Subject: Drums located outside at Summerlin Storage Facility on Pine Ridge Road

04/10/02 Called Dixie Structures and spoke with Gwen Blackwell wife of Brian Blackwell who leased storage space from Michael (Tony) Allen at Summerlin Storage. I explained to Ms. Blackwell that on April 8, 2002, while looking for another company in regard to a complaint, I observed several drums outside of the storage unit leased to Dixie Structures. There were two full closed blue steel ring top 55-gallon drums with Sherwin Williams paint labels on them and that one of them had what appeared to be sludge or waste paint in it. There was also a ~half full closed gray steel 55-gallon drum with a tap in one of the bungholes and a label with some numbers and a barcode. Ms. Blackwell said that the drum with the tap in it was product mineral spirits and that she did not know the contents of the other two drums. Ms. Blackwell cooperatively agreed to find out the contents of the two remaining drums and when disposed she agreed to send copies of the manifest.

04/22/02 Called to check status of drums and learned that the facility telephone number had changed to 863-612-0102. Called the new number and again spoke with Ms. Blackwell and she said they had moved to their new location at 851 Elm Street, LaBelle 33935. Ms. Blackwell said the drums were scheduled to be removed by Howco Environmental.

04/22/02 Went to the new facility location on the way to another inspection in LaBelle and met with Ms. Blackwell for a few minutes. I walked through the new location of the business and determined that the drums had not been relocated to the new facility location.

May 13, 2002 Received faxed copy of Howco manifest dated 04/26/02 for the removal of four drums of contaminated soil waste determination ID # 042202785-001.
