Mr. Istambouli:

Per the requirements of the Miami-Dade County Department of Environmental Resource Management, CEMEX Construction Materials of Florida, LLC is providing this closing cost estimate for the cost to remove, process and dispose of the maximum amount of waste tires stored at the facility at any time. The purpose of this submittal is to fulfill the requirements of Rule 62-711.500(3) F.A.C., to provide a re-estimate of the annual closing costs for waste tires.

The estimated cost to remove, process and dispose of the maximum permitted amount of waste tires stored at the facility at any time (30,000 tires, or 300 tons) is:

300 tons @ \$100/tons = \$30,000 (or \$1.00 per tire)

This cost estimate is based on a third party quote provided by Liberty Tire Recycling, dated April 19, 2018 (attached).

I am pleased to provide this proposal as follow up to our discussion of Wednessday, April 11th. As I indicated, Liberty Tire Recycling is prepared to load, transport, process and dispose of up to 300 tons in the event of site closure. This proposal pertains to whole passenger tires but does not cover off road tires (forklift, tractor, loader, grader etc.).

• The cost to load, transport, process and dispose would be One Hundred dollars per ton. Please note that this proposal covers the entire cost of handling the subject tires.
