NOVEMBER SAFETY TOPIC

Tropical's Hazard Communication Program (GHS & Hazcom)

Applicable to all, SDS' are specific information regarding chemicals found in the workplace, home and every day life. All SDS' include manufacturer information, hazard warnings, composition of ingredients, first aid and firefighting measures, spill response, handling and storage guidance, physical and chemical properties and transportation and regulatory information among others.

As a reminder, Tropical longer no stores Safety Data Sheets (SDS) (formerly known as Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS)) onsite. ChemTel INC electronically stores our library of SDS' to ensure coverage for 24 hours a day X 365 days a year. These are accessible by calling the number below.

How does this affect me?

As an employee, the current rules still apply: chemicals are not allowed to be brought to work unless approved and an SDS is on file with ChemTel.











The Purchasing Dept. maintains our SDS list with ChemTel and must be contacted if an SDS should be added. This ensures chemicals in the workplace always have an SDS on file.

What if I need an SDS?

If an SDS is needed in an emergency, simply call the phone number from the label pictured below. This will be found on all land line telephones and in break rooms. Please refer to the chemicals product information label to accurately access the SDS you are seeking. The ChemTel service will give you the information needed including spill remediation or first aid precautions.



Please review the 6 hazards of classes below.

	Exploding bomb (for explosion or reactivity hazards)		Flame (for fire hazards)		Flame over circle (for oxidizing hazards)
	Gas cylinder (for gases under pressure)		Corrosion (for corrosive damage to metals, as well as skin, eyes)		Skull and Crossbones (can cause death or toxicity with short exposure to small amounts)
	Health hazard (may cause or suspected of causing serious health effects)		Exclamation mark (may cause less serious health effects or damage the ozone layer*)		Environment* (may cause damage to the aquatic environment)
	Biohazardous Infectious Materials (for organisms or toxins that can cause diseases in people or animals)				

* The GHS system also defines an Environmental hazards group. This group (and its classes) was not adopted in WHMIS 2015. However, you may see the environmental classes listed on labels and Safety Data Sheets (SDSs). Including information about environmental hazards is allowed by WHMIS 2015.
