Description of management site	Denton Avenue DDMS Site is located within a County owned lot. The debris management area consists of a portion of a 42.80-acre open space. The County is proposing uncontaminated vegetative debris storage within this area. The site meets the minimum offsets from open water bodies, and there are no potable water wells within the site and the Debris location meets required setback from adjacent private potable wells.

The DDMS will be activated in the event of a natural disaster. The County will use an approved Debris Management Contractor to haul debris from site. The County will provide contractors name and contact information once the site is open. The County will reduce un-contaminated vegetative debris through chipping when applicable. The Contractor will haul all debris to a County-approved location for final disposal. The County will employee a Disaster Debris Monitoring firm and associated tower monitors to ensure that no unauthorized wastes will be deposited on site. In the event that unauthorized waste is brought it will be immediately directed to a facility permitted to dispose of municipal solid waste or construction and demolition debris. Site operating hours will be dependent on the magnitude of the event, but will be limited to daylight hours between the times of 7am and 6pm. A copy of all records/load tickets will be kept with the debris monitor on site.


