This permit is issued under the provisions of Chapter(s) 403, Florida Statutes, and Florida Administrative Code Rule(s) 62-4, 62-701 and 62-711. The above named permittee is hereby authorized to perform the work or operate the facility shown on the application and approved drawing(s), plans, and other documents attached hereto or on file with the Department and made a part hereof and specifically described as follows:

- To construct and operate a waste tire processing facility.
- Empire Tire will provide services including collection, culling and shredding of scrap tires. Various
 products will be made from the processing of these tires including rubber mulch, tire derived
 aggregate and tire derived fuel. Any residual material will be loaded onto walking floor trailers or
 roll-off containers and shipped to a DEP permitted disposal facility.

LOCATION: This facility is located at 550 Mission Road, Orlando, in Section 30, Township 22 South, Range 29 East, in Orange County, Florida.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations and restrictions set forth in this permit, are "permit conditions" and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Sections 403.141, 403.727, or 403.859 through 403.861, Florida Statutes (F.S.) The permittee is placed on notice that the Department will review this permit periodically and may initiate enforcement action for any violation of these conditions.
- This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department.
- 3. As provided in subsections 403.087(6) and 403.722(5), F.S., the issuance of this permit does not convey any vested rights or any exclusive privileges. Neither does it authorize any injury to public or private property or any invasion of personal rights, nor any infringement of federal, state, or local laws or regulations. This permit is not a waiver of or approval of any other Department permit that may be required for other aspects of the total project which are not addressed in this permit.
- 4. This permit conveys no title to land or water, does not constitute State recognition or acknowledgment of title, and does not constitute authority for the use of submerged lands unless herein provided and the necessary title or leasehold interests have been obtained from the State. Only the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund may express State opinion as to title.
- 5. This permit does not relieve the permittee from liability for harm or injury to human health or welfare, animal, or plant life, or property caused by the construction or operation of this permitted source, or from penalties therefore; nor does it allow the permittee to cause pollution in contravention of Florida Statutes and Department rules, unless specifically authorized by an order from the Department.
- 6. The permittee shall properly operate and maintain the facility and systems of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) that are installed and used by the permittee to achieve compliance with the conditions of this permit, as required by Department rules. This provision includes the operation of backup and auxiliary facilities or similar systems when necessary to achieve compliance with the conditions of the permit and when required by Department rules.
- 7. The permittee, by accepting this permit, specifically agrees to allow authorized Department personnel, upon presentation of credentials or other documents as may be required by law and at reasonable times, access to the premises where the permitted activity is located or conducted to:
 - (a) Have access to and copy any records that must be kept under conditions of this permit;
 - (b) Inspect the facility, equipment, practices, or operations regulated or required under this permit; and
 - (c) Sample or monitor any substances or parameters at any location reasonably necessary to assure compliance with this permit or Department rules.
- 8. If, for any reason, the permittee does not comply with or will be unable to comply with any condition or limitation specified in this permit, the permittee shall immediately provide the Department with the following information:
 - (a) A description of and cause of noncompliance; and
 - (b) The period of noncompliance, including dates and times; or, if not corrected, the anticipated time the noncompliance is expected to continue, and steps being taken to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance.

The permittee shall be responsible for any and all damages which may result and may be subject to enforcement action by the Department for penalties or for revocation of this permit.

- 9. In accepting this permit, the permittee understands and agrees that all records, notes, monitoring data and other information relating to the construction or operation of this permitted source which are submitted to the Department may be used by the Department as evidence in any enforcement case involving the permitted source arising under the Florida Statutes or Department rules, except where such use is prescribed by Section 403.111 and 403.73, F.S. Such evidence shall only be used to the extent it is consistent with the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure and appropriate evidentiary rules.
- 10. The permittee agrees to comply with changes in Department rules and Florida Statutes after a reasonable time for compliance; provided, however, the permittee does not waive any other rights granted by Florida Statutes or Department rules.
- 11. This permit is transferable only upon Department approval in accordance with Rule 62-4.120 and 62-730.300, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), as applicable. The permittee shall be liable for any non-compliance of the permitted activity until the transfer is approved by the Department.
- 12. This permit or a copy thereof shall be kept at the work site of the permitted activity.
- 13. The permittee shall comply with the following:
 - (a) Upon request, the permittee shall furnish all records and plans required under Department rules. During enforcement actions, the retention period for all records will be extended automatically unless otherwise stipulated by the Department.
 - (b) The permittee shall hold at the facility or other location designated by this permit records of all monitoring information (including all calibration and maintenance records and all original strip chart recordings for continuous monitoring information) required by the permit, copies of all reports required by this permit, and records of all data used to complete the application for this permit. These materials shall be retained at least three years from the date of the sample, measurement, report, or application unless otherwise specified by Department rule.
 - (c) Records of monitoring information shall include:
 - 1. the date, exact place, and time of sampling or measurements;
 - 2. the person responsible for performing the sampling or measurements:
 - 3. the dates analyses were performed:
 - 4. the person responsible for performing the analyses:
 - 5. the analytical techniques or methods used;
 - 6. the results of such analyses.
- 14. When requested by the Department, the permittee shall within a reasonable time furnish any information required by law which is needed to determine compliance with the permit. If the permittee becomes aware the relevant facts were not submitted or were incorrect in the permit application or in any report to the Department, such facts or information shall be corrected promptly.

Note that time sensitive specific conditions are summarized in Appendix B of this permit.

- 1. <u>Plans and Specifications</u>: Drawings, plans, documents and specifications submitted by the permittee, not attached hereto, but on file at the Central District office, are made a part of this permit. The documents are listed in Appendix A.
- 2. <u>Document Requirements</u>: A copy of the permit, with a complete copy of the permit application and engineering drawings shall be kept on file at the facility for inspection and review upon request.
- 3. Other Permits: This permit does not relieve the permittee from complying with any other appropriate stormwater, ERP or other permit requirements.
- 4. <u>Signs</u>: Signs shall be posted at the entrance to the site stating operating hours, cost of disposal and site rules, Rule 62-711.540(1)(a), F.A.C.
- 5. <u>Site Access</u>: Access to the site shall be restricted by an effective barrier designed to prevent unauthorized entry and dumping, Rule 62-711.540(3)(d), F.A.C.
- 6. <u>Authorized Person On-Site</u>: An operator or other authorized person shall be on-site at all times during business hours.
- 7. Operations Involving Use of Open Flames: No operations involving the use of open flames shall be conducted within 25 feet of a waste tire pile, Rule 62-711.540(1)(b), F.A.C.
- 8. <u>Safety Devices</u>: Safety devices shall be provided on equipment to shield and protect the operators from potential hazards during operation.
- 9. <u>Equipment Breakdown</u>: In the event of equipment malfunction, destruction, breakdown or other problems resulting in the permittee being temporarily unable to comply with any of the conditions of this permit, the permittee shall immediately notify the Department. The notification shall address the cause of the problem, corrective action, and what steps are being taken to prevent a recurrence as required by Rule 62-4.130, F.A.C.
- 10. <u>Stormwater Control Methods</u>: Stormwater control methods shall meet stormwater requirements of Chapter 62-25 and 62-330, F.A.C. The facility shall be managed in such a way as to divert stormwater or floodwater around and away from the storage piles, Rule 62-711.540(3)(a), F.A.C.
- 11. <u>Emergency Situations</u>: The operator of the site shall immediately notify the Department in the event of a fire or other emergency if that emergency has potential off-site effects. Within two weeks of any emergency involving potential off-site impact, the operator of the site shall submit to the Department, a written report on the emergency. This report shall describe the origins of the emergency, the actions that were taken to deal with the emergency, the results of the actions that were taken, and an analysis of the success or failure of the actions, Rule 62-711.540(1)(f), F.A.C.

13. <u>Minimum Size Requirements</u>: Processed tires for recycling or disposal must meet the minimum size requirements specified in Rule 62-711.400(3), F.A.C.

- 14. <u>Waste Tire Processing Facility Requirements</u>: The facility shall meet the requirements of the waste tire processing facility, Rule 62-711.530, F.A.C.
- 15. <u>Storage Requirements</u>: Any storage of tires on-site shall meet with the fire department's standards along with the provisions cited in Rule 62-711.540, F.A.C., of the waste tire rule.
- 16. <u>Control of Mosquitoes and Rodents</u>: The owner or operator shall provide for control of mosquitoes and rodents so as to protect the public health and welfare, Rule 62-711.540(1)(j), F.A.C.
- 17. <u>Tire Pile Dimensions</u>: An outdoor tire pile or processed tire pile shall not exceed the following maximum dimensions: a width of 50 feet; an area of 10,000 square feet; and a height of 15 feet, Rule 62-711.540(3)(b), F.A.C.
- 18. <u>Waste Tire Pile Fire Lane</u>: A 50-foot wide fire lane shall be placed around the perimeter of each waste tire pile, Rule 62-711.540(3)(c), F.A.C.
- 19. <u>Processing Requirements</u>: At least 75% of the whole tires, used tires, and processed tires that are delivered to or are contained on the site of the waste tire processing facility at the beginning of each calendar year must be processed and removed for disposal or recycling from the facility during the year, or disposed of in a permitted solid waste management facility, Rule 62-711.530(3). F.A.C.
- 20. Quarterly Reports: Owners or operators of waste tire processing facilities shall submit quarterly reports to the Department that summarize the information collected under Rule 62-711.530(4), F.A.C. The reports shall be submitted on DEP Form 62-701.900(21), on the 20th of the month following the close of each calendar quarter to the Department of Environmental Protection, Central District Solid Waste Section, 3319 Maguire Boulevard, Suite 232, Orlando, Florida 32803, with a copy to the Department of Environmental Protection, Solid Waste Section, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399, Rule 62-711.530(5), F.A.C.
- 21. <u>Permit Renewal</u>: An application for permit renewal must be submitted at least 60 days prior to the expiration date of this permit. (Rule 62-4.090, F.A.C.).
- 22. <u>Closure Plan</u>: The waste tire processing facility shall comply with the closure plan requirements of Rule 62-711.700, F.A.C.
- 23. <u>Disposal of Processed Tires or Residuals</u>: The processed tires or residuals shall be disposed of at permitted disposal sites or properly recycled.

















Attachment Part III – B Facility Operation

B.1. Description of operations at the Waste Tire Facility

Empire Tire will provide services to process used and old tires including collection, culling and shredding. Waste tire collection will be offered to both public and waste tire collectors in the state. These tires will be received by an attendant for proper handling and safety. A weigh scale and scale house will be used and there will be an attendant present. Hours of operation will be posted on signs at the entrance gate.

The final product from the processing of these tires will be rubber mulch, tire derived aggregate and tire derived fuel. Processed tires or residuals not appropriate for sale will be disposed in the Omni Waste of Osceola County / WSI.

The facility is surrounded by a block wall as well as a fence with a gate.

B.2. Equipment for Processing Tires

The plant layout is shown on page 28 and 29 for primary and secondary shredding. Equipment model is 2006 barclay rotoshred primary shredder and specifications is shown on page 30. The distributor of the equipment is Barclay Roto -Shred Inc., located in 3164 Loomis Road, Stockton, California.






Existing Equipment - 2006 Barclay Rotoshred







B.3. Description of Waste

1. Collection of Scrap Tires

Empire will collect tires daily using a fleet of 28 foot box trucks, van trailers and roll off containers. Empire is a licensed waste tire collector in the state of Florida.

2. Receipt of Scrap Tires at the Facility

Shipments arriving at the facility will be received by an attendant operating a scale house / office. Attendant will verify all manifests and points of origin and weigh loads of scrap tires. All vehicles will be directed to a sorting station or unloading dock depending on the nature of the load.

a. Culling of Tires

Loads that are determined to have a significant number of used/resale tires will be hand unloaded and graded. All tires culled will then be placed in an appropriate storage site for later re-sale. The expected number of resale tires will be minimal. Five percent or less of daily collection is expected.

b. Sorting / Shipping of Culled Tires

Culled tires will be sorted into categories depending on size an quality. High quality tires will be shipped to one of four retail tires stores owned and operated by Empire Tire. All others will be loaded into trailers to be exported for wholesale. The number of culled tires to be stored at the facility is expected to be minimal due to the demand for these tires.

3. Processing Tires determined to be Scrap

Any received tires determined to have no resale value will then be shredded for other uses.

a. Primary Shredding

Primary shredding will be done through our 2006 barclay rotoshred primary shredder. This shredder is capable of processing approximately 25 tons per hour of whole tires including large OTR tires into 'rough' tire shred. The size of this rough shred varies depending on tire size but averages 6 inches by 12 inches. Tires typically loaded into this machine by loader or excavator.

b. Secondary Shredding

Secondary tire shredding will be done through our Barclay 6" secondary shredder. This shredder is capable of processing 'rough' shred down to a desirable 6 inch nominal chip at a rate of 20 tons per hour. These 6 inch chips can then be sold as feedstock to other processors to be made into other products such as rubber mulch, sport turf, etc. We believe this to be a viable product in the future but minimal at present. Any chips not sold as feed stock will then go to our third phase shredder.

c. Third Phase Shredding

This phase of shredding is done with one of our Columbus Mckinnon 2" tire shredders. This shredder is capable of shredding whole tires down to 2" minus material at a rate of 10 tons per hour. When fed with our 6" material this rate goes up to approximately 17 tons per hr. These 2" chips are then sold as tire derived fuel, septic material or rubber mulch.

B.4. Maximum expected daily throughput

Based on the equipment being used, the maximum daily throughput will be 204 tons per day. This figure is based on the 'weakest link' in the process. The 2 inch CM machine which is capable of producing 17 tons of material per hour.

17tph x 12 hr = 204 tons. Depending on the amount of 6 inch material sold, this value (capability) could greatly increase based on the 6 inch machines capability of 20 tons per hour, however the lower value is being used here. The 204 tons per day

capability is the worst case scenario, where no 6 inch material will be sold and all scrap tires will be processed down to 2" product.

Based on the 204 tons per day estimate times an estimated 300 working days per year, our facility will be capable of producing 61,200 tons of 2" minus material per year.

B.5. Storage and Shipping of Processed Materials and Residuals

- a. Storage of 6 inch material, 23 inch chips and residuals. All material on site will be stored in 50' by 200' storage areas. See Site Plan, Figure 4 and plans 24 x 36.
- **b.** Shipping of 6 inch and 2 inch material. All materials will be shipped via walking floor tractor trailer or roll off containers.
- c. Removal of residuals. Residual material or loose steel created by our process is minimal. We have experienced 2 percent or less residual material on a similar setup in Canada. Any residual material will be loaded onto walking floor trailer or rolloff container an shipped to an approved facility (ie..Keene Road Landfill, Apopka FL).

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP), an agency of the state of Florida, has established certain regulations applicable to the Grantor, requiring that an owner or operator of a solid waste management facility shall provide assurance that funds will be available when needed for the "Required Action" of the facility,

WHEREAS, the Grantor has elected to establish a trust to provide all or part of such financial assurance for the facilities identified herein.

WHEREAS, the Grantor, acting through its duly authorized officers, has selected the Trustee to be the trustee under this agreement, and the Trustee is willing to act as trustee.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Grantor and the Trustee agree as follows:

Section 1. Definitions. As used in this Agreement:

- (a) The term "Grantor" means the owner or operator who enters into this Agreement and any successors or assigns of the Grantor.
- (b) The term "Trustee" means the Trustee who enters into this Agreement and any successor Trustee.
- (c) The term "FDEP" means the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, an Agency of the state of Florida or any successor thereof.
- (d) The term "Required Action," as used in this document means closing, long-term care, or corrective action, or any combination of these, which is checked above.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Identification of Facilities and Cost Estimates.</u> This Agreement pertains to the facilities and cost estimates identified on attached <u>Schedule A</u>.

On Schadule A, for each facility list the FDEP Identification Number, facility name, site address, and the current Required Action cost estimates, or portions thereof, for which financial assurance is demonstrated by this Agreement.

Section 3. Standby Trust. This Trust shall remain dormant until funded with the proceeds from financial instrument(s) as directed by the FDEP or from any other source. The Trustee shall have no duties or responsibilities beyond safekeeping this document and annually submitting to FDEP a valuation statement. Upon funding, this Trust shall become active and be administered pursuant to the terms of this instrument.

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Section 4. Establishment of Fund. The Grantor and the Trustee hereby establish a trust fund (the Fund), for the benefit of the FDEP. The Grantor and the Trustee intend that no third party have access to the Fund except as herein provided. Any property transferred to the Trustee is referred to as the Fund, together with all earnings and profits thereon, less any payments or distributions made by the Trustee pursuant to this Agreement. The Fund shall be held by the Trustee, IN TRUST, as hereinafter provided. The Trustee shall not be responsible nor shall it undertake any responsibility for the amount or adequacy of, nor any duty to collect from the Grantor, any payments necessary to discharge any liabilities of the Grantor established by the FDEP.

Section 5. Payment for Closure, Post-Closure Care, and Corrective Action. The Trustee shall make payments from the Fund as the FDEP Secretary, or the Secretary's designee (the "designee"), shall direct, in writing, to provide for the payment of the costs of Required Action of the facilities covered by this Agreement. The Trustee shall reimburse the Grantor or other persons as specified by the FDEP Secretary, or designee, from the Fund for Required Action expenditures in such amounts as the FDEP Secretary, or designee, shall direct in writing. In addition, the Trustee shall refund to the Grantor such amounts as the FDEP Secretary, or designee, specifies in writing. Upon refund, such funds shall no longer constitute part of the Fund as defined herein.

<u>Section 6.</u> Payments Comprising the Fund. Payments made to the Trustee for the Fund shall consist of cash or securities acceptable to the Trustee and may consist solely of proceeds from financial instrument(s) as directed by the FDEP.

Section 7. Trustee Management. The Trustee shall invest and reinvest the principal and income of the Fund and keep the Fund invested as a single fund, without distinction between principal and income, in accordance with general investment policies and guidelines which the grantor may communicate in writing to the Trustee from time to time, subject, however, to the provisions of this Section. In investing, reinvesting, exchanging, selling, and managing the Fund, the Trustee shall discharge his duties with respect to the trust fund solely in the interest of the beneficiary and with the care, skill, prudence, and diligence under the circumstances then prevailing which persons of prudence, acting in a like capacity and familiar with such matters, would use in the conduct of an enterprise of a like character and with like aims; except that:

- (a) Securities or other obligations of the Grantor, or any other owner or operator of the facilities, or any of their affiliates as defined in the Investment Company Act of 1940, as amended, 15 U.S.C. 80a-2.(a), shall not be acquired or held, unless they are securities or other obligations of the Federal or a State government;
- (b) The Trustee is authorized to invest the Fund in time or demand deposits of the Trustee, to the extent insured by an agency of the Federal or a State government; and
- (c) The Trustee is authorized to hold cash awaiting investment or distribution uninvested for a reasonable time and without liability for the payment of interest thereon.

Section 8. Commingling and Investment. The Trustee is expressly authorized in its discretion:

- (a) To transfer from time to time any or all of the assets of the Fund to any common, commingled, or collective trust fund created by the Trustee in which the Fund is eligible to participate, subject to all of the provisions thereof, to be commingled with the assets of other trusts participating therein; and
- (b) To purchase shares in any investment company registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940, 15 U.S.C. 80a-1 et seq., including one which may be created, managed, underwritten, or to which investment advice is rendered or the shares of which are sold by the Trustee. The Trustee may vote such shares in its discretion.

<u>Section 9.</u> <u>Express Power of Trustee.</u> Without in any way limiting the powers and discretions conferred upon the Trustee by the other provisions of this Agreement or by law, the Trustee is expressly authorized and empowered:

- (a) To sell, exchange, convey, transfer, or otherwise dispose of any property held by it, by public or private sale. No person dealing with the Trustee shall be bound to see to the application of the purchase money or to inquire into the validity or expediency of any such sale or other disposition;
- (b) To make, execute, acknowledge, and deliver any and all documents of transfer and conveyance and any and all other instruments that may be necessary or appropriate to carry out the powers herein granted;
- (c) To register any securities held in the Fund in its own name or in the name of a nominee and to hold any security in bearer form or in book entry, or to combine certificates representing such securities with certificates of the same issue held by the Trustee in other fiduciary capacities, or to deposit or arrange for

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- the deposit of such securities in a qualified central depository even though, when so deposited, such securities may be merged and held in bulk in the name of the nominee of such depository with other securities deposited therein by another person, or to deposit or arrange for the deposit of any securities issued by the United States Government, or any agency or instrumentality thereof, with a Federal Reserve bank, but the books and records of the Trustee shall at all times show that all such securities are part of the Fund:
- (d) To deposit any cash in the Fund in Interest-bearing accounts maintained or savings certificates issued by the Trustee, in its separate corporate capacity, or in any other banking institution affiliated with the Trustee, to the extent insured by an agency of the Federal or a State government; and
- (e) To compromise or otherwise adjust all claims in favor of or against the Fund.

Section 10. Taxes and Expenses. All taxes of any kind that may be assessed or levied against or in respect of the Fund and all brokerage commissions incurred by the Fund shall be paid from the Fund. All other expenses incurred by the Trustee in connection with the administration of this Trust, including fees for legal services rendered to the Trustee, the compensation of the Trustee to the extent not paid directly by the Grantor, and all other proper charges and disbursements of the Trustee shall be paid from the Fund.

Section 11. Annual Valuation. The Trustee shall annually, at least 30 days prior to the anniversary date of establishment of the Fund, furnish to the Grantor and to the Secretary of the FDEP, or designee, a statement confirming the value of the Trust. Any securities in the Fund shall be valued at market value as of no more than 60 days prior to the anniversary date of establishment of the fund. The fallure of the Grantor to object in writing to the Trustee within 90 days after the statement has been furnished to the Grantor and the FDEP Secretary, or designee, shall constitute a conclusively binding assent by the Grantor, barring the Grantor from asserting any claim or liability against the Trustee with respect to matters disclosed in the statement.

Section 12. Advice of Counsel. The Trustee may from time to time consult with counsel, who may be counsel to the Grantor, with respect to any question arising as to the construction of this Agreement or any action to be taken hereunder. The Trustee shall be fully protected, to the extent permitted by law, in acting upon the advice of counsel.

<u>Section 13.</u> <u>Trustee Compensation.</u> The Trustee is authorized to charge against the principal of the Trust its published Trust fee schedule in effect at the time services are rendered.

Section 14. Successor Trustee. The Trustee may resign or the Grantor may replace the Trustee, but such resignation or replacement shall not be effective until the Grantor has appointed a successor Trustee and this successor accepts the appointment. The successor trustee shall have the same powers and duties as those conferred upon the Trustee hereunder. Upon the successor trustee's acceptance of the appointment, the Trustee shall assign, transfer, and pay over to the successor trustee the funds and properties then constituting the Fund. If for any reason the Grantor cannot or does not act in the event of the resignation of the Trustee, the Trustee may apply to a court of competent jurisdiction for the appointment of a successor trustee or for instructions. The successor trustee shall specify the date on which it assumes administration of the trust in a writing sent to the Grantor, FDEP Secretary, or designee, and the present Trustee by certified mail 10 days before such change becomes effective. Any expenses incurred by the Trustee as a result of any of the acts contemplated by this Section shall be paid as provided in Section 10.

Section 15. Instructions to the Trustee.* All orders, requests, and instructions by the Grantor to the Trustee shall be in writing, signed by such persons as are designated in the attached Exhibit A or such other designees as the Grantor may designate by amendment to Exhibit A. The Trustee shall be fully protected in acting without inquiry in accordance with the Grantor's orders, requests, and instructions. All orders, requests, and instructions by the FDEP Secretary, or designee, to the Trustee shall be in writing, signed by the FDEP Secretary, or the designee, and the Trustee shall act and shall be fully protected in acting in accordance with such orders, requests, and instructions. The Trustee shall have the right to assume, in the absence of written notice to the contrary, that no event constituting a change or a termination of the authority of any person to act on behalf of the Grantor or the FDEP hereunder has occurred. The Trustee shall have no duty to act in the absence of such orders, requests, and instructions from the Grantor and/or the FDEP, except as provided for herein.

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^{*} Note: pursuant to Section 5, the authority to direct payments, reimbursements and refunds is given soley to the FDEP Secretary or designee.

<u>Section 16.</u> <u>Amendment of Agreement.</u> This Agreement may be amended by an instrument in writing executed by the Grantor, the Trustee, and the FDEP Secretary, or designee, or by the Trustee and the FDEP Secretary, or designee, if the Grantor ceases to exist.

Section 17. Irrevocability and Termination. Subject to the right of the parties to amend this Agreement as provided in Section 18, this Trust shall be irrevocable and shall continue until terminated at the written agreement of the Grantor, the Trustee, and the FDEP Secretary, or designee, if the Grantor ceases to exist. Upon termination of the Trust, all remaining trust property, less final trust administration expenses, shall be delivered to the Grantor.

Section 18. Immunity and Indemnification. The Trustee shall not incur personal liability of any nature in connection with any act or omission, made in good faith, in the administration of this Trust, or in carrying out any directions by the Grantor or the FDEP Secretary, or designee, issued in accordance with this Agreement. The Trustee shall be indemnified and saved harmless by the Grantor or from the Trust Fund, or both, from and against any personal liability to which the Trustee may be subjected by reason of any act or conduct in its official capacity, including all expenses reasonably incurred in its defense in the event the Grantor fails to provide such defense.

Section 19. Choice of Law. This Agreement shall be administered, construed, and enforced according to the laws of the State of Florida.

<u>Section 20.</u> Interpretation. As used in this Agreement, words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular. The descriptive headings for each Section of this Agreement shall not affect the interpretation or the legal efficacy of this Agreement.
