that DEP is now tolling the 180 day time period associated with this reconfiguration during the pendency of FTR's MSSW permit application; and, (4) conflicting oral communications contradicting simultaneous written communication regarding this subject.

So that the fourth point is clear, please find attached a copy of DEP Attorney, Janet Bowman's correspondence of April 25, 1994. Therein Attorney Bowman indicated that FTR could reconfigure the shreds without the need for the MSSW permit. Based upon this advice FTR was making preparations to move forward with the

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
construction of the pads and the reconfiguration of the materials. Accordingly, FTR informed Mr. Coffelt, on April 26, 1994, that it was doing so. However, almost simultaneously Attorney Bowman called the Company Attorney, James R. Brindell, on April 26, 1994, and verbally informed him that FTR could not proceed with the construction of the pads (necessary for compliance with the MSSW plan) until the MSSW permit was issued. Mr. Brindell asked her to put this in writing, but she declined.

DEP is required by its agreement with FTR (see Paragraph 10.L.) to give it definitive written guidance on this specific issue of whether or not DEP is or is not permitting FTR to reconfigure the shreds located in the FP&L easement in accordance with the currently submitted plan for reconfiguration and before the issuance of an MSSW permit (i.e., also allowing it to construct the required pads). The DEP has written ambiguous letters to FTR and then made "clarifying" and contradictory phone calls which have the effect of prohibiting the Company from doing that which it needs to be able to do to implement the Stipulation Order. If it will not issue such unequivocal guidance, FTR will understand that it must await the issuance of the permit.

Moreover, FTR disagrees with the DEP's announcement in late April 1994 that the reconfiguration of these materials is not dependent upon the permitting associated with the site utilization. Similarly, it is not good faith for DEP to suggest that FTR can move thousands of tons of materials on multiple occasions just to satisfy DEP while the Company awaits DEP required approval actions. It was for this reason that the tolling provision was placed in the Stipulation. This is a bad faith position by an agency which gave its assurances of utmost good faith in connection with the Stipulation Order. DEP's having taken this position has already adversely affected FTR's ability to raise capital to go forward with its business plan. Nevertheless, the Company is prepared to move forward at the earliest possible time, if DEP will live up to the terms of the Agreement.

FTR is meeting or exceeding all other requirements of the Stipulation which are within its control. We are currently disposing of more material in the form of TDF than is required by the administrative regulation. If DEP will work with FTR to achieve the goal of doing that which makes the most environmental and economic sense, FTR's operation will be a model of what the Florida Legislature envisioned. Please help us accomplish this by being part of the solution.
