John,

This is an urgent matter for the Enterprise facility to resolve prior to running out of permitted airspace. I understood from our teleconference with the FDEP and follow up conversations with Mr. Morgan that operations in Cell 17 were contingent on CQA approval and off-site leachate disposal. At that time I thought it was possible for operations to continue in Cell 16 for several weeks. However, vehicle turn-around safety is limiting access to the computed Cell 16 airspace.

Angelos is asking you to do whatever is necessary with the FDEP to come up with a solution so that contracted disposal operations with the many municipalities and counties in the Tampa Bay region are not disrupted.

Please let me know as soon as possible about options so that we can respond accordingly.

Subject: Urgent Enterprise Landfill Information

Good morning,

I left a voicemail with Steve but I need to follow up with this email as the situation is urgent. We are officially requesting authorization to begin operating Cell 17 or to be allowed to continue filling vertically in Cells 1-7, 15. The urgency is due to the fact that filling in Cell 16 has reached a point that by Monday we will no longer have adequate space to turn the trucks around safely. As you know, we have had multiple meetings with the solid waste department and the industrial wastewater department over the past several months to address a number of issues. It was our understanding that approval of operations in Cell 17 would be issued once two criteria were met: (1) the Construction Completion Certification report was submitted to the Department, and (2) off-site treatment of leachate was procured.

1. The Construction Completion Certification report was submitted to the Department by John Arnold on 3/6/20.
2. Cessation of leachate distribution to Pond 3
 - On 2/11/20, leachate disbursement
 - On 3/6/20, a copy of the leachate disposal agreement with Aqua Clean was emailed to the Department by John Arnold.
 - On 3/12/20, removal and offsite treatment of leachate began through Aqua Clean as evidenced in an email from John Arnold to the Department.

One other key issue was discussed during several of our meetings – the interim side slopes on the south, west and east. It was our understanding that this issue was to be resolved through the submittal of a permit modification application. As I mentioned in our most recent meeting, it is our professional opinion that the slopes are in compliance with the applicable regulations: (1) they are not final closure grades; (2) they are nominal 3:1 slopes (no steeper than 2.5 to 1); (3) the toe of slope is more than 100 feet from the edge of property. It has been our assertion all along that the Department's claim that these slopes are not in compliance is based solely on conceptual closure design drawings. As I stated in our last meeting, the logical solution is to simply modify the permit to show a revised conceptual closure grade rather than to disturb stabilized slopes that meet all of the design criteria of 62-701, F.A.C. Our understanding is that the Department agreed to the approach of modifying the permit drawings. We can submit a permit modification application with revised drawings within 15 business days.

We need to have an emergency meeting today. We understand if this issue needs to be elevated to FDEP Tallahassee. Ultimately, we have to have the issue resolved this week or we will be forced to turn away all haulers on Monday. This will impact more than a dozen government agencies who rely on our landfill for waste disposal. Please advise on a time today that we can talk to resolve this urgent issue.

Good afternoon Alexis,

I spoke with John Arnold and all three items have been addressed as follows:

1. Interim side slopes on the south were regraded during late-February and early-March. Attached photos Slopes 1 and Slopes 2 were taken on March 3rd to show the work in progress. All work associated with the slopes is now complete.
2. Removal of sediment from the bottom of Pond 3 was completed last week. See attached photo Pond which shows all sediment removed, slopes mowed and no invasive weeds or aquatic weeds.
3. The annual fire safety survey will be submitted with the upcoming quarterly waste tire report due on April 20, 2020.

I believe this information, coupled with all previously submitted information, addresses all of the items from the original October 2019 inspection report. Please feel free to call me if you have any questions.

The unresolved items are listed below. Please provide the Department with an update about these items by March 24, 2020.

- Items 2.11/2.13/2.16 – What is your status in addressing this issue?
- Item 2.22 – Has the sediment been removed from the pond's bottom? Email correspondence from mid-February indicated that this work would possibly be completed by now.
- Items 9.10/9.11 – Please ensure that the annual fire safety survey is submitted with the next quarterly waste tire report, which is due by April 20.
