

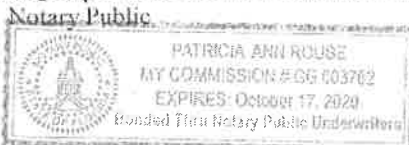

FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE

THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (FDEP) GIVES NOTICE OF ITS INTENT TO ISSUE A PERMIT MODIFICATION UNDER SECTION 403.722, FLORIDA STATUTES (F.S.), AND CHAPTERS 62-4, 62-701, AND 62-730 OF THE FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE (F.A.C.) TO Clean Harbors Florida LLC. This permit relates to Clean Harbors Florida LLC, 7001 Kilo Avenue, Bartow, Florida 33830, FLD 980 729 610 and is issued as part of FDEP's hazardous waste management program, authorized pursuant to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act and the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (RCRA/HSWA).

The draft permit modification contains the conditions for the combined Hazardous Waste Permit 64247-017-HO and Solid Waste Permit 64247-019-SO. The permit is for the purpose of continued operation of hazardous waste container storage, tank storage and treatment facility including a fuel blending facility, and includes corrective action requirements, under the Department's authorized program for implementing/continuing the federal Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) at Clean Harbors Florida LLC site in Bartow, Florida. The solid waste permit modification includes the change in the location of a shredder unit.

Copies of the application and the draft permit modification are available for public inspection during normal business hours 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except legal holidays, at FDEP, Southwest District Office, 13501 North Telecom Parkway Suite 101, Temple Terrace, FL 33637-0926 and at Permitting & Compliance Assistance Program, Division of Waste Management, Bob Martinez Office Building, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 323992400, (850) 245-8783. Electronic copies of the application and draft permit can be accessed in the Department's OCULUS data system located at <http://depdms.dep.state.fl.us/Oculus/serve/login>

A person whose substantial interests are or will be affected by the intent to issue may petition for an administrative determination (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in FDEP's Office of General Counsel, Agency Clerk, 3800 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station 435, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000 or agencyclerk@dep.state.fl.us. Petitions filed by the permit applicant and any parties entitled to written notice under Section 120.50(3), F.S. must be filed within 45 days of receipt of the Intent. Petitions filed by any other persons must be filed within 45 days of publication of this notice or receipt of the Intent, whichever occurs first. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing. The failure of any person to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request a hearing under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. Any subsequent intervention (in a proceeding initiated by another party) will be only at the discretion of the presiding officer upon the filing of a motion in compliance with Rule 28-106.205, F.A.C.

A petition that disputes the material facts on which the Department's action is based must contain the following information:

(a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner, the applicant's name and address, the Department Permit File Number and the county in which the project is proposed; (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Department's action or proposed action; (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Department's action or proposed action; (d) A statement of all material facts disputed by petitioner, or a statement that there are no disputed facts; (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (f) A statement of which rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; and (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Department's action or proposed action.

A petition that does not dispute the material facts on which the Department's action is based shall state that no such facts are in dispute and otherwise shall contain the same information as set forth above, as required by Rule 28-106.301, F.A.C.

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filing of a petition means that the Department's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this notice. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the Department have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.

Any person may request a public meeting regarding the proposed permitting decision pursuant to Section 403.722(10), F.S. A request for a public meeting is not equivalent to a request for a formal or informal administrative hearing. Public meetings are not evidentiary in nature, and information submitted at a public meeting is for non-binding consideration only. A public meeting is not subject to court or appellate review. A request for a public meeting must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel, Agency Clerk, within 45 days of publication of this notice. Failure to file a request for a public meeting within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any right such a person may have to request a meeting under Section 403.722(10), F.S.

Mediation is not available in this proceeding.

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
