Introduction:

On September 10, 2015, John White, Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP), accompanied by Corina Lee and Daniel Hall, FDEP, inspected A. R. Paquette & Company, Inc. for compliance with state and federal hazardous waste and used oil regulations. Jessica Ogle, Comptroller, and Chris Paquette, Operations Manager, for A.R. Paquette & Company, Inc. accompanied the inspectors on the inspection.

A.R. Paquette & Company, Inc. (A.R. Paquette) most recently notified in August of 2015 as a Non-Handler of hazardous waste, a Transporter of hazardous waste, and a Small Quantity Handler of universal waste. The company originally notified in April 1987 and received EPA identification number FLD982105884.

The facility has been at this location since 1996 and operates Monday through Friday 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. The facility has twenty trucks and fifteen drivers and is connected to a potable well for drinking water and a septic system for domestic wastewater.

INSPECTION HISTORY (last 7 years)

The facility was last inspected by the Department in March 2013 as a Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator, a Transporter of hazardous waste, and a Used Oil Generator. The facility was in compliance at the time of the inspection.

The facility was inspected by the Department in 2008 as a Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator, a Transporter of hazardous waste, and a Used Oil Generator. The facility was cited for failure to sign and date manifests and failure to include an EPA ID number on the form. The violations were resolved without formal enforcement.

Process Description:

A.R. Paquette is a national hazardous materials and hazardous waste transporter. The facility also rents Penske trucks.

The facility conducts full maintenance on their vehicles, including work on engines and transmissions, in a large bay. Used oil is stored in a properly labeled, 200-gallon tank inside the shop. Used oil filters are stored in a properly labeled container. One drum of spent antifreeze and three drums of contaminated absorbent were also stored in the area.

The facility has one parts washer that is serviced by the facility approximately twice per year. The spent mineral spirits solvent is collected and managed as hazardous waste. No hazardous waste was on-site at the time of the inspection.

A portion of a 55-gallon drum contained diesel fuel for use in cleaning truck parts. The container held five to ten gallons of diesel fuel that, when spent, is disposed of in the used oil.

RECORDS

Used batteries are shipped to Orlando Freightliner for recycling.

The facility provided inspectors with computer based training records for the employees including DOT Hazardous Materials, Hazard Communications, Incident Reporting, and Roadside Inspections. The facility conducts training every three years. New employees are trained prior to beginning work.

The facility provided the inspectors with hazardous waste manifests. The reviewed manifests were filled out correctly and included the signatures, dates, and EPA ID number. The facility transports hazardous waste from RCRA permitted storage facilities to destination facilities.

The inspectors reviewed the contingency plan and found it to be in compliance.

Conclusion:

A.R. Paquette & Company, Inc. was inspected as a Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator of hazardous waste, a Transporter of hazardous waste, and a Used Oil Generator. The facility was in compliance at the time of the inspection.
