Dear Mr. Phillips:

A hazardous waste compliance inspection was conducted at your facility on September 18, 1995. This inspection was conducted under the authority of Section 403.091, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 403, Part IV, Florida Statutes, and is designed to ascertain the compliance status of your facility with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations Parts 260 through 270, as adopted in Florida Administrative Code Chapter 62-730.

Based on the inspection findings the Department has determined that the status of your facility is a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste (CESQG).

Enclosed is information concerning the management of hazardous waste, in the State of Florida, which may be applicable to your facility. The Department recommends that you notify the Department's Tallahassee office of your hazardous waste activities on EPA form 8700-12 as soon as possible (form enclosed).

The Department has the following recommendations.

1. All drums or containers containing liquid wastes and/or possible hazardous waste should be staged on an impervious surface in an area protected from road hazards and the weather.
2. All drums or containers containing liquid wastes and/or possible hazardous waste should be marked or labeled as hazardous waste or with words that identifies the containers contents.
3. All drums or containers containing liquid wastes and/or possible hazardous waste should be kept closed at all times except when adding or removing waste.
4. You should not store greater than a total of 1,000 kilograms (about five 55 gallon drums) of hazardous waste at your facility at any one time. Should you exceed the above mentioned total you may be subject to full regulation as a large quantity generator (LQG).
5. Any drum which appears to have structurally failed or is failing should be overpacked or its contents transferred to a structurally sound drum.

6. Waste absorbent should not be disposed of in crushed cars. A waste determination should be conducted on a representative sample of the waste absorbent to determine if it is a hazardous wastes. All waste absorbent should be accumulated in a container and managed in accordance with the above mentioned recommendations.

Dear Mr. Phillips:

A hazardous waste compliance inspection was conducted at your facility on September 18, 1995. This inspection was conducted under the authority of Section 403.091, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 403, Part IV, Florida Statutes, and is designed to ascertain the compliance status of your facility with Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations Parts 260 through 270, as adopted in Florida Administrative Code Chapter 62-730.

Based on the inspection findings the Department has determined that the status of your facility is a conditionally exempt small quantity generator of hazardous waste (CESQG).

Enclosed is information concerning the management of hazardous waste, in the State of Florida, which may be applicable to your facility. The Department recommends that you notify the Department's Tallahassee office of your hazardous waste activities on EPA form 8700-12 as soon as possible (form enclosed).

The Department has the following recommendations.

1. All drums or containers containing liquid wastes and/or possible hazardous waste should be staged on an impervious surface in an area protected from road hazards and the weather.
2. All drums or containers containing liquid wastes and/or possible hazardous waste should be marked or labeled as hazardous waste or with words that identifies the containers contents.
3. All drums or containers containing liquid wastes and/or possible hazardous waste should be kept closed at all times except when adding or removing waste.
4. You should not store greater than a total of 1,000 kilograms (about five 55 gallon drums) of hazardous waste at your facility at any one time. Should you exceed the above mentioned total you may be subject to full regulation as a large quantity generator (LQG).
5. Any drum which appears to have structurally failed or is failing should be overpacked or its contents transferred to a structurally sound drum.

6. Waste absorbent should not be disposed of in crushed cars. A waste determination should be conducted on a representative sample of the waste absorbent to determine if it is a hazardous wastes. All waste absorbent should be accumulated in a container and managed in accordance with the above mentioned recommendations.
