As discussed, the Department has approved the utilization of tires as construction material for various structures on your property under our Waste Tire Beneficial Use Agreement, modified March 7, and does not object to the storage of up to 200 tires on site for this use at any one time.

Florida Administrative Code Rule 62-711.520 (10) specifies that waste tire collectors must deposit their waste tires only at a permitted waste tire processing facility, a permitted or exempt waste tire collection center, a permitted solid waste management facility, or at another site permitted by the Department to receive waste tires. Because we have agreed that waste tires utilized in this manner are a legitimate beneficial use, your site falls under the last category of acceptable sites, and the Waste Tire Beneficial Use Agreement authorizes the acceptance of tires; no additional permit is required.



- 3. It appears from your diagram of the proposed fence that nothing will prevent rainwater from collecting in the tires. Please address this issue.


Dear Ms. Heuer,

In response to your letter dated September 26, 1995 the following is the information in which you requested. I would also like to thank you for your fast response on the original request that I had faxed you.

In response to question 1: I do not plan to store any tires at all. What will be done is I will pick up the tires on example Saturday, and will be using them on Sunday. If for some reason that I could not get to them the next day I will not pick up again until the previous tires have been used. Possibly in the future I expect to purchase a ready made storage shed that would be placed on lot 6 (see diagram). The shed would be used to sort the tires only so that I could pick out the bigger tires for the bottom of the fence. I cannot foresee more than 10 to 30 tires at this time in the shed at any given time.

In response to question 2: I will be picking up the tires with a 5x10 utility trailer, that will be pulled by my Nissan pickup truck. When I get the tires home my son and I will be drilling holes in the tires so that any water will drain out of them. When we line them up for our fence we will take the trailer over to the spot in our land that we will be digging the dirt to fill in the tires. (I already received the Okay from zoning to dig the hole for the dirt). I feel by doing this it will take care of the problem with the rats and mosquitoes and will also make the fence more sturdy and sound absorbent.

In response to question 3: I think I have already answered this question with my responses in 1 & 2. But not only are the tires going to be filled with dirt, the public view will be landscaped with plants and vines. I have spoke with the State Forestry to find out about pine trees that will be placed in the first row of tires that will be on the street side of the fence. These will be trimmed like a hedge approximately 4 feet high. I have also spoke with some of our local nursuries and found that a plant called juniper is an evergreen that







I, John A. Howard, am hereby requesting a Beneficial Use Letter for old tires. I have spoken with the Levy County Development Authority, (George Sandora), and with Mosquito Control (Donna Conquest), and Levy County Building and Zoning (Rob), and Solid Waste (Wayne Hardy).

Everyone I have spoken with has given me the okay to use old tires as my construction material for building a fence around my 2 1/2 acre lot. In addition to the fence I will be constructing a play park area for my three children to play safely.

The idea of this constructive use of recycling old tires came accidently by necessity. I obtained custody of my son Johnny two years ago after fighting in court since 1984. When I picked him up for his monthly visit two years ago I noticed that he had several big red welts on his legs. When I asked him how he got them he replied that his mom and step-father had done this. At that time I immediately called my work and requested a leave of absence. During these past two years I have had to remain at home to help my son with his problems due to not only physical abuse but also sexual abuse which was found out through his counseling every week.

Now unfortunately I needed a way to bring in some extra income somehow by staying at home for I iso watch my two other babies. Well the idea hit like a ton of bricks when my son hit a tree with our Go-Cart. I joked and said I am going to put a wall of tires abound the whole property so you can't get hurt!!!

Now you know how it started - and now this is the problem that has been encountered. When the Solid Waste Authority and Building and Zoning said that it was okay to build the fence with the wall of tires they threw in a stipulation. I could only build the

fence this way as long as I got the tires from the landfill for FREE!! I could not make any money constructing my fence:

I personally think this is a bit unfair, so I called George Sandora with the Levy County Development Authority and he said that they have no right to keep me from starting a business, the business being that of a tire hauler. So Mr. Sandora gave me the number to the Chamber of Commerce in Tallahassee, and I spoke with Mr. Michael Ohlsen the Recycling Director. He informed me that if they are giving me the right to build the fence out of tires then they should not care where I get my tires, he also stated that he will send me an application to register my truck as a tire hauler, and to contact you at the DEP in jacksonville, and to also set an appointment with the SBDC of Gainesville.

My appointment with the SBDC has been set for Sept. 26, 1995 at 2:00 p.m. And here is the letter of request of Beneficial Use for old tires.

The only reason that Wayne Hardy gave me for not letting me pick up tires for income for a business is that if he gave me permission then everybody else would want to do it also. Well I need some way to help provide for my family since I must stay home much of the time due to my own physical health and my son's emotional problems. My previous job of Slot Machine mechanic sent me out of town too much of the time for there are no slot machines in the state of Florida.

I feel that after you see the following pages you too would agree that this could be a beneficial way to re-use old tires in their original form.

- 1) Use tires as is for construction
- 2) No extra cost of converting them to something else
- 3) Save the landfills of tire waste
- 4) Sound barriers for airports, highways, construction plants
- 5) Create more jobs landscapers, construction workers, truckers, etc.
- 6) Beautify the road-ways
- 7) Privacy fences Security fences
- 8) Cushion walls and dividers as opposed to metal and concrete
- 9) Saves water for irrigation of plants
- 10) Helps to keep our kids and dogs in a safe area
- 11) Farmers can keep their live stock in better
- Once it is put in place it will not need to be replaced (no termites, or weather problems)
- 13) Material will not root or fall apart
