Compliance Assistance Site Visit

Dear Ms. Violet:

A follow up inspection was conducted at your facility on May 11, 2000.

The inspection noted that Oils Unlimited has purchased a x-ray fluorescence used oil analyzer for testing oils to determine specification characteristics. Testing procedures and the testing unit itself is still under development and in the interim samples are sent to Tennessee for specification testing. Used oil accepted from other transporters is currently segregated until specification testing is completed at which time the used oil is co-mingled into one tank. This tank is again sampled and declared on-specification for marketing purposes. As long as used oil accepted from other transporters is declared on-specification prior to mixing with other loads; a Used Oil Processor Permit is not required.

The testing laboratory is still reporting constituents that are *non-detect* as negative numbers on the lab report. In addition, flash point is listed but not reported. Oils Unlimited should have the laboratory run and report flash point and ensure that constituents that are non-detect are reported properly.

In order for Oils Unlimited to remain in compliance with used oil regulations, you must continue to declare oil accepted from other transporters as on-specification prior to mixing, or obtain a Used Oil Processor Permit. In addition, storage capacity can not exceed 25,000 capacity.
